QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST
1st QUARTER - 2016

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period January 1, 2016 to March 31, 2016. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Taxes/Big Government - 01/03/16 - IT - Interview with Carter Dougherty, International Business Times Writer, about corporations who get tax breaks from foreign countries, and about efforts by the U.S. government to lower corporate tax rates.

Terrorism/Gun Control - 01/03/16 - IT - Interview with Dr. Thomas Ripaldi, Therapist and Counselor, about the targeting of Christians by terrorists, and about gun control.

Seniors/Health - 01/03/16 - IT - Interview with Pamela Wilson, Senior Care-giving Expert, with some tips for people who are senior care-givers, and about the ramifications of national healthcare.

Income Inequality/Minimum Wage - 01/10/16 - IT - Interview with Don Watkins, Author of "Equality is Unfair", about the growing issue of income inequality, and also about the minimum wage issue.

Youth/Health - 01/10/16 - IT - Interview with Dr. Barry Bartusiak, Dentist, about new tooth brushing products aimed at the whole family, and about how parents can get their kids to brush their teeth.

Health/Education - 01/10/16 - IT - Interview with Marjory Wildcraft, Founder of Grow Network, about the dangers of antibiotics, and also about some natural alternatives to drugs.

Transgender Rights/Big Government - 01/24/16 - IT - Interview with Gail Heriot, Professor of Law, University of San Diego, about the growing transgender

movement, and about the Department of Education's power in monitoring local school districts.

Economy/Consumerism – 01/24/16 – IT – Interview with Kathy Fettke, Co-Founder of Real Wealth Network, about the state of the economy, and also about the real estate market.

Substance Abuse/Peer Pressure – 01/24/16 – IT – Interview with Lynne Cockrum-Murphy, Intuitive Consultant, about tips for people who are suffering from the loss of a loved one, and about the need for good diet and exercise to enhance the process.

Corruption/Crime – 01/31/16 – IT – Interview with Michael McCray, Attorney and Public Interest Advocate, about the work of whistleblowers and how some have been mistreated, and about the growing incidences of corruption.

Sexual Abuse/Women – 01/31/16 – IT – Interview with Mary Francis Bowley, President and Founder of Wellspring Living, about the growing problem of human trafficking in the United States, and about the need for better rights for women.

Education/Consumerism – 01/31/16 – IT – Interview with Dr. Nanette Miner, Leadership Expert, about leadership skills that are needed for future corporate managers, and about the need for better communication.

Genocide/Poverty – 02/07/16 – IT – Interview with Weam Namou, Author of "Witnessing a Genocide", about persecution of Christians in the middle east and other parts of the world, and also about growing poverty.

Health/Youth – 02/07/16 – IT – Interview with Dr. James Rota, Holistic Dentist, about the dangers of mercury fillings, and about new alternatives.

Seniors/Health – 02/07/16 – IT – Interview with Jason Carroll, Sales Manager of HeymomHeydad.com, about new monitoring devices for seniors and youth, and about innovations that are being developed.

Economy/China – 02/14/16 – IT – Interview with Carter Dougherty, Senior International Economics Writer, International Business Times, about the growing economic crisis in China and how it affects the United States, and about what he feels they need to do to improve their economy.

Health/Women – 02/14/16 – IT – Interview with Dr. Dana Cohen, Heart Specialist, about the increasing heart disease problem that women are facing, and about the need for less stress in all people's lives.

Economy/Consumerism – 02/21/16 – IT – Interview with Dale Nabors, Vacation Home Expert, about the pros and cons of owning a vacation home, and about some of the hot areas for home purchases.

Education/Youth – 03/06/16 – IT – Interview with Mark Friedlander, Educator and Author, about the lack of science classes in school and how more emphasis needs to be put on it, and about the need for more opportunities for women.

Seniors/Communication – 03/06/16 – IT – Interview with Carol Core, Caregiver and Author, with tips for those who are senior caregivers, and about the need for better communication between family members.

Communication/Economy – 03/06/16 – IT – Interview with Lea Brovedani, Author of “Trusted: Secret Lessons”, about the need for trust in all business relationships, and about the need for businesses to retain current employees.

Health/Women – 03/13/16 – IT – Interview with Zoe Schlanger, Newsweek’s Science Reporter, about the social ramifications of the Zika virus in Latin America, and about the consequences in the United States.

Disaster Preparedness/Family Values – 03/13/16 – IT – Interview with Dr. Katherine Brown, Prof. of Anthropology at Colorado State University, about the lingering social effects of Hurricane Katrina on the minority population, and about how government officials need to change their tactics in dealing with emergencies.

Climate Change/Big Government – 03/13/16 – IT – Interview with Donn Dears, Spokesperson for Heartland Institute, about climate change and how the public has nothing to fear from it, and about big government programs.

Constitutional Law/Big Government – 03/27/16 – IT – Interview with Adam Winkler, Prof. of Constitutional Law at UCLA, about the Supreme Court vacancy, and also about the political influences both parties put on the situation.

Climate Change/Nuclear Power – 03/27/16 – IT – Interview with Dr. Michael Brannigan, Chair of Ethics and Moral Values, College of St. Rose, Albany, New York, about the aftermath of the Japanese nuclear disaster and storm that devastated parts of the country, and about the effects of climate change on the region.
