An Everett mother who couldn't find a school to suit her son's needs opened her own. She thought students would flock to the school, but only a handful have. Unless the school gets about \$50,000 dollars in donations or a few more students in the coming weeks the school may have to close for good.

News research shows you should be eating more dark leafy greens. Kale is one example of vegetable that contain more than 100 percent of vitamins a, c and k to improve bone health and skin elasticity.

The yearly warning to remind folks that carbon monoxide monitors must be placed in specific places in your house in order to work properly and save you from the toxic fumes.

A flu outbreak in our state has claimed the lives of seven people. Although this year’s vaccine is not exactly targeting the strain that is going around, it can certainly make illness less severe. Doctors are still advising that you get a flu shot.

People with pain in the knees can get a new treatment using a device called lovera that applies nitrous oxide (laughing gas) to relieve the pain. Results last two to three months so it is not a cure. The cost is about \$1,000 per treatment and it is not yet covered by insurance. The closest doctors are in California.

The state has banned so-called ‘warehousing’ of mentally ill patients in regular hospitals because there was no room in treatment facilities. The state mental health care facilities are now able to keep people from suffering on the street and being a harm to themselves or others.

To determine whether your child may be dyslexic check the signs. Make sure they have no trouble rhyming or have difficulty learning the alphabet or don’t like to read.

One year after the operation, patients who had resurfacing were less likely to limp, had less thigh pain and were able to return to impact sports.

Researchers have found that stroke patients can improve the functions they have lost by playing video games.

For those suffering from peripheral artery disease or pad, a narrowing of the arteries in the leg there is new hope. A drug coated balloon not only opens the artery but also delivers a chemotherapy drug directly the vessel wall to prevent scar tissue. Unlike stents, which can twist and break in the leg, this procedure can be done over and over again.

A wet wrap therapy seems to help some patients that have eczema. First, soak in a lukewarm bath for about 20 minutes, then apply lotion or medicated cream to the skin surface and cover with wet cloths with a dry layer of clothing on top. Stay in this cocoon-like state for two hours. This process may be repeated several times a day.

Apostherapy was developed in Israel in the 1990's with the goal to retrain the brain and muscles to walk in a way that takes pressure off painful areas. It doesn't require specific exercises, instead custom mechanical pods are placed on the bottom of shoes to re-align the patient's knees, hips and back. Patients swear by the results they experience.

Migraine sufferers are turning to therapy for help in controlling their pain. Therapy does not necessarily cure migraines but it can help patients identify and avoid patterns and triggers. It also helps patients deal with the stress of having so much pain which can migraines to get worse.

Some senior care facilities are taking extra precautions is shielding their patients from the spread of the flu. Meals are now served in their rooms as opposed to the dining areas.

National surveys tell us that people that exercise drink as much or more than people that don't exercise. Binge drinking soon after an intense workout can have a negative effect on muscle recovery.

More evidence that even if we workout, sitting around the rest of the time puts our health at risk. A study shows that sitting time was associated with a higher risk of all causes of mortality, heart disease mortality, cancer mortality and diabetes, independent of exercise.

When a baby does not respond to CPR a seamless transition to life support ECMO is next. Doctors and Children's hospital have a very expensive real-life doll to practice this procedure over and over so the team is ready when the real crisis arrives.

Seattle Fire Stations are being tested for the MERSA virus. Because the virus has been found not only at the stations but also affecting the firemen themselves, rules are being changed on equipment decontamination and placement when returning from runs.

The Virginia Mason Hospital has discovered that one of its medical instruments was infected with the superbug C-R-E. There have been eleven patients that have died and the cause of their death may be the superbug C-R-E.

In non-alcoholic fatty liver disease the liver becomes swollen with fat. The condition is on the rise in children. The overwhelming proven therapy for this whether it is a child we're talking about or an adult is healthy weight loss.

