Sergeant Murphy from the Fayetteville Police Department came by and talked about community outreach and campaigns that have a positive impact on the community. He also gave details about the new Community Safety Campus.

Jasmine, Sierra and J'aaron from Black-Owned NWA talked about the Black Business expo and how people in Northwest Arkansas can support local black businesses .
