Quarterly Issues and Programs Report Programs Information

The following is a list of programs that WKHT, Knoxville, Tennessee aired from July 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023. These programs addressed issues that were determined to be of significant concern to the Knoxville, Tennessee community during the third quarter of 2023.

East Tennessee Report: (6 hours per quarter) WKHT airs a 30-minute talk show hosted by Kim Hansard, SummitMedia Public Affairs director, on Sunday mornings at 6:30am, broken into two 15-minute segments. The program focuses on local public affairs and community issues and charitable fundraisers in the service area.

Issues and Concerns – <u>The East Tennessee Report</u> Programs Information

<u>Healthcare</u>

East Tennessee Report – Synopsis of topic reported 07/02, 08/27

Jon Kamar - Certified Physician Assistant, dually licensed, specializing in Emergency Medicine and Addiction Medicine along with Dr. Darin Hale – Addiction Medicine Specialist are Kim's guests to discuss Overdose Awareness Day at World's Fair Park. Dr. Hale is the Keynote Speaker for this event, where many of our communities' non-profit organizations are joining with medical offices to reach the public with educational programs and support for those in need of help for substance misuse. This is a first-of its kind event for our community.

East Tennessee Report – Synopsis of topic reported 07/22

Tiana Ross, Clinical Coordinator and Community Outreach Coordinator with Genesis Neuroscience Clinic talked with Kim about a special event and fundraiser they have coming up. Tiana explains that in July 2021, Genesis Neuroscience Clinic became a nonprofit under the Tennessee Memory Disorders Foundation. The upcoming kickoff to football season, held at the Orange Hat Brewing Company, features food trucks, a raffle and prizes. The donations go towards funding the internship program, patient care, and starting a loan forgiveness program to bring more geriatricians to Knoxville.

East Tennessee Report – Synopsis of topic reported 08/27, 09/01

Jon Kamar - Certified Physician Assistant with Total Recovery Medical Center is back in-studio, this time with Dr Karthi Namasivayam, the clinic's Psychiatrist. At Total Recovery Medical Center, the team believes, and is dedicated to, helping individuals overcome opioid, alcohol, and methamphetamine addictions to achieve lasting recovery. Dr. Karthi explained that his strengths are in treating patients with depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, and other challenges, and helping them understand how medications work as well as how therapy works to help them live the life they desire.

Public Health

East Tennessee Report – Synopsis of topic reported 07/30, 09/03

Kim invites Shayla Wilson, Executive Director, and Shantal Harris, Communications Director, with ASAP Anderson in-studio to talk about real people and their addictions. So many times, we hear about addictions in the context of it being "someone else". Functioning addicts were a main topic of conversation. Shayla and Shantal explain how to spot the signs of a functioning addict and how to get them help...High-risk occupations for functioning addiction...and how family members can get support.

East Tennessee Report – Synopsis of topic reported 09/17

Courtney Fuson, with Metropolitan Drug Coalition is Kim's guest to discuss what's going on with MDC. The big news this month is a new program called Family Support Services. This new program is for anyone who needs guidance, resources, or support in dealing with a family member with substance use disorder. The program is free of charge, reducing barriers to getting the support that is so needed. Courtney also provides an update on The Gateway, which has now been open for one year, already serving many more people than imagined.

Katherine Birkbeck, Executive Director of Historic Downtown Clinton talks about all things Sip of Summerfest. Sip of Summerfest is Clinton's way of saying goodbye to summer with an end of summer beer tasting event. It all happens in beautiful historic downtown Clinton. Katherine also tells us Clinton High School Youth Board's excitement over winning a contest with a \$12,500 prize that will go toward an art installation and cherry trees for they will plant on Main Street.
