Midday Music with Shawn Evans	Education, Community Engagement, Local Arts Advocacy, Diversity/Equity/Inclusion	Tuesday-Friday 12pm-2pm	Midday Music offers listeners exposure to a wide variety of music from around the world, its historical and cultural background and connections with other periods, genres, art forms, and everyday life, in a casual approach that encourages active rather than passive listening. On Fridays, mostly listener requests are played, so that the listeners become part of the creation of the content.

The program allows those who could not attend the Festival an opportunity to experience the event, it is an important way of preserving/ documenting it, and it encourages support of not only the Festival but also the local and worldwide arts scene.
Page's Kitchen	Education, Community Engagement, Arts & Culture, Local Arts Advocacy	Saturdays 5 PM to 6 PM 1/13/24 to 6/15/24 and 10/5/24 to 12/21/24]	Page's Kitchen is a series of live performances and conversations culled from decades of area host and musician Page Wilson's Out of the Blue Radio Revue (itself an important part of radio history), giving exposure to a wide variety of both local and national artists, their music, and the process of that music's creation, thus also strengthening the network of the local arts scene.
The World Music Show with Ian Stewart	Arts & Culture, Local Arts Advocacy, Diversity/Equity/Inclusion	Saturday nights from 6-8pm	The World Music Show cultivates music from all parts of the globe, including from well-known artists like Angelique Kidjo and Baaba Maal to musicians from Rwanda, Suriname or Haiti who aren't well known but deserve to be heard. The show also features interviews with both global and local world musicians and gives background on the artists and the stories behind the songs. Plus, many of the shows have

			themes—from celebrating International Women's Day to Hispanic Heritage Month.
Time for the Blues	Arts & Culture	Saturday nights from 9pm-10pm	Time for the Blues is a retrospective of all blues music and is produced and hosted by John Porter and Henry Cook. The program focuses on specific artists and various themes in the blues, especially featuring major contributors such as: Muddy Waters, B.B. King, Howlin' Wolf, Charlie Musselwhite and John Lee Hooker, among many others. While all time periods are represented, most of the music presented is what we call “post-war” blues (post WWII through the present). Regional blues are also featured, from the Mississippi Delta, Chicago, the West Coast, Memphis, Texas, the Piedmont, as well as British and other blues influences from around the world.
