

CLASS A TV ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATION

RSS Media Marketing certifies that WHIG has maintained the specified minimum hours of operation and locally produced programming required to remain eligible for classification as a Class A Television Station, specifically during the 4th quarter of 2022.

Section 73.6001(b) of the Commission's rules states that Class A television broadcast stations are required to:

- (1) Broadcast a minimum of 18 hours per day; and
- (2) Broadcast an average of at least three hours per week of locally produced programming each quarter. "Locally produced programming" is defined in 47 C.F.R. § 6000 as programming:
 - (a) Produced within the predicted Grade B contour of the station or within the predicted Grade B contours of any of the station in a commonly owned group; or
 - (b) Produced within the predicted DTV noise-limited contour of a digital Class A station broadcasting the program or within the contiguous predicted DTV noise-limited contours of any of the digital Class A stations in a commonly owned group; or
 - (c) Programming produced at the station's main studio.
