QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST  
3<sup>RD</sup> QUARTER - 2022

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period July 1, 2022 to September 30, 2022. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:30am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Covid/Unemployment - 07/03/22 - IT - Interview with Terry McDonough, President, Education Technology Services, Strategic Education, with tips aimed at employers to help keep their employees, and about the effects of Covid on hiring.

Obesity/Health - 07/03/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Rehka Kumar, Chief Medical Officer at Found, about the growing problem of obesity in the country, and about the importance of personalized weight loss programs.

Education/Youth - 07/03/22 - IT - Interview with Erika Twani, Co-Founder of Learning One to One, about the relationship between a lack of education and crime, and about the need for more parental involvement in education of their children.

Racism/Communication - 07/10/22 - IT - Interview with Farzana Nayani, Business Coach, Int. Keynote Speaker, about the growing Asian discrimination problem in the country, and about the need for better communication between races.

Women/Economy - 07/10/22 - IT - Interview with Jeremy Hartman, Vice President of Venture Forward, about the growing number of entrepreneurs in the country, and about an online program that gives aid to entrepreneurs.

Environment/Energy Costs - 07/10/22 - IT - Interview with Daniel Brdar, CEO of Ideal Power, about new innovations for electric car chargers, and about growing energy costs.

Ukraine War/Communication - 07/17/22 - IT - Interview with Col. John Spencer, Professor, Combat Veteran, Expert on Urban Welfare, with an update on the war in Ukraine following his recent visit, and about how some aid from the United States should have been sent a couple of months ago.

Poverty/Drought - 07/17/22 - IT - Interview with George McGraw, Founder and CEO of Dig Deep, about the fact that over 2 million people in the United States don't have running water and indoor sewer facilities, and about efforts to get more people plumbing facilities.

Inflation/Refugee Aid - 07/17/22 - IT - Interview with Khalid Parekh, Founder and CEO of Fair Banking, about their efforts to get aid to Ukrainian and other refugees that have arrived in the United States, and about inflation.

War in Ukraine/Environment - 07/24/22 - IT - Interview with Diana Olebaum, Head of Foreign Policy for Friends Comm. For Legislation, with some suggestions on how to solve the war in Ukraine, and about environmental issues.

Climate Change/Military Preparedness - 07/24/22 - IT - Interview with Lt. General Norman Seip, National Security Expert, about the relationship between climate and national security, and about how the military is helping the environment with new procedures.

Seniors/Retirement - 07/24/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Ken Dychtwald, Founder and CEO of Age Wave, about the four stages of retirement, as well as some tips on how seniors can be better prepared for retirement.

Crime/Communication - 07/31/22 - IT - Interview with Doron Kempel, Chairman and CEO of Air Guardia, about the growing use of drones for the work of first responders, and about their prodigals for security.

Inflation/Consumerism - 07/31/22 - IT - Interview with Neil Wertheimer, AARP Bulletin Deputy Editor, with some tips aimed at consumers who want to fight inflation, and about how many of the 99 tips are available online.

Food Safety/Education - 07/31/22 - IT - Interview with Archie Magoulas, Member of USDA, about various summer food safety tips, and about how to find the freshest fish.

ADA Act/Health - 08/07/22 - IT - Interview with Regina Blye, Chief Program and Policy Officer, Christopher and Dana Reeve Foundation, about the changes that have occurred since the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act, and about actions that still need to be done to increase the access for those in need.

Economy/Inflation - 08/07/22 - IT - Interview with Mark Meadows, VP of Research and Development for National Retail Federation, about the need for congress to pass the Ocean Shipping Reform Act, and about issues like labor shortages and tariffs that are affecting the economy.

Communication/Education - 08/07/22 - IT - Interview with Connor Boyock, Educator and Researcher, about how American History is being taught in public schools, and about efforts to influence future educators on history ideals.

Technology/Consumerism - 08/14/22 - IT - Interview with Andrea Smith, Tech Expert, about the demise of 3G cell service, and about how consumers can upgrade their alarm systems to 4G.

