Today's guest is NOAA's David Schofield, here to talk to the public about how whale carcasses tend to drift ashore during the summer months and officials are asking for the public's help in locating the dead mammals.

One to four sperm whale carcasses come ashore in Hawai'i per year and the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) are teaming up to ask the public to notify authorities if they see a dead whale in the ocean as soon as possible – with benefits to both parties.

It is less expensive for officials to tow the carcass out the farther it is away from land. And for boaters, fishing around a carcass improves.
