Issue: Accidents in Construction Zones Issue: Keith Roberts, IDOT Engineering

Synopsis: Highway traffic crashes that occur at work zone constructions often involve a distracted driver more often than a speeding driver, and the injuries are commonly suffered by those in the vehicle than the road workers themselves. In order to enhance road safety, engineers with IDOT have to consider a combination of traffic crash factors including: road conditions, vehicles, and drivers. Engineers like Keith Roberts go to places where road crashes most often occur, and take into consideration what can be done specifically to ensure fewer traffic accidents occur at a particular location.
