

THE CORONER RESPONDING JUST MOMENTS AFTER PEOPLE SAY A MAN FELL FROM THE ICONIC DOWNTOWN GREENVILLE BRIDGE. I REACHED OUT TO THE CITY AGAIN TONIGHT AND OUR NEWSROOM IS STAYING IN TOUCH WITH THE CORONER TO GET AN I-D AS WELL AS WHAT LED TO THIS MAN FALLING.
April 28 <sup>th</sup>	The Five O'clock News	:60	THE SHERIFF CALLS IT THE WORST CASE OF CHILD NEGLECT HE HAS EVER SEEN - NOW THE PARENTS CHARGED WITH HOMICIDE- AFTER A YOUNG TEEN'S DEATH- WE START THIS OUT WITH A DEVELOPING STORY LAW ENFORCEMENT SAYS IS THE "WORST CASE OF CHILD NEGLECT THE COUNTY HAS EVER SEEN." A FATHER AND MOTHER IN CHEROKEE COUNTY ARE FACING MURDER CHARGES AFTER THE DEATH OF THEIR 14-YEAR-OLD DAUGHTER WITH DISABILITIES. THIS IS A LOOK AT DAVID BAYNARD AND BOBBIE BAYNARD WHO ARE FACING THOSE CHARGES. THE SHERIFF SAYS THE PARENTS DROVE THE CHILD TO THE HOSPITAL WHERE SHE WAS UNRESPONSIVE UPON ARRIVALBUT DESPITE DOCTOR'S EFFORTSSHE WAS PRONOUNCED DEAD. BECAUSE OF THE CONDITION OF THIS CHILD DEPUTIES IN CHEROKEE COUNTY GOT A WARRANT TO SEARCH THE HOME. THE SHEIRFF SAYS THE HOME WAS FULL OF FECES URINE FLIESMAGGOTS AND ROACHES WITH THE CORONER ADDING IT WAS IN "DEPLORABLE CONDITION." THIS BILL BANS MOST ABORTIONS AFTER A FETAL HEARTBEAT IS DETECTED, WHICH IS TYPICALLY AROUND SIX WEEKS - MAKING IT ONE OF THE MOST RESTRICTIVE ANTI-ABORTION LAWS IN THE COUNTRY. WHILE IT'S ON THE BOOKS, IT'S CURRENTLY BLOCKED FROM TAKING EFFECT - A

		FEDERAL COURT RULING THAT THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE MOST RECENTLY APPEALED IN MARCH. THE SUPREME COURT'S ULTIMATE RULING COULD CHANGE THAT. "We have laws, as you know, that we passed that are a lot better than a lot of other states and certain better than Roe against Wade." OTHER CONSERVATIVE LAWMAKERS AT THE STATE HOUSE HAVE PROPOSED EVEN MORE RESTRICTIVE ABORTION LEGISLATION, INCLUDING A BILL THAT WOULD BAN ALL ABORTIONS, WITH NO EXCEPTIONS FOR RAPE OR INCEST. UNDER IT, PEOPLE WHO ADMINISTER OR INDUCE ABORTIONS WOULD BE PROSECUTED FOR MURDER. "Once that decision is issued, then we will know exactly what is necessary for us to do here in South Carolina." ABBOTT SAYING IN A STATEMENT: "WE WILL RAMP PRODUCTION AS QUICKLY AS WE CAN WHILE MEETING ALL REQUIREMENTS.
