The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says there are now at least 100 confirmed cases of salmonella illness connected to the cereal. 33 people have been hospitalized due to the outbreak, but there no reports of any deaths. Meanwhile, the Food and Drug Administration is urging retailers to immediately pull all boxes of honey smacks from their shelves. All Honey Smacks Cereal was recalled last month.
Salud	Despierta América	07/23/2018	0:30	Mondelez International is issuing a voluntary recall for some of its Ritz Crackers products because of a potential risk of salmonella. The Hanover, New Jersey-based company says it's recalling 16 varieties of Ritz Cracker Sandwiches and Ritz Bits products in the U.S. The products contain whey powder, which its supplier has recalled due to the potential presence of salmonella. Mondelez says no illnesses have been reported yet. Symptoms of salmonella include fever, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. It can cause serious and sometimes fatal infections in the young, elderly or those with weakened

				immune systems. Consumers who have these products should not eat them, and should discard them. Any questions should be directed to the company at 1-844-366-1171. The microorganism can cause serious and sometimes fatal infections in young children, frail or elderly people, and others with weakened immune systems. Healthy people infected with salmonella often experience fever, diarrhea, nausea, vomiting and abdominal pain. In rare circumstances, infection with salmonella can result in the organism getting into the bloodstream and producing more severe illnesses such as arterial infections, endocarditis and arthritis.
Salud	Despierta America	08/01/2018	0:30	Federal officials are warning consumers to be on guard for signs of intestinal distress if they've eaten any of more than two dozen types of salads and wraps sold by several major retailers around the U.S. In a public health alert issued Monday night, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) cited worries that beef, pork and poultry salad and wrap products may be infected by a parasite known as cyclospora cayetanensis. Distributed nationwide by Caito Foods of Indianapolis, the possibly tainted products were sold by retailers including Kroger, Trader Joe's and Walgreens. Caito learned of the problem when its supplier, Fresh Express, notified it of a recall involving some of the lettuce in products packaged under a variety of brand names. All of the 25 product varieties are now out of date, produced from July 15 to 18 with the "Best By," "Enjoy by," Best if Sold By" or "Sell By" dates ranging from July 18 through July 23.

The automaker issued a recall to fix the power-locking mechanisms in the tailgates of certain Ram pickup trucks. The company said it had not identified any injuries or accidents connected to the defect. The recall covers a portion of Ram 1500, 2500 and 3500 pickup trucks from the 2015 through 2017 model years. Pickups in that range with manual tailgate locking are not affected. Pickups with eight-foot cargo beds are also not affected. The recently redesigned 2019 Ram is also not affected. Engineers installed a different system for that model.

Researchers also examined surfaces of handrails, toilets, kiosk touchscreens and toys in children's play areas. Security trays were found to have the most contamination. Viruses were found in half of the samples taken from security trays; no viruses were detected on toilet bowls, flush buttons, or the locks inside stall doors. To help stop the spread of germs, travelers are encouraged to use hand sanitizer and wash their hands thoroughly and frequently. The study was published in the journal 'b-m-c infectious diseases' by the university of nottingham and the finnish institute for health and welfare.
Economía	Despierta America	09/07/2018	0:25	Hiring in the United States picked up in August as employers added a strong 201,000 jobs, a sign of confidence that consumers and businesses will keep spending despite the Trump administration's ongoing conflicts with its trading partners. The unemployment rate remained at 3.9 percent, near an 18-year low. Friday's August jobs report from the government also showed that

				paychecks are growing faster. Average hourly wages are now 2.9 percent above where they were a year earlier, the fastest year-over-year gain in eight years. Still, after adjusting for inflation, pay has been flat for the past year. Taken as a whole, the data point to a job market that remains resilient even after nearly a decade of economic expansion and even with the threat of tariffs and counter-tariffs on imports and exports looming over many U.S. employers that rely on global trade.

The Administration said the drug does not meet its safety standards and contains a chemical that is linked to causing cancer. High amounts of this chemical can also cause liver damage.

Bottles of C-V-S health 12-hour sinus relief nasal mist could be contaminated with a bacterium called Pseudomonas Aeruginosa. According to the Food and Drug Administration, using the nose spray could cause slight illness in most people. But for people with Cystic Fibrosis or immune disorders, the bacterium can be deadly. There have been no reports of illness associated with the nasal spray so far. Anybody who has purchased it should throw it away or return.

The CDC reminded the public to wash and sanitize hands before and after handling new animals.

