Quarterly Report Issues/Programs List

We marked the passing of long-time LET YOUR HEART SING show host Sheila Moschen this quarter. Her showcases of local artists, poets and more have been a perennial favorite and a constant source of uplifting seasonal music & entertainment. We will continue to run her more than 100 produced programs as they capture the heart of our local area and university's special blend of shared humanity and enlightened sense of expansion and optimism, so vital to the fabric of our community's social well being. (4X weekly)

Our regular updates from Fairfield's City Council sessions as well as occasional Jefferson County supervisors meetings, and some special families featured in the Heritage Farm series connected with the Carnegie Museum to highlight Fairfield's roots, produced by the Fairfield Media Center. The council sessions provide windows into the city's thinking, planning and actions, like new requirements for substandard housing, an issue of growing concern for our city; information on upcoming businesses and events like Fairfield landing on the direct route for this year's 51st annual statewide legendary week-long bike ride known as Ragbrai, plus activities of other nonprofits like the Convention Center and Convention and Visitors Bureau.

We air two science-based and one historic entertainment-based segments weekdays (5X weekly each):

~*EarthDate*, a production of the Bureau of Economic Geology at the University of Texas at Austin, highlighting the earth's natural wonders from the perspective of geoscience

~*The Science and the Sea*, also produced by The University of Texas at Austin, focuses on topics related to marine sciences and its corollaries

~*Sound Beat*, produced at Syracuse University Libraries, provides a window into the evolution of sound and technology featuring recorded tidbits from across the American musical landscape, plus speeches, music and spoken word performances from historical luminaries.

in keeping with our mission as an educational station, we air:

~ANCIENT & CLASSICAL MUSIC, overnight and early morning, with a special emphasis on classical music forms from the Vedic Tradition, known as gandharva veda music as well as classical music from many traditions, countries and composers. (Overnight and 9pm-10pm daily)

~CLASSICS & BEYOND, produced by Quality Radio Productions in Geneva, New York. QRP. A curated blend of classical music styles across the board. (Weekday mornings)

~FOOTLIGHT PARADE, produced by the Musical Theater Project. A deep dive into the world of musical theater. Fairfield is the proud home of the Stephen Sondheim Center, the only theater in the country outside New York that bears his name. (3X weekly)

GLOBAL FAMILY CHAT presents positive news from around the world, offering solutions to a range of problems from personal development, including health, psychological, sociological, and

spiritual, to education, business, environment and scientific, as well as timely developments from Maharishi International University and the worldwide Transcendental Meditation movement. This quarter highlighted many sessions and speakers from the recent Peace gathering in India where over 10,000 people from countless countries across the globe gathered to practice strategies to promote peace locally and globally. A parallel course in Fairfield drew some 2000 who were linked to the India course.

TM TALKS offers discussions with host Mario Orsatti on a wide range of topics with scientists, artists, educators, authors, and respected leaders in the fields of education, health, business, and more. Also, there were interviews by renowned scientist and author Dr. Tony Nader speaking with contemporary thought leaders on consciousness, philosophy and applied unified principles. (3X weekly)

WRITERS' VOICES continues to inspire writers and engaged readers of all levels. Experienced, nuanced hosts Monica Hadley and her mother Caroline Kilbourn delve into authors' latest work, creative processes, and myriad trajectories navigating today's publishing world. (3X weekly)
