LOCAL POLITICS connects listeners with Fairfield's City Council sessions meetings, and other specials, like the Carnegie Museum segments on the Heritage Farm families, highlighting those who have owned family farms for more than 150 years in the area, plus targeted informational city interest segments, like the state of the housing market and requirements for home refurbishings, keeping listeners up to date on city business and issues. (4x weekly)

We've continued to air a locally-produced segment called HOMETOWN HIGHLIGHTS & BEYOND, featuring stories of local interest by writers from the *Iowa Source*, a statewide free monthly based in Fairfield now in its 36th year of publication, suggesting things to do, places to see, and highlighting area businesses. Station manager James Moore wrote a piece about the history of the station and its spring fund drive that aired a score of times. (3x weekly)

Educational 2-min segments air weekdays (5X each):

- ~The Science and the Sea, highlights marine science topics, produced by The University of Texas at Austin
- ~Sound Beat, produced at Syracuse University Libraries, provides special music segments, film scores and recorded tidbits from across the American musical spectrum, as well as speeches and spoken word performances from political figures and historical luminaries.
- ~EarthDate, produced by the Bureau of Economic Geology at the University of Texas at Austin, presents natural wonders of earth from the perspective of geoscience

GLOBAL FAMILY CHAT offers scientific and philosophical insight on an array of topics and educational disciplines, plus positive news from around the world, helpful health protocols, and timely developments at Maharishi International University and within the worldwide Transcendental Meditation movement. (twice daily)

Cultural content includes:

- ~CLASSICS & BEYOND, produced by Quality Radio Productions in Geneva, New York, a curated blend of classical music with styles spanning the classical gamut. (Weekdays)
