COVID-19	News 3 Today	7/13	4:00a	30 sec	CORONAVIRUS CASES ARE SKYROCKETING IN NEVADA AND NEW DATA SHOWS WHERE LOCALS MAY BE SPREADING THE VIRUS MORE FREQUENTLY. OVER THE PAST 30 DAYS RESTAURANTS, GROCERY STORES AND CASINOS WERE SOME OF MOST COMMON FOLLOWED BY MEDICAL FACILITIES AND THE WORKPLACE. EACH POTENTIAL EXPOSURE SITE WAS VISITED BY SOMEONE TWO WEEKS PRIOR TO DEVELOPING SYMPTOMS OR GETTING TESTED. NEVADA IS ONE OF FIVE STATES WITH RISING CASES AND LOW VACCINATION RATES. MORE THAN 750 PEOPLE ARE HOSPITALIZED. THE HIGHEST OUR STATE HAS SEEN SINCE MID-FEBRUARY.

NOW LOCAL DEA AGENTS ARE LAUNCHING A NEW SOCIAL MEDIA CAMPAIGN TO HELP PREVENT OPIOID DEATHS IN OUR COMMUNITY. AGENTS RECEIVED MORE THAN 50,000 COUNTERFEIT PILLS LAST WEEK. MANY OF THEM CONTAINING POTENTIALLY LETHAL AMOUNTS OF FENTANYL. MOST OF THEM ARE COMING UP FROM THE BORDER AND THEY'RE BEING MARKETED TO TEENAGERS ON THE INTERNET.

IT WAS BROUGHT FORWARD BY NEVADA SENATOR CATHERINE CORTEZ MASTO. THE BILL WOULD CREATE A GRANT PROGRAM FOR WATER RECYCLING PROJECTS IN NEVADA AND 16 OTHER STATES. THE LEGISLATION WOULD PUMP MORE THAN \$750,000,000 INTO THOSE PROJECTS AND TRY TO INCENTIVIZE STATES TO RECYCLE WATER. A SIMILAR BILL HAS ALREADY BEEN INTRODUCED IN THE HOUSE BY NEVADA CONGRESSWOMAN SUSIE LEE.</p>

EVERY MORNING, EMPLOYEES CHECK IN USING THE DEVICE. THEY ALSO DO TEMPERATURE CHECKS AND PRE-SCREENINGS AT HOME. THE DEVICE USES BIOMARKERS AND ANALYZES HOW THE PATIENT LINES UP WITH POSSIBLE SIGNS OF INFECTION. THE CONCEPT IS SIMILAR TO FACIAL RECOGNITION TECHNOLOGY.

IT WOULD REQUIRE COUNTY WORKERS TO GET THE SHOT OR GET TESTED EVERY WEEK. THE PROPOSAL ACKNOWLEDGES THAT THERE ARE LEGAL CONCERNS. THE COMMISSION TABLED THE PLAN FOR TWO WEEKS AS LAWMAKERS WORK OUT THE DETAILS.

THE STATE'S TEST POSITIVITY RATE HAS NOW SOARED PAST 15%, MORE THAN TRIPLE THE GOAL LAID OUT BY THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION. THE LAST TIME THE TEST POSITIVITY RATE WAS THIS HIGH WAS IN FEBRUARY WHEN CASES WERE IN THE PROCESS OF A STEEP DECLINE. NEVADA REPORTED MORE THAN 1200 NEW CASES YESTERDAY AND 11 DEATHS. HOSPITALIZATIONS HAVE ALSO PASSED LEVELS SEEN DURING LAST SUMMER'S SURGE. NEW DATA ABOUT THE STATE OF HOSPITALS IN NEVADA IS EXPECTED TODAY.

IT RECOMMENDS ALL TEACHERS, STAFF AND STUDENTS AT K THROUGH 12 SCHOOLS WEAR A MASK INSIDE SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND SCHOOL BUSES REGARDLESS IF THEY ARE VACCINATED OR NOT. WEEKLY REGULAR TESTING WILL ALSO BE REQUIRED FOR THOSE WHO ARE NOT FULL VACCINATED AND TRAVEL FOR SPORTS AND OTHER ACTIVITIES. CLARK COUNTY SCHOOLS ALREADY HAD THE MASK MANDATE IN PLACE.

IT LEFT DOZENS STANDING OUTSIDE IN THE HEAT WITH NO SHADE. THIS HAPPENED AT MOJAVE HIGH SCHOOL. WITH SCHOOL BACK IN SESSION UNVACCINATED STAFF AT CCSD ARE REQUIRED TO GET TESTED ON A WEEKLY BASIS. SEVERAL PEOPLE IN LINE TOLD NEWS 3 THAT THE SITE WAS SHUT DOWN EARLY BECAUSE THEY RAN OUT OF TESTS. OTHERS EXPRESSED FRUSTRATION AT HAVING TO STAND OUTSIDE IN TRIPLE-DIGIT WEATHER.

ANNIE FERRINO RECENTLY BROUGHT THAT MESSAGE TO A CROWDED COUNTY COMMISSION CHAMBER. HER BOYFRIEND, MICHAEL PETITTA, DIED JULY 19TH. THEY BOTH CAME DOWN WITH COVID IN JULY, ALTHOUGH FERRINO SAYS THE VACCINE SHE RECEIVED THIS PAST SPRING MADE HER SYMPTOMS LESS SEVERE. THAT WASN'T THE CASE FOR HER BOYFRIEND, WHO REMAINED UNVACCINATED AND EVENTUALLY GOT SO SICK HE HAD TO GO TO THE HOSPITAL.
