ASSEMBLY BILL 220 WOULD GIVE THE WATER AUTHORITY LEEWAY TO RESTRICT WATER USAGE TO THE BIGGEST WATER USERS IN THE VALLEY. THE AVERAGE HOME USES ABOUT 130-THOUSAND GALLONS OF WATER PER YEAR. THIS BILL WOULD TARGET USERS USING MORE THAN 1600THOUSAND GALLONS ANNUALLY. IF PASSED, NEVADA COULD BE THE FIRST TO GIVE A WATER AGENCY THIS KIND OF POWER.
