QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST  
2<sup>nd</sup> QUARTER - 2022

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period April 1, 2022 to June 30, 2022. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

COVID/Economy - 04/03/22 - IT - Interview with Regina Herzlinger, Healthcare Innovation Expert, about the growing healthcare worker shortage, and about some ways the situation can be improved.

Communication/Unemployment - 04/03/22 - IT - Interview with David Shepherd, VP of Ivanti & Harold Sinnott, Technology Expert, about the future of workplaces, and about the need for advanced communication systems.

Health/Seniors - 04/03/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Michael Breus, Sleep Doctor and Clinical Psychologist, with some tips for the reduction of snoring, and about other daytime uses for overnight snoring prevention devices.

Taxes/Seniors - 04/10/22 - IT - Interview with Chris Orestis, President of Retirement Genius, about some tax opportunities and traps for seniors, and about why all taxpayers should hire professionals to prepare returns.

Seniors/Health - 04/10/22 - IT - Interview with Katherine Wilmon, Founder and CEO of Family Heart, and Dr. Mary McGowan, about genetic heart disease, and about symptoms that can affect patients.

Conservation/Youth - 04/10/22 - IT - Interview with Peter Gros, Co-Host of Mutual of Omaha's Wildlife Kingdom, about finding wildlife in backyards, and about how kids can be more involved with wildlife.

Education/Communication - 04/17/22 - IT - Interview with Barry Williams, Christopher Knight, Co-Hosts of The Real Brady Bros. Podcast, about the podcast that explores their experiences filming the Brady Bunch series, and about their education experiences while on set.

Big Government/Economy - 04/24/22 - IT - Interview with Isaac Stonefish, Researcher and Author, about the growing influence of China in world affairs, and about America's aid in growing China into a world power.

Youth/Crime - 04/24/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Katherine Secaida, Communications Ambassador for Popclub, about how the lives of children with incarcerated parents are affected, and about new outreaches to aid kids.

Seniors/Health - 04/24/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Francis Palmer, Certified Plastic Surgeon, about ways to fight aging, and about a new product that works to halt aging from the inside.

Drug Abuse/Crime - 05/01/22 - IT - Interview with Robert Mazur, Ex-Federal Agent and Author, about the proliferation of money laundering in the country, and about drug cartels.

Organ Donation/Seniors - 05/01/22 - IT - Interview with Frank Holloman, Director of Organ Transplant Division for Services Administration, Division of Transportation, about the shortage of available organs for transplant, and about the lack of donations from seniors.

Hunger/Global Politics - 05/29/22 - IT - Interview with Mark Lowcock, Former Under-Secretary of Humanitarian Affairs, about the growing problem of hunger in the world and the United States, and about some solutions to fight the problem.

COVID/Health - 05/29/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. Dan Werb, Author and Epidemiologist, about the research that went into the COVID vaccines, and about even newer technology for future diseases.

Youth/Education - 05/29/22 - IT - Interview with Cassidy Puckett, Assistant Professor of Sociology at Emory University, about how tech-savvy teens are developed, and about how developing goals at an early age makes it much easier for them to develop.

Climate Change/International Relations - 06/05/22 - IT - Interview with Dr. John Cobb, Environment Expert and Author, about climate change and why international cooperation with other countries is important, and about the relationship between China and the United States.

Defund Police/Communication - 06/05/22 - IT - Interview with Reverend Markel Hutchins, CEO of Movement Forward, about relations between police and the community, and about ways to improve dialogue with all community leaders.
