## OPPOSITION TO INFORMAL OBJECTION

On behalf of Three Angels Broadcasting Network, Inc. ("3ABN"), licensee of Class A TV Station K21DO, Palm Springs, California, we hereby oppose the Informal Objection filed December 17, 2012 by Entravision Holdings, LLC ("Entravision"). The application at issue is 3ABN's request for a digital displacement construction permit on Channel 11 for in Palm Springs, California (the "Application").

Entravision's Objection relies primarily on the rules of baseball, which do not apply to the Commission, and to 3ABN's alleged lack of a showing of interference to K21DO. However, 3ABN provided the interference showing in an amendment filed December 6, 2012, eleven days prior to the date of Entravision's Informal Objection. That showing revealed a 0.91% overlap with Entravision's own pending application for full power digital station, KPMR, in Santa Barbara, California, FCC File No. BPCDT-20120817ABD. Any digital application filed for 3ABN's current analog channel 21 would also cause interference to both the existing analog

license and prior filed digital application for LPTV station K21GI, in violation of FCC Rule §73.6012.

Although Entravision does not say so, its real concern is that 3ABN's Application has precedence over its own companion application for Channel 11 in Indio, California, FCC File No. BDCCDVL-20120920ABN. According to FCC Rule §73.3572(a)(4)(iii), when a Class A displacement relief application becomes mutually exclusive with non-displacement modification applications for other Class A stations, "priority will be afforded to the Class A TV displacement relief application(s) to the exclusion of other applications." Because this is specified in the FCC's rules, Entravision has no choice but to resort to baseball. But that desperate measure can best be described as a foul ball.

Accordingly, we hereby request the Commission to deny Entravision's Informal Objection and to grant 3ABN's captioned Class A digital displacement Application.
