EVERYONE WHO GOT THE PFIZER SHOT IN NEVADA IS ELIGIBLE FOR A BOOSTER SHOT, SO LONG AS YOU THINK YOUR JOB PUTS YOU AT HIGHER RISK FOR CONTRACTING COVID-19. IF YOU DO THINK YOU ARE AT A HIGH RISK FOR COVID YOU STILL HAVE TO WAIT SIX MONTHS AFTER YOU'VE HAD YOUR SECOND DOSE OF THE PFIZER VACCINE. THE CDC RECENTLY APPROVED BOOSTER SHOTS FOR SENIORS FRONTLINE WORKERS AND PEOPLE WITH UNDERLYING HEALTH CONDITIONS.

A GROUP OF CONCERNED PARENTS SAY THE UNDERFUNDED PUBLIC EDUCATION SYSTEM VIOLATES THE STATE CONSTITUTION. A LOWER COURT REJECTED THE LAWSUIT, FINDING THAT POLITICAL AND POLICY DEBATE BELONGS IN THE LEGISLATURE AND NOT THE COURTROOM. THE PARENTS, FOUR OF WHOM HAVE KIDS IN CLARK COUNTY SCHOOLS, SAY COURT INTERVENTION IS NEEDED. CCSD IS THE FIFTH LARGEST DISTRICT IN THE NATION, YET NEVADA EDUCATION RATES RANK AMONG THE LOWEST. THE SUPREME COURT DIDN'T GIVE A TIMETABLE ON WHEN IT WILL MAKE A RULING.
COVID-19: Education	News 3 Today	11/27	4:00a	30 sec	THE NEVADA SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION'S BOARD OF REGENTS SCHEDULED TO MEET ON THURSDAY TO REVISIT THE COVID-19 VACCINE REQUIREMENT FOR COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY EMPLOYEES. REGENTS ARE EXPECTED TO CONSIDER AN EMERGENCY AMENDMENT TO THE RULE REQUIRING EMPLOYEES TO GET VACCINATED BY DECEMBER 31-ST OR FACE TERMINATION. REGENTS COULD CHOOSE TO ALLOW THE EXISTING MANDATE TO REMAIN IN PLACE, DELAY THE TERMINATION DATE TO JANUARY 15-TH, OR REPEAL THE RULE ALTOGETHER. THERE ARE MEDICAL OR RELIGIOUS EXCEPTIONS.

THIS COMES AFTER THE CONTROVERSIAL DECISION BY THE LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION LAST WEEK TO ALLOW THE STUDENT VACCINE REQUIREMENTS TO EXPIRE. AN OPEN PETITION FROM THE NEVADA FACULTY ALLIANCE HAS ALREADY GARNERED ALMOST ONE THOUSAND SIGNATURES FROM STUDENTS AND STAFF DEMANDING THE VAX MANDATES ARE PUT BACK INTO PLACE.
