QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST
4th QUARTER - 2019

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period October 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Seniors/Health - 10/06/19 - IT - Interview with Mark Dunning, Founder of Care Planning Institute, about ways consumers can save money on senior care, and about how to find quality nursing homes.

Women/Depression - 10/06/19 - IT - Interview with Dr. Blair Green, Physical Therapist, about how women can decrease symptoms of post-partum blues, and about the need for planned exercise programs.

Food Safety/Health - 10/06/19 - IT - Interview with Maribel Alonzo, Technical Information Specialist with USDA, with some tips on cooking safely, and about the symptoms of food poisoning and the correct way to wash hands.

Education/Diversity - 10/13/19 - IT - Interview with Dr. Kimberly Underwood, Professor with Univ. of Phoenix Center for Workplace Diversity and Inclusion Research, about the growing shortage of teachers of color, as well as some solutions to the problem.

Women/Genetics - 10/13/19 - IT - Interview with Amy Byer-Shainman, Patient Advocate and Researcher, about family cancer syndrome, and about how genetics have a direct effect on some diseases.

Suicide/Youth - 10/13/19 - IT - Interview with Steve Simpson, Suicide Researcher and Author, about the growing problem of suicide, and about some of the symptoms that those who consider suicide have.

Prescription Costs/Health - 10/20/19 - IT - Interview with Leigh Purvis, Director of Health Services Research of AARP, about the results of a new survey of prescription prices in the United States, and about possible solutions.

Charitable Giving/Consumerism - 10/20/19 - IT - Interview with Gasby Brown, Founder and CEO of Have Faith Institute, with some tips on how the public can choose reputable charities, and about some websites that list good charities.

Unemployment/Economy - 10/20/19 - IT - Interview with Dr. Lerah Lee, Conservative Black Researcher, about the growing group of black conservatives in the country, and about gains that minorities have made in finding employment.

Bullying/Communication - 10/27/19 - IT - Interview with Jordan Goldrich, Executive Coach and Author of "Workplace Warrior," with tips on how employees can better handle bully bosses, and about how to improve personal communication.