People who have been vaccinated for measles between 1957 and 1971 have a new way to find out whether they have enough antibodies to avoid getting the disease. A simple blood test can be taken and the results are back within three to five days.

There is research being done on a pill that will burn body fat and reduce cholesterol. Fexaramine doesn't dissolve into the blood stream creating less side effects like hearts issues for example. If the drug passes all of the tests it may be available in about seven years.

Studies have now found that the vast majority of people who are put on statins, about 75 percent of them, are not put on them because they have vascular disease, but because they have risk factors. Those factors can be reduced by eating a Mediterranean diet, exercising, reducing stress, maintaining a normal weight and not smoking.

Technicians in the Kineta Biotech lab in Seattle are not seeking a vaccine that can address a multitude of viruses, they are developing a drug that lets your body defeat them all. This anti-viral drug acts like an antibiotic. It is a drug you can take after you get sick to get better faster, a drug that doesn't depend on vaccines but can enhance them. A drug that makes your system stronger.

Tamiflyu is an over-the-counter medication that help relieve flu symptoms. But it doesn't taste very good and children sometimes have difficulty taking it. Pharmacists can now flavor the medication so that it will be easier for children to swallow.

More than 150 thousand Americans suffer from chronic severe heart failure. There are only about 2,100 donor hearts available each year, so L-VADS remain an important treatment option. The LOVAD relieves symptoms such as being constantly tired or short of breath. It also lets the heart recover function by giving it a chance to rest.

The current measles outbreak is causing quite a discussion about the importance of vaccines. The vaccine hesitant population is very different from vaccine refusing. Being hesitant boils down to one thing, the fear of the unknown. The hope is that people can allow their logic to bring them to a place where they can see that their decision, like many other decisions ends up affecting an entire population.

A dietician says eating more colorful vegetables and along with eating less of the processed food that harms our health is a way to prevent type 2 diabetes. Processed meats include hot dogs and deli meats should be avoided along with white bread, white flour, white pasta, pastries and baked goods.

Foods to eat to avoid the flu should contain vitamin a – c – d and e. Also look for foods with zinc, which include most of your proteins and grains. In addition focus on probiotics such as yogurt. It contains a bacteria that fights away the bad germs in your body.

Children with conditions that force them to stay in the hospital for long periods of time can be helped by the aid of the “virtual rock star”. A music therapist sets the stage and enables the patients to star in their own rock video. Now that Lent is upon us we are reminded of the healthy ways to fast.

According to the American Society of Plastic Surgeons there has been a 310 percent increase in men getting Botox injections compared to a decade ago.

Pregnancy can create pain in the low back area, sciatica, neck and head. That pain is caused by the hormone relaxing ligaments while muscles in the body tighten. The first line of defense is a pregnancy-specific adjustment, making sure the pelvis is completely aligned. Next is a series of exercises to stretch and strengthen worn ligaments and muscles. That is followed by muscle relaxation on a hydrobed and then a pregnancy massage.

For those allergic to peanuts, wearing a peanut patch over a long period of time can be the way to eventually rid the body of the life-threatening effects of the nut. The patch has a peanut substance on one side that is in direct contact with the skin and it is changed every day. Early test results show that after time the patient can tolerate small amounts of peanuts. This is considered a breakthrough.

The UW Medical is now using CT scanners that emit less radiation than the old models at least 60 to 80 percent less. The new scanner is especially beneficial to those who need multiple scans and for younger patients.

It is not just calcium but vitamin D that helps make bones. From the day you're born until you're 35 you make more bones than you dissolve and from 35 on, you dissolve more bone than you make. Not getting enough Vitamin D has also implicated a number of other health issues including multiple sclerosis, heart disease, diabetes, some cancers and memory loss.

A new battery powered headband called the Celfaly is a device that applies electrical stimulation to certain nerves across the forehead. Over time this repeated stimulation of the nerves makes them less likely to send the signals that generate migraine headaches.
