Issue: Public Interest

Weatherize New London - Broadcast January 23rd, 2019 at 8:15 AM, duration 15 minutes

Jamie Hess and Joy Kubit for New London Energy stop into the studio to discuss weatherize efforts for the Lake Sunapee Region, specifically the official launch of the 2019 Weatherize-Solarize campaign for the 6 towns of Andover, New London, Newbury, Sutton, Warner and Wilmot, including information, and incentives about alternative energy installation in homes, and more specifically solar and energy efficient devices.

Issue: Public Health

Good Neighbor Clinic - Broadcast February 6th, 2019 at 8:15 AM, duration 15 minutes.

Eula Lee Kozma, Development Director of Good Neighbor Health Clinic, and Kristi Saunders, Hospice and Palliative Medical Director at Lake Sunapee VNA, discuss the efforts of the Good Neighbor Clinic for the region. The Good Neighbor Health Clinics promote the health of people in the Greater Upper Valley who are in need and do not have the means to pay, by providing free medical and dental care, mentoring aspiring health care professionals, and advocating for improved access to dental and health care. Also discussed was free women's clinic in Claremont February 6th.
