The station has identified the following as significant community issues in this quarter:

Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming for each of the above-referenced issues, as detailed below.

- 1. Blood drives. KTCC promoted local Red Cross blood drives scheduled in July, August, and September. The announcements ran two to three times daily. Every day, blood donors help patients of all ages: accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and those battling cancer.
- 2. Tornado safety. A CCC student recorded a 60-second announcement that ran two times daily during the quarter, telling listeners how to stay protected in the event of a tornado, such as the safest place to be and the difference between a tornado watch and a warning.
- 3. Lighting safety. A CCC student recorded a 60-second announcement that ran two times daily during the quarter telling listeners how to stay protected inside when lightning is present, such as to avoid using appliances and staying away from windows. A second announcement ran telling listeners how to stay safe if caught outside during lighting storms; directions were given to stay in low areas, avoiding water, and staying away from tall objects.
- 4. Sacred Heart Church CYO Fundraiser. The local Catholic Youth Organization had a fruit sale to raise money for a trip in November. KTCC ran a 30-second PSA in July and August that ran two times per day.

- 5. Thomas County Historical Society Duck Race. A 30-second PSA ran two times daily in June and early July to promote the Thomas County Historical Society "Ducky Run" fundraiser. Rubber ducks will be adopted and race down the slide at the Colby Aquatic Park.
- 6. Dental Services for Low-Income Patients. The Colby Community College dental hygiene program offers free services to people of all ages in northwest Kansas. The program provides a complete exam from a dentist that includes x-rays, a periodontal evaluation, oral cancer screening, and thorough cleaning. Information can be sent to local dental offices. A 45-second announcement ran two times daily throughout the quarter.
- 7. 24/7 Foodbank Fill-up. September is Hunger Action Month, and through September, 24/7 Travel Store is collecting donations for the Genesis Food Pantry of Thomas County. A 30-second announcement ran in late August and all of September two times per day.
- 8. Chamber of Commerce Lunch and Learn. The Thomas County Chamber of Commerce sponsored a Lunch and Learn on Time Management at no charge. A 30-second announcement ran twice daily in September.
- 9. Fly Kansas Air Tour. The Fly Kansas Air Tour is coming on Oct 5th, from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at Shalz Field Airport. More than 20 aircraft are expected. Students can learn from pilots, discover career opportunities, and check out the planes. Brought to you by the Kansas Division of Aviation and the Kansas Commission on Aerospace Education (KCAE). A 30-second announcement ran two times per day during September.
- 10. Non-Profit Announcements. If your non-profit organization has an announcement to make, we can help you get the word out to the T-92 listening area. This announcement ran two times per day during the quarter.
