QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST
2nd QUARTER - 2020

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period April 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Climate Change/Health - 04/05/20 - IT - Interview with Jane Valez-Mitchell, New Day, New Chef TV Host, about her new show that deals with vegan recipes and lifestyle, and about the health ramifications of being vegan.

Economy/Environment - 04/05/20 - IT - Interview with Brad Kane, Former Legislative Counsel to Congressman Cardiss Collins, with a history of gerrymandering in the United States, and about the new populism movement in the country.

Health/Seniors - 04/05/20 - IT - Interview with Dr. Shebana Pasha, Cancer Researcher and Spokesperson, about the warning signs of colorectal cancer, and about new treatment options.

Coronavirus/Education - 04/12/20 - IT - Interview with Ravi Starzi, Congressional Adviser and CEO of Biopix, about a new website dedicated to information about Coronavirus, and about the need for even more health education in the country.

Health/Education - 04/12/20 - IT - Interview with Rob Paulsen, Voice Talent and Spokesman for Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Awareness, about his personal story of his battle with cancer, and about some early warning signs.

Health/Communication - 04/12/20 - IT - Interview with Gail McGovern, President and CEO of American Red Cross, about the need for more blood donations as they have slowed because of the Coronavirus, and about who is eligible to give.

Education/Big Government - 04/19/20 - IT - Interview with Chris Stewart, Education Activist and CEO of Brightbeam, about a new report on education in America, and about the need for more control for school boards.

Disabled Workers/Minimum Wage - 04/19/20 - IT - Interview with Clyde Terry, Member of National Council on Disability, about the low pay that many people with disabilities receive for work, as well as a call for national laws to help boost pay.

Crime/Technology - 04/19/20 - IT - Interview with Marc Levin, Vice President of Texas Public Policy Foundation's Right on Crime, about new ways that technology is aiding the criminal justice system, and about the need for expansion of communication systems for those who are incarcerated.

Climate Change/Conservation - 04/26/20 - IT - Interview with Thomas Kostigen, NY Times Journalist and Author, about innovative new products to help the environment, and about conservation efforts throughout the country.

Coronavirus/Unemployment - 04/26/20 - IT - Interview with Patrick Mullane, Executive Director of Harvard Business School Online, with tips on how individuals can keep their business skills honed during the coronavirus, and about how to re-design resumes.

Coronavirus/Consumerism - 04/26/20 - IT - Interview with Patty Morrissey, Chief Organizing Expert for Mercari, about how people can de-clutter their workspace and home, and about how to market household items for resale.

Fraud/Marijuana Legalization - 05/03/20 - IT - Interview with Sally Greenberg, Executive Director of The National Consumers League, about the growing problem of false claims regarding CBD products, and about the challenges of marijuana legalization.
