RADIO STATION KVNN-AM, VICTORIA, TEXAS QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST 1st QUARTER - 2020

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period January 1, 2020 to March 31, 2020. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Bail Reform/Crime – 01/05/20 – IT – Interview with Ken Good, Bail Attorney, about the growing bail reform movement, and about the crime rates throughout the United States.

Suicide/Depression - 01/05/20 - IT - Interview with Courtney Kittrell, Senior Petty Officer and Mental Health Advocate, about the growing suicide rate among veterans, and about depression and PTSD and how better treatments are needed.

Seniors/Suicide - 01/05/20 - IT - Interview with Bradley Metrock, CEO of Score Publishing, about several new functions that the Alexa app does, and about how seniors can better use the app.

Drug Abuse/Big Government – 01/12/20 – IT – Interview with Dr. Suhyun An, Clinical Director at Campbell Medical Group in Houston, about new treatments for pain including stem cells, and about government regulation of new drug protocols.

Economy/Property Density - 01/12/20 - IT - Interview with Debbie Bloyd, Mortgage Broker Specialist and CEO of DLB Mortgage, with some predictions for the real estate market in 2020, and about property density and how it affects the market.

Youth/Education - 01/12/20 - IT - Interview with Lyra Lee, Computer Programming Expert, about efforts to train kids to code for programming, and about how the techniques can also be used for adults.

Communication/Stress - 01/19/20 - IT - Interview with Joe McCormack, Entrepreneur and Author, about how people can reduce their dependence on technology devices, and about stress reduction.

Obesity/Education - 01/19/20 - IT - Interview with Dr. Erin Stokes, Medical Doctor, about ways to eliminate stress, and about the growing obesity problem in the United States.

Consumerism/Health - 01/19/20 - IT - Interview with Johnathan Stanley, Technical Director of Vanguard Communications, about medical reviews of doctors that appear online, and about how people can get relevant information on doctors.

Youth/Health - 01/26/20 - IT - Interview with Jimmy Murray, Founder of Ronald McDonald House, about the early days of the program that helps families when their kids are having medical treatments, and about the work of volunteers.

Taxes/Big Government - 01/26/20 - IT - Interview with Devin Fergus, Historian and Public Policy Expert, about the amount of fees that people pay as a destroyer of the middle class, as well as a historical perspective on how fees got started.

Obesity/Health - 01/26/20 - IT - Interview with Dr. Deepak Bhatt, Executive Director of Interventional Cardiovascular Programs at Brigham and Womens Hospital, about the increase of cardiovascular disease in the country, and about a new medication that has just been released.

U.S.-Iran Conflict/Big Government - 02/02/20 - IT - Interview with Tom Basile, Author, Commentator and Columnist, about tensions in the Middle East, and about the history of Iran making threats toward the United States.

Youth/Gangs - 02/02/20 - IT - Interview with Christopher Hall, African-American Doctor and Author, about the challenges he faced in becoming a doctor, and about the influence of gangs on the youth of America.

Women/Consumerism - 02/02/20 - IT - Interview with Brandon Roe, Host of "The Fashion Consumer", with some fashion trends in the country, and about why so many brands are having problems.

Unemployment/Economy - 02/09/20 - IT - Interview with Bruce Eberle, President and Founder of Eberle Communications, about a book he co-authored with Vernon Robinson that deals with growing support in the African American community toward Trump, and about the economy and unemployment.

Crime/Self Defense - 02/09/20 - IT - Interview with Allen Banks, CEO of Proactive Protection Agency, about the growing number of self-defense classes

that are taking place as a result of mass shootings in the country, as well as some tips for the public who may be in a shooting scenario.

Education/Youth - 02/16/20 - IT - Interview with Dr. Jay W. Lee, Family Physician, Amer. Academy of Family Physicians, about the dangers of vaping, as well as calling for more education programs to call attention to the growing problem.

Taxes/Economy - 02/16/20 - IT - Interview with Ramon Vasquez, Master Tax Adviser, H.R. Block, with the results of a survey on the public's thinking on tax refunds, and about new tax issues that will be on people's minds this year.

Health/Education – 02/23/20 – IT – Interview with Gary Weiner, President of The Sarcoma-Oma Foundation, with some pertinent information on Sarcoma, and about a funding program for patients of the disease.

Environment/Youth - 03/01/20 - IT - Interview with Gretchen Goldman, Research Director of Center for Science and Democracy, about efforts by the EPA to weaken environmental laws, and about the economic impact of lowering standards.

Health/Education – 03/01/20 – IT – Interview with Dr. Phillip Adamson, Medical Director at Abbott's Heart Failure Business, about the differences between heart failure and heart attacks, and about preventative measures.

Holocaust/Education - 03/01/20 - IT - Interview with Marty Brounstein, Holocaust Expert and Author, about how society has sometimes forgotten about the holocaust, and about moral responsibilities and ethics.

Health/Consumerism – 03/08/20 – IT – Interview with Chip Merlin, Founder and President of Merlin Law Group, about the growing problem of medical billing and insurance issues because of computers, as well as some tips for the public to fight insurance decisions.

Seniors/Crime - 03/08/20 - IT - Interview with Kathy Stokes, Director of Fraud Prevention Programs for AARP, about the latest phone scams that are plaguing the public, and about how consumers can better protect themselves.
