We connect over 30,000 Ventura County callers and texters each year with information about health and human services available to them. 211 Ventura County phone and text service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 211 is available in 150 languages through phone interpretation services. Launched on February 11, 2005, 211 Ventura County was the first live 211 in the state of California. Interface added texting to 211 "call or click" services in February 2017, becoming one of few 211s nationwide to offer two-way texting available 24/7 in English and Spanish. 211 Ventura County also provides resources to over 3,000 unique visitors each month through the 211Ventura.org website. During times of disaster, 211 provides incident specific information in coordination with local emergency services, including road closures and shelters both locally and nationwide.

We have close to 200 free of charge programs planned in 2021. Our mission is to improve the lives of all affected by autism, so the programs cover a lot of different topics from Autism 101, to support groups, to art classes, to college and jobs ... and more. We have a volunteer based resource line so those in need can connect with a parent mentor who can offer resources or help find resources needed. We also have a safety program with our first responders. Our partnership with Oxnard Police Department has grown and during the month of April many will be wearing an autism awareness patch. You will also see ASVC out with OPD at multiple events promoting autism and selling some cool gear. This partnership includes ASVC sponsoring training that certifies emergency responders in recognizing and effectively handling situations that may arise with those with disabilities. (This is followed by caregiver training in both English and Spanish, so caregivers communicate with first responders effectively) We will also be equipping around 30 ambulances in the county with sensory kits so they are also better equipped to help and comfort the neurodiverse population.
