Salud	Despierta América	01/09/2018	1:50	The flu has ramped up early this year and is rapidly spreading across the country, with widespread flu activity in 46 states, according to the latest data from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The flu has not yet reached "epidemic" proportions, according to last week's CDC data, but it may happen soon. A flu epidemic occurs when the percentage of people who have died from the flu exceeds a threshold set by the CDC using data from prior years. Last week, the number of people who died from the flu this year was only 0.2 percent below that threshold. Doctor's visits for flu-like illness are rising. This year's numbers are almost identical to three years ago, in the 2014-2015 season -- both years surpassed what was seen last year, 2016-2017.
Salud	Despierta America	02/20/2018	0:25	Scientists are getting closer to developing blood and urine tests for autism, which could lead to earlier diagnosis and treatment of the condition, a new study suggests. The tests look for damage to certain proteins, shown to be higher in children with autism spectrum disorders. The team from the University of Warwick and the University of Bologna tested 38 children with autism and 31 children without, ages 5 to 12. They looked for differences in samples of blood and urine between the two groups. When looking at plasma in the blood, the children with autism had greater protein damage, resulting in higher levels of an oxidation marker known as dityrosine and sugar-modified compounds called advanced glycation end-products.
Seguridad	Despierta America	02/23/2018	0:52	President Donald Trump, after listening to a series of emotional stories and pleas to enhance school safety at the White House Wednesday, floated the idea of arming teachers and school staff, an idea that was met with support from many of the attendees. "If you had a teacher who was adept with the firearm, they could end the attack very quickly," he said, stating that schools could arm up to 20% of their teachers to stop "maniacs" who may try and attack them.

Delta, Southwest, JetBlue and American Airlines were allowing travelers to change their Friday and Saturday flights in anticipation of the massive storm hitting major cities like Boston, Providence and Hartford.

It was the first known study to report on the presence of potentially cancer-causing compounds in the bodies of adolescents who use e-cigarettes. The list of compounds included acrylonitrile, acrolein, propylene oxide, acrylamide and crotonaldehyde.

Influenza activity has increased and is now widespread in 49 states, all except Hawaii, for the week ending Jan. 13, according to the weekly flu report released Friday by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Flu is a contagious, viral illness that causes mild to severe symptoms that can sometimes lead to death.

The health department said test results confirmed the girl, who was reported to have flu-like symptoms, died from the influenza virus. She was rushed to the hospital, where she died at about 6:30 a.m. Monday. More than 50 children have died from the flu across the country this season.

During a White House meeting with law enforcement officials, Trump proposed for the second time in the last two days that some teachers, "certain highly adept people, people who understand weaponry, guns," should carry firearms on campus.

The 17-minute walkout is a tribute to the 17 victims killed last month at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida. According to the #Enough website, there will be more than 3,000 walkouts from California to Puerto Rico. Most students will leave class at 10 a.m. in their time zone. Since the shooting, Florida lawmakers passed new gun laws

				for the first time in 22 years - but students there want to see changes nationwide.

FBI agent Michelle Lee said the explosion happened at around 1 a.m. at a FedEx facility in Schertz, which is just northeast of San Antonio and about 60 miles (95 kilometers) southwest of Austin. One worker was treated for minor injuries and released, according to statements issued by the Schertz Police Department and FedEx.
Seguridad/Clima	Noticiero Univision	01/03/2018	2:07	A massive "bombogenesis" -- an area of rapidly declining low pressure -- will wreak havoc on the Northeast this week, threatening hurricane-force winter wind gusts and blinding snow. The bombogenesis will result in what's known as a "bomb cyclone." And the bomb cyclone, expected to strike Thursday, will likely dump 6 to 12 inches of snow in New England and hurl 40- to 60-mph gusts. The impending storm led to more than 2,700 preemptive US flight cancellations for Thursday, according to Flightaware.com. At Mount Washington Observatory in New Hampshire, the temperature will plunge to minus 35 degrees Friday night into Saturday, weather observer Taylor Regan said. At last check several days ago, the high temperature on Mars was minus 2 degrees Fahrenheit. But it's not just New England suffering winter's wrath. Freezing rain, sleet and snow are smothering parts of the Southeast on Wednesday. For some in the South, the sight of snow was a first. In South Carolina snowfall left the Palmetto State's signature palm plants covered in white stuff. By Wednesday afternoon, some areas had seen five to six inches of snow.

