QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST  
2<sup>nd</sup> QUARTER - 2021

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period April 1, 2021 to June 30, 2021. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Health/Coronavirus - 04/04/21 - IT - Interview with Dr. Eduardo Sanchez, Chief Med. Officer for Amer. Heart Assn., with an update on COVID vaccinations but expressed dismay regarding totals in the Hispanic community, and about the need for better communication to minority communities.

Communication/Coronavirus - 04/04/21 - IT - Interview with Tim Koegel, Author of "The Exceptional Presenter Goes Virtual," with some tips on how to do virtual presentations, and about the importance of keeping Zoom programs shorter than most meetings.

Environment/Economy - 04/04/21 - IT - Interview with Gerald Celente, Publisher of Trends Journal, about new trends including green hydrogen, and about data mining.

Climate Change/Poverty - 04/11/21 - IT - Interview with Kevin Gillespie, Chef and Finalist on Top Chef, about some foods that are climate-friendly, and about food waste in the country.

Communication/Social Media - 04/11/21 - IT - Interview with Martin Avila, CEO of rightforge.com, about the need for more internet host sites, and about the importance of free speech.

Health/Veganism - 04/11/21 - IT - Interview with Gene Stone, Vegan and Author, about why veganism is important, and about environmental issues having to do with food.

Racism/Economy - 05/30/21 - IT - Interview with Brandolyn Barnett, Founder of Democratize Ventures, about why it is so hard for minorities to gain seats on Boards of Directors, and about the need for better communication between communities.
