**Education** including education standards, school safety, efforts to keep up with growth in the area, budget matters, etc.


**Employment** including job opportunities, the state of local/regional employment, unemployment statistics, etc.

**Leadership/Politics** including state, county and local political issues/events, profiles and headlines re: political leaders and newsmakers, government corruption, etc.



## **DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM PROVIDING MOST SIGNIFICANT TREATMENT OF COMMUNITY ISSUES**

WUPW-TV devotes portions of its broadcast day to coverage of important local and regional news stories. While these reports are typically confined to the broadcast times noted above, WUPW-TV will interrupt non-news programming with up-to-the-minute reports on breaking news stories and urgent weather information.

### **WUPW Public Affairs Broadcasts (National & Local)**

Saturday 10:30-11pm ET "Leading Edge with Jerry Anderson"

This weekly news interview and discussion program is locally-produced and hosted by FOX Toledo News former News anchor/reporter Jerry Anderson. It features guests from government and community agencies in discussion of one or more issues of typical/newsworthy/timely issues of interest to viewers in the Toledo market. The duration of each program is 30-minutes.

### **Public Service Announcement (National & Local)**

WUPW-TV airs public service announcements (PSAs) relevant to the topics of interest to the communities it serves. These PSAs air throughout the broadcast day on WUPW-TV. The total number of PSA that aired on WUPW-TV and WUPW-DT2 in the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2020 are included in this report.