Called the "Tide Pod Challenge," the new viral trend sees teens filming themselves while they attempt to eat Tide laundry detergent pods, before challenging others to do the same - and the videos are horrifying and dangerous. According to reports, the challenge was originally featured as a joke in The Onion, a satirical news organization. But the challenge soon became real after circulating on social media - with multiple videos uploaded to YouTube of people participating in the challenge. The most recent, uploaded today, has already been viewed close to 12,000 times.

A winter storm moving across the Great Lakes is making for treacherous driving conditions Friday. School kids were thrilled to get the day off from school but with more than One thousand flights cancelled, travelers are on edge. Snow is piling up from a winter storm that's moving across the across the upper Midwest, snarling traffic and closing some freeways. The National Weather Service says Friday morning it's received reports of between 9 and 11 inches (23 to 28 centimeters) of snow over a 24-hour period in Fort Dodge, Iowa. Eight inches was reported in parts of northern Illinois and up to about 6 inches was reported the Chicago area.
Seguridad	Noticiero Univision	02/25/2018	1:46	As if taxpayers don't have enough to worry about. Thousands of Americans have been conned out of more than \$1 million by crooks posing as IRS agents

				<p>demanding tax payments, according to the U.S. Treasury. "This is the largest scam of its kind that we have ever seen," said J. Russell George, the Treasury inspector general for tax administration, who says the agency has received more than 20,000 complaints about the fraud. The sophisticated phone scam has hit victims in every state, tax officials say. Callers claiming to be from the IRS tell intended victims they owe taxes and must pay using a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. The scammers threaten those who refuse to pay with arrest, deportation or loss of a business or driver's license. To lend the scam credibility, the crooks often know the last four digits of the taxpayer's Social Security number, and the calls are made with spoofed caller identification software that makes it appear the call is originating from the IRS. In many cases, taxpayers will get follow-up calls that appear to be from their state motor vehicle agency (if a driver's license was threatened) or the police. The scammers also send follow-up emails that mimic the IRS insignia and even appear to be signed by real IRS officials. "The increasing number of people receiving these unsolicited calls from individuals who fraudulently claim to represent the IRS is alarming," George said. "Particularly during the tax filing season, we want to make sure that innocent taxpayers are alert to this scam so they are not harmed by these criminals. Do not become a victim." In reality, if you owe taxes, the IRS will contact you by U.S. mail -- not email. The agency never asks for payment via debit card or wire transfer. It never asks you to provide a credit card number over the phone. And it never requests personal or financial information by e-mail, text or social media.</p>

March will roar in like a lion in the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast on Friday and Saturday as a potent storm delivers a ferocious mix of howling winds, drenching rain, heavy snow and powerful waves. Power outages, coastal flooding, damaging wind gusts and flight delays are all likely as the nor'easter explodes off the New England coast. High wind warnings and watches are in effect all the way from northern Georgia to southern Maine, a distance of about 900 miles.</p> <p>The worst of the wind and coastal flooding will hit from eastern Massachusetts to southern Maine, AccuWeather meteorologist Brett Anderson said. Hurricane-force wind gusts of 75 mph are possible, the National Weather Service said.</p> <p>Massachusetts Gov. Charlie Baker. Winds are likely to be strong enough to lead to major airline delays from Chicago to Boston, and airlines waived change fees.</p>

The proposals, which come more than three weeks after the Parkland, Florida, school shooting, also include a plan to establish a commission chaired by Education Secretary Betsy DeVos</p>

				<p>that will recommend policy and funding proposals for school violence prevention, including possible age restrictions on some firearms purchases. The commission does not have a set timeline of when it will report its findings, although an official said it would be within one year. "Today we are announcing meaningful actions, steps that can be taken right away to help protect students," DeVos said Sunday. "Far too often the focus has been only on the most contentious fights -- the things that have divided people and sent them into their entrenched corners," she continued. "But the plan that we're going to advance and talk about is a pragmatic plan to dramatically increase school safety and to take steps to do so right away." The announcement of the commission comes less than a day after Trump criticized blue-ribbon committees at a rally in Pennsylvania, saying, "We can't just keep setting up blue-ribbon committees," adding that they do nothing but "talk, talk, talk."</p>
