QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST
2nd QUARTER - 2019

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period April 1, 2019 to June 30, 2019. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Discrimination/Economy - 04/07/19 - IT - Interview with CW Brotherton, Author and Activist, about why President Trump's poll numbers have been going up regarding support for black voters, and about some history of the anti-slave movement.

Space Travel/Big Government - 04/07/19 - IT - Interview with Rod Pyle, Former NASA Employee and Author, about the present and future of NASA, and an update on the private company launch protocols.

Legal System/Communication - 04/07/19 - IT - Interview with Dr. Drury Sherrod, Jury Consultant and Author, about the pros and cons of the jury system, and about changes that he feels would make the system better.

Women/Economy - 04/14/19 - IT - Interview with Natalie Elisha, Attorney and Author, with some advice on how women can better manage their finances, and about the state of the economy.

Health/Consumerism - 04/14/19 - IT - Interview with Dr. Cass Ingram, Nutrition Physician, about natural healing remedies for the flu, and about the need for more health information for the public.

Youth/Education - 04/14/19 - IT - Interview with Brian Semling, Founder and CEO of Strictly Briks, about more scientific toys for kids, and about how girls are playing more with STEM toys.

Health/Stress - 04/21/19 - IT - Interview with Dr. Shola Ezeokoli, Physician and Author, about the growing problem of doctor burnout, and about potential new regulations regarding residency programs.

Environment/Education - 04/21/19 - IT - Interview with Samantha Simon, Senior Invasive Species Coordinator with U.S. Department of Agriculture, about the growing challenge of invasive pests, as well as some tips on how consumers can get rid of bugs.
