

Information on Third-Party Fundraising - For NCE Stations Only

Rule § 73.3527 (e) (14) Information on Third-Party Fundraising.

Retention Two years from the date of the broadcast of the specific program reported.

What's in here? For noncommercial educational broadcast stations that interrupt regular programming to conduct fundraising activities on behalf of a third-party non-profit organization pursuant to § 73.503(e) (FM stations) or § 73.621(f) (television stations), every three months, the following information for each third-party fundraising program or activity: the date, time, and duration of the fundraiser; the type of fundraising activity; the name of the non-profit organization benefitted by the fundraiser; a brief description of the specific cause or project, if any, supported by the fundraiser; and, to the extent that the station participated in tallying or receiving any funds for the nonprofit group, an approximation of the total funds raised. The information for each calendar quarter is to be filed by the tenth day of the succeeding calendar quarter (e.g., January 10 for the quarter October-December, April 10 for the quarter January-March, etc.).

The date, time, and duration of the fundraiser: Friday April 09, 2021, 7 A.M., 11 hours

The type of fundraising activity: Radiothon remote broadcast accepting onsite Paypal donations

The name of the non-profit organization benefited by the fundraiser: Foundation for Music and Healing, Inc.

A brief description of the specific cause or project, if any, supported by the fundraiser: The Foundation for Music and Healing, Inc. is a non-profit, community based organization which seeks to provide the benefits of music to those who never thought it possible. It was created in 2003 to bring the benefits of music to exceptional people with special needs and disabilities. Instruction in piano, beginning strings and general music is provided on a weekly basis to scores of individuals who range in age from toddlers to adults. The Foundation's mission is to create a safe place where students and their families may experience the joy and comfort of music. This promotes mental and psychological well-being and physical wellness. Unique environments allow students to demonstrate their personal strengths and gifts in music and song. Families are welcome to participate in and experience the fun and practical value of learning music-making techniques. Individuals are encouraged to expand their range of expression and to further develop their creative talents. The Foundation makes programs and services available to a wide range of people throughout the community who have challenging circumstances. Served are exceptional students with special needs. Individual instruction is open to students of all ages with disabilities or special needs which range from mild to severe. Included are those with autism, Asperger's Syndrome, blindness and visual impairment, cerebral palsy, cognitive disorders, deafness, Down syndrome, Williams Syndrome, emotional and/or physical trauma, epilepsy and learning disorders. Also mental retardation, pervasive developmental disorder, physical impairments, speech and hearing disorders, seizures, spina bifida and stroke.

To the extent that the station participated in tallying or receiving any funds for the nonprofit group, an approximation of the total funds raised: \$1,287.12