Social Security/Inflation - 08/14/22 - IT - Interview with Les Winston, Charter Philanthropic Adviser, with some tips on how people can be less dependent on Social Security, and about growing inflation.

Health/Youth - 08/14/22 - IT - Interview with Kevin Chatham-Stephens, MD and Member of Public Health Service, with an update on childhood vaccinations, and about small side effects.

Health/Seniors - 08/21/22 - IT - Interview with Zane Burke, CEO of Quantum Health, about new virtual health procedures for patients that were developed during COVID lockdowns, and about the reactions from seniors on new procedures.

Environment/Communication - 08/21/22 - IT - Interview with Hoss Hasani, General Motors Vice President of EV Ecosystems, about a new app that is full of information on electric cars, and about the plusses of owning EV's.

Education/Youth - 08/21/22 - IT - Interview with Elisabeth Leamy, Journalist and Author, Former Good Morning America Correspondent, with some tips for parents and students on how to save money at colleges, and about how parents can negotiate with colleges for reductions in tuition.

Environment/Health - 08/28/22 - IT - Interview with Scott Wilson, CEO of Regenix, about the dangers of PFAS in water systems, and about natural ways to alleviate the problem by using carbon filters.

Pet Safety/Consumerism - 08/28/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Lori Teller, President of American Veterinary Medical Association, with some summer safety tips for pets, and about heatstroke that some animals can experience.

Climate Change/Health - 08/28/22 - IT - Interview with Kelly Willis, Managing Director of Strategic Initiatives at Malaria No More, about the growing problem of Malaria around the world and in the U.S., and about some solutions to the problem.

Inflation/Poverty - 09/04/22 - IT - Interview with Alonzo Plough, Chief Science Officer at Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, about how inflation specifically impacts minority communities, and about growing poverty.

Education/Mental Health - 09/04/22 - IT - Interview with Eliza Villanueva Beard, CEO of Teach for America, about how they help pay for educators to work in rural areas, and about the need for more mental health services in school.

Education/Volunteerism - 09/04/22 - IT - Interview with Ed Grohoski, Chief Marketing Officer, Junior Achievement USA, about the program that pairs mentors with students to enhance financial education, and about the need for more volunteers.

Poverty/Food Insecurity - 09/11/22 - IT - Interview with Brian Leake, Associate with Bayer Crop Science Division, about food insecurity in America, and about ways the companies are increasing crop yields with scientific breakthroughs.

Pet Safety/Consumerism - 09/11/22 - IT - Interview with Brian Moody, Executive Editor of Autotrader, with tips on how to keep pets safe in cars and trucks, and about auto shortages across the nation.

Food Addiction/Youth - 09/11/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Christopher Yadron, CEO of Wellbridge Addiction and Research, about the symptoms of food addiction, and about how parents can help their kids to overcome the problem.

Suicide/Depression - 09/18/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Laura Erickson-Scrote, Chief Medical Officer at the Jed Foundation, about the growing

problem of student depression and why depression is a growing concern.

Youth/Health - 09/18/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Flora Stay, Skin and Oral Care Expert about the dangers of some health products to children, and she identified questionable items, including deodorants and sunscreens.

Women/Consumerism - 09/18/22 - IT - Interview with Eliot Staples, Senior Vice President of Design, and Rochelle Johnson, Women's Dress Influencer, who announced the Welcome Everybody Campaign that highlights new dress items for plus-size women, and talked about marketing to those women.

Veterans/Suicide - 09/25/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Lisa Kearney, Executive Director of the Veterans Crisis Line, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, who defined the growing problem of veteran suicide, and identified new programs to help veterans and their families.

Education/Economy - 09/25/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Billy Hensley, President and CEO of the National Endowment for Financial Education, who described their efforts to improve financial education in schools, and reported on progress on the subject.

Health/Genetics - 09/25/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. German Hernandez, nephrologist, who spoke about PKD, a type of kidney disease, and discussed the role of genetics in diagnosis and treatment.
