April 5th 2020 Covid-19 and Our Community Small Business Advocacy 30M

Focus today is small business and jobs. Massive numbers of small businesses, bankers, barbers, retail stores closing – and maybe permanently. Half of all small businesses have less than 30 days of cash on hand. And, half of all Americans work for or own a small business. The clock is ticking. Fortunately, the government is working to offer lifelines to business owners and the estimated six million people who lost their jobs this past month.

Overwhelming numbers of people are now out of work in Ohio. In the last two weeks, 400,000 people have filed for unemployment, more than 100,000 more people than all of 2019. But let's talk about what we can do, not how bad it is. Columbus City Councilmember Priscilla Tyson: leads Council's human services policies and appropriations. This Monday Council will consider emergency human services funding to more than 40 nonprofits that serve the community. If passed, this would account for more than \$4 million in grants. She will highlight a few key ones, including the two grants directed to the Columbus Urban League for Father to Father and My Brother's Keeper related services.

John Gregory is a nationally recognized motivational speaker, author, CEO of the National Center for Urban Solutions, founder of the Urban Scholars High School and maybe best known locally for starting the African American Male Wellness Walk. Sees that the African American community, especially males and young men, are not being engaged by the messages sent around COVID-19. It's a problem with the sender, not the receiver. So he and a group of volunteers are working to connect, planning to put out 500 yard signs on the near East side, talking about washing your hands, quit tripping, put on a mask, and protect your mama and grandma.

They are trying to help them stay away from drugs and alcohol, better cope with issues, some of which caused by COVID-19. There were 45 early intervention sessions. Choose 2 Change over 237 calls over eight weeks, peer to peer reentry and integration, criminal and addictive thinking, referrals to employment, other resources, assistance with basic needs.
