Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming for each of the above-referenced issues, as detailed below.

- 1. Blood drives. KTCC promoted Red Cross blood drives during February, March, and April 2023. PSAs ran twice or three times daily. Every day, blood donors help patients of all ages: accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and those battling cancer.
- 2. Western Kansas Child Advocacy Center Casino Night. KTCC ran a 30-second PSA throughout January, February, and until March 25, promoting a night that raised funds to help children in foster care and those who need emergency help. The recording ran two times daily during the period.
- 3. Future Farmers of America Breakfast. A 30-second PSA ran two to three times daily to promote the FFA Breakfast. The Colby Chapter of the Future Farmers of America is serving up their annual breakfast on Tuesday, Feb. 21st, from 6 to 7:30 a.m. at Colby High School. Enjoy biscuits and gravy, ham, hash browns, egg casseroles, juice, and coffee
- 4. Colby Public Schools Ag Building. A 30-second PSA ran two to three times daily. Colby Public School employees and community members are raising funds for a new Agriculture Education & Technology Center. The vision is to provide more hands-on experiences, accommodate a changing student body, and adapt to evolving industries. - 5. Dental Services for Low-Income Patients. The Colby Community College dental hygiene program offers free services to people of all ages in northwest Kansas. The program
