QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST  
1<sup>st</sup> QUARTER - 2022

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period January 1, 2022 to March 31, 2022. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Sexual Harassment/Women - 01/02/22 - IT - Interview with Megan McBride, DOD Report Contributor, about alleged sexual harassment at the Department of Defense and military installations, and about what needs to be done to correct the situation.

Entrepreneurship/Economy - 01/02/22 - IT - Interview with Hillary Abell, Co-Founder and Chief Policy Impact Officer at Project Equity, about the aim of Project Equity, and about the positive aspects of worker co-ops.

Youth/Obesity - 01/02/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Dan O'Neil, Sports Psychologist and Orthopedic Surgeon, about the importance of physical education for kids, and about the growing problem of obesity in the country.

Inflation/Economy - 01/09/22 - IT - Interview with Khalid Parekh, Founder and CEO of Fair Bank, with some tips for successful personal finances in 2022, and about growing inflation.

Communication/Social Media - 01/09/22 - IT - Interview with Elaine Park, Author and Researcher, about the dangers of clickbait on social media, and about why the country has become so polarized.

Climate Change/Pandemic - 01/09/22 - IT - Interview with Sarah Janssen, Editor of World Almanac and Book and Facts 2022, about some

of the extensive content, and about sections that deal with climate change and the pandemic.

Health/Youth - 01/16/22 - IT - Interview with Naturi Naughton, Actress and Spokesperson for Amer. Heart Assn., about the growing problem of high blood pressure in the population, and about steps people can take to lower problems.

Inflation/Consumerism - 01/16/22 - IT - Interview with Steven Semple, Business Consultant, about the growing concern of inflation, and about how buying habits are changing in America.

Economy/Supply Chain - 01/16/22 - IT - Interview with Rob Garrison, Founder and CEO of Mercado Labs, about what is going on with the supply chain, and about what needs to be done to fix the problem.

COVID/Health - 01/23/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Peter Hotez, Co-Director of Texas Children's Hospital, about a new vaccine for COVID that is much less expensive to produce, and about how it will be used in countries that have not been able to afford the other vaccines.

Family History/Health - 01/23/22 - IT - Interview with Julia Brewer, Former Educator and Author of 'No Names to be Given,' about the effects of personal DNA tests on family members, and about health information that adoptees need that can be obtained in the tests.

Pet Safety/Education - 01/23/22 - IT - Interview with Andrea Arden, Pet Expert and Author, about a study on the costs of owning a pet, and about why it is important for pets to be trained as young as possible.

Labor Laws/Unemployment - 01/30/22 - IT - Interview with Natasha Iskander, Assoc. Professor of Urban Planning at Wagner School of Public Service, about labor laws in Qatar and how some of the same policies are taking place in the United States, and about inequality.

Democracy/Communication - 01/30/22 - IT - Interview with Rhett Buttle, Founder of Public Private Strategies, about the importance of public/private business relationships, and about support for more federal voting rights laws.
