The most significant community issues during this period covered by Nevada Public Radio are listed here. The producers and Program Director direct the content and selection of the program KNPR's State of Nevada airing Monday through Thursday at 9 – 10am and 7 – 8pm.

Jul 3, 2023 - Hundreds of new laws went into effect on July 1 in Nevada

- Nevada's legislature concluded earlier this month. And there's been a lot of news about what the governor vetoed, but what did he sign into law

Jul 31, 2023 - Fentanyl still kills many in Nevada. Here's what's being done to help

- Earlier this month, Nevada reached a settlement with Walgreens to accept \$258 million in connection with that business' part in the opioid epidemic.

Aug 15, 2023 - Work changed during the pandemic. Are more changes on the way?

- During the pandemic, work changed. Longer hours and burnout have led to a push in this country for more service workers to unionize.

Aug 21, 2023 - Las Vegas is growing, but still has water and housing issues to face

- Stories say we'll be at 5 million people by 2050, that 115 people are moving here a day, and Clark County is the number one destination for homeowners looking for a place to move.

Sep 7, 2023 - Live from Three Square: When others can't fix drug and mental health issues, can nonprofits?

- The pandemic clarified one thing for all of us in Nevada: mental health care here is severely lacking.

Sep 25, 2023 - What's the solution to making roads in Las Vegas safer?

- From the killing of a bicyclist to pedestrian and child deaths, it's been a deadly year on our roads. The number of traffic fatalities this year is almost the same as a year ago, and last year was one of the deadliest on record.
