RADIO STATION KVNN-AM, VICTORIA, TEXAS QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST 1st QUARTER - 2017

Listed below are some of the significant issues responded to by Radio Station KVNN-AM, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period January 1, 2017 to March 31, 2017. The listing is by no means exhaustive or all-inclusive. These issues were in part ascertained through discussions with service-providers and general interaction of station staff with the community, and staff knowledge of the community and area occurrences. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any particular priority.

The following issues were principal topics or themes within the station's weekly public affairs program, "Issues Today" (IT), which is broadcast on Sunday Mornings at 7:00am. Each program has a normal running time (or length) in the range of 29 to 30 minutes. Each program is usually in two or three parts, each dealing with separate topics and issues.

Police Shootings/Civil Disobedience – 01/01/17 – IT – Interview with Joseph Marrone, Founder of Marrone Law Firm, about the growing controversy of police shootings, and about the rising tide of civil disobedience.

Education/Youth - 01/01/17 - IT - Interview with Scott MacDonald, Businessman and Author, about a new program that helps students with college debt, and about the need for more awareness of scholarship programs.

Taxes/Education – 01/01/17 – IT – Interview with Andy Phillips, Director of Tax Research for H&R Block, with some year-end tax tips, and about the complex tax code.

Healthcare – 01/08/17 – IT – Interview with Ty and Carole Moss, about the growing problem of antibiotic overuse.

Healthcare -01/08/17 – IT – Interview with Natasha Trenev, about false labeling of probiotics.

Commerce – 01/08/17 – IT – Interview with Justin Croxton, with some cyber marketing tips.

Disaster Preparedness/Food Safety – 01/15/17 – IT – Interview with Anthony Kovic, Winter Disaster Preparedness Expert, about how people can easily cope with winter disasters, and about food safety.

Education/Big Government - 01/29/17 - IT - Interview with Tom DeWeese, Education Expert and Author, about education reforms that need to be made, and about the problems of federal mandates on education.

Gun Control/Big Government – 01/29/17 – IT – Interview with Chris Bird, Gun Researcher and Commentator, about gun-free zones and how they help to control gun violence, and about the growing number of gun control laws.

Free Trade Agreements/Economy -01/29/17 – IT – Interview with Crista Huff, Stock Market Expert, with a projection on the future of fair trade agreements, and about the state of the economy.

Taxes/Fraud - 02/05/17 - IT - Interview with Abby Eisenkraft, Tax Expert and Author, about how people can stay off the IRS radar, and about the details of tax audits.

Youth/Family Relationships – 02/05/17 – IT – Interview with Pastor Nikki Canady, Co-Founder of Harvest Springs Ministries, about how people can avoid temptations in society, and about the importance of family relationships.
