

## **KHOE Quarterly Report Issues/Programs List Q3 2021 [Jul-Sept]**

One highlight of this quarter was the addition of a part-time position at the station. KHOE has been able to integrate several new programs into the weekly schedule. LOCAL POLITICS alternates Fairfield's regular City Council sessions with the Jefferson County supervisors meetings, as well as a monthly program called CITY BUSINESS with host Melinda Arndt and city councilman Michael Halley, produced by the Fairfield Media Center.

GLOBAL FAMILY CHAT continues to offer invaluable health protocols, positive news from around the world, timely developments at Maharishi International University in terms of student academics, faculty accomplishments, branch facilities, scientific insights, and much more on a twice-daily basis.

We just picked up a weekly hour-long show called FOOTLIGHT PARADE produced by the Musical Theater Project. It launched with a 4-part series on the legacy of Stephen Sondheim. Fairfield's convention center is home to the Stephen Sondheim Center so it feels especially fitting for this community. It will be rebroadcast 3 times weekly.

We also air *TM Talks*, hosted by Mario Orsati, three times a week, delivering tools for enhanced personal growth. Scientists, artists, educators, artisans and thought leaders in the fields of education, health, business, the military, and at-risk populations share practical insights and inspiration.

*EarthDate*, a production of the Bureau of Economic Geology at the University of Texas at Austin, is broadcast thrice daily 2-minute segments. The pithy segments allow listeners to discover the natural wonders of earth from the perspective of geoscience and the physical universe, a good fit with the educational purpose of our broadcast mission.

Local hosts continue to provide a varied mix of positive and uplifting programming. Global music elevates the hearts and minds of listeners, which we hear regularly from listeners. We broadcast the healing sounds of classical, spiritual and religious music on a daily and weekly basis, as well as wide-ranging world and ethnic music geared to serving area minorities and campus students from abroad.
