We covered these issues and concerns in the following ways:

-Locally produced newscasts, including weather and sports, are broadcast each Monday through Friday (except Thanksgiving, Black Friday and day after Christmas this year) at 5a, 5:30a, 6a, 6:30a, 7a, 7:30a, 8a, and 8:30a.

-Employment;

Weekly, a representative from The Sutter County One-Stop (a government-funded employment and career center) provides, remotely for the time being, a 35 second "Job Hotline" Community Reminder. This airs, at no charge to the One-Stop, throughout all dayparts 7 days a week in equal rotation with all other Community Reminders (see details below) (Audio available on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "CR's".)

Local non-profit fundraiser and awareness events:

These are covered in several formats:

- 1) Occasionally in news casts (particularly health events such as blood drives).
- 2)Public Service Announcements (now called "Community Reminders per Corporate Director of Programming Dave Shakes reachable by e-mail at "dshakes@resultsradio.com") recorded by someone involved with the group or event in question. There are generally no fewer than 4 and no more than 10 of these 35 second free spots running in equal rotation 7

days/week for a total of 147 plays a week all tolled. (Audio of all PSA's (Community Reminders) is available on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop (KKCY is the Sister-Station to KUBA, located in the same building / cluster) in the folder labeled, "CR's").

3) Special Broadcast events.

This quarter we also, for a 16th straight year, spearheaded the Yuba/Sutter/Colusa United Way Turkey Drive, Broadcasting for 3 hours each from 13 sponsor locations prior to Thanksgiving. We collected 240 turkeys, and a record \$21,691.47 in cash donations enabling us to purchase & distribute an additional 700 turkeys, 335 hams, and 105 \$25 grocery gift cards to those most in need in our community. We were also again the media lead for the Yuba/Sutter Toys For Tots Drive that included 9, 2-hour live broadcasts in December.

Weather: We receive our forecasts from the National Weather Service, and deliver it in summarized form with station announcers twice an hour M-F 5a-9am, once an hour Monday-Friday 9a- 12 midnight. Forecasts run on the weekends from 7a-4pm. Weathers do no air on holidays.

Traffic;

Monday-Friday from 5a-9am we provide in-house-produced updates prior to each newscast through reports from local law enforcement, and from listeners verified through local law enforcement.

Animal Welfare:

Weekly, a representative from Sutter Buttes Canine Rescue (a local non-profit, no-kill animal shelter) records, remotely for the time being, a 35 second feature called "Pet of the Week". This airs, at no cost to the shelter, throughout all day-parts Monday through Thursday for a total of 26 plays. (Audio available on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "Pet o Week". - (KKCY is the Sister-Station to KUBA, located in the same building / cluster)

Sports;

A local sports report follows each bottom of the hour newscast that airs Monday- Friday 5a-9am. Additionally, every other Tuesday, KUBA designates a local Athlete of the week culled from listener nominations. A recorded feature (35 seconds) airs honoring the team throughout the 2 week period for a total of 15 plays per week. (Audio available on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "AoW". (KKCY is the Sister-Station to KUBA, located in the same building / cluster)

Community Involvement;

Every other Wednesday, KUBA designates a local Community Hero. A recorded 35 second feature airs honoring the hero for a total of 23 plays per week. (Audio available on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "Community Hero". (KKCY is the Sister-Station to KUBA, located in the same building / cluster)

Public Affairs Broadcasts:

We broadcast 2, 30 minute programs from Media Tracks Communications of Des Plains, Illinois; "Viewpoints", which airs every Sunday Morning at 6, and "Radio Health Journal" which

follows at 6:30.
