The following is a brief description of these issues and the station's most significant programming treatment of them:

7-5-20

The station hosted and provided free meals for the community. We also connected with Arkansas Support Network. We helped them raise funds for their operation which works with people and families who suffer from disabilities.

7-7-20

Working with local employment company "1st Employment" we talked about opportunities for local community members to find work during the pandemic. We provided a list of resources that our community could utilize in order to get back on their feet if they had been effected during this time.

We used our station to highlight "Sprayetteville" a community event that used artwork throughout the city to express messages of positivity and unity.

7-13-20

Working with our partners at the local Community Clinic, we highlighted resources that the community can use to secure housing, food and transportation.