At stake was Obamacare's "risk adjustment" program. In brief, the program tries to help balance the medical risk in the law's insurance markets. Health insurers that are found to have healthier customers (according to a federal formula) pay money into the program, and then insurers who have sicker customers receive money out of it. The program had been challenged in court by smaller insurers in New Mexico, which argued the federal formula was tilted in favor of bigger national carriers. A federal judge agreed with them in an April ruling. That decision is what prompted the Trump.
Justicia	Noticiero Univision	08/14/2018	2:04	More than 1,000 children - and possibly many more - were molested by hundreds of Roman Catholic priests in six Pennsylvania dioceses, while senior church officials took steps to cover it up, according to a landmark grand jury report released Tuesday. The grand jury said it believes the "real number" of abused children might be "in the thousands" since some records were lost and victims were afraid to come forward. The report said more than 300 clergy committed the abuse over a period decades, beginning in the mid-1950s. Pennsylvania Attorney General Josh Shapiro said the two-year probe found a systematic cover-up by senior church officials in Pennsylvania and at the Vatican. "The cover-up was sophisticated. And all the while, shockingly, church leadership kept records of the abuse and the cover-up. These documents, from the dioceses' own 'Secret Archives,' formed the backbone of this investigation," he said at a news conference in Harrisburg. Significantly, the report faulted Cardinal Donald Wuerl, the former longtime bishop of Pittsburgh who now leads the Washington archdiocese, for what it said was his part in the concealment of clergy sexual abuse. Wuerl, one of the highest-profile cardinals in the United States, released a statement Tuesday that said he had "acted with diligence, with concern for the victims and to prevent future acts of abuse." The grand jury scrutinized abuse allegations in dioceses that minister to more than half the state's 3.2 million Catholics. Its report echoed the findings of many earlier church investigations around the country in its description of widespread sexual abuse by clergy and church officials' concealment of it.

				Most of the victims were boys, but girls were abused, too, the report said. The abuse ranged from groping and masturbation to anal, oral and vaginal rape."Church officials routinely and purposefully described the abuse as horseplay and wrestling and inappropriate conduct. It was none of those things. It was child sexual abuse, including rape," Shapiro said. The panel concluded that a succession of Catholic bishops and other diocesan leaders tried to shield the church from bad publicity and financial liability by covering up abuse, failing to report accused clergy to police and discouraging victims from going to law enforcement.
Seguridad/Comunidad	Noticiero Univision	08/28/2018	2:41	Hurricane Maria killed far more people in Puerto Rico than initially thought, accounting for an estimated 2,975 deaths on the island from September 2017 through February 2018, according to a new analysis. The study found that those in low-income areas, and elderly men, were at greatest risk of dying. The independent analysis was commissioned by the governor of Puerto Rico and conducted by researchers at George Washington University's Milken Institute School of Public Health. CBS News obtained a report on the findings from Carlos Mercader, executive director of the Puerto Rico Federal Affairs Administration. To arrive at the 2,975 figure, the study looked at historical death patterns from 2010 to 2017 to estimate how many people would have died had Hurricane Maria not hit the island. That figure was then compared to the actual number of deaths from September 2017 through February 2018 - obtained in records provided by the Puerto Rico Vital Statistics Records division of the Puerto Rico Department of Health - to determine what the report describes as the "estimate of excess mortality due to the hurricane."The study found that while all age groups and social strata were affected by the hurricane, the risk of death was "45% higher and persistent until the end of the study period for populations living in low socioeconomic development municipalities." It also found that men age 65 and older were at heightened risk of death through February, the end of the study period.

State police have said they will not allow traffic to be blocked. The Reverend Gregory Livingston is leading the protest and said he doesn't want to be arrested but is prepared if that happens. "We do have some seasoned people who will volunteer to get arrested because that's our philosophy of peaceful protests, nonviolent direct action".

Seguridad/Comunidad	Noticiero Univision	09/14/2018	2:18	A year after Maria roared across the Caribbean, reporters for The Associated Press, the news site Quartz and Puerto Rico's Center for Investigative Journalism have put together the most detailed portrait yet of the agonizing final days of victims of the storm, interviewing 204 families of the dead and reviewing accounts of 283 more to tell the stories of heretofore anonymous victims. Trump cast doubt on the storm's widely accepted death toll Thursday, tweeting that "3000 people did not die" when Maria hit after a near-miss by Hurricane Irma in September, 2017. He said the death count had been inflated "by the Democrats in order to make me look as bad as possible," by adding unrelated deaths to the toll from causes like old age. But the joint investigation reflects how Puerto Rico's most vulnerable fell victim to dire conditions created by the storms.
