**WICB-FM Programming Overview:** WICB is an FCC licensed noncommercial educational student-run radio station licensed to Ithaca College in Ithaca, New York. The station broadcasts community-oriented programming to Ithaca, Tompkins County and New York's Finger Lakes region on 91.7 FM, plus streams globally online at wicb.org. The station's programming is also available on the iHeart Radio and TuneIn Radio apps.

WICB is a modern rock formatted station and adds newly released songs weekly. The station's programming also features long-running weekly specialty music shows covering a variety of genres including jazz, folk, bluegrass, punk, blues, reggae, showtunes, hip-hop, rap, R&B and more. WICB broadcasts "Sonic Planet" Sunday afternoons from 4:00 – 6:00 PM highlighting different styles of music from around the world. Tuesday evenings from 8:00 – 10:00 PM, WICB broadcasts "Homebrew," a show highlighting music produced by local artists from Ithaca, Tompkins County, Central, Western and Upstate New York. Most episodes include a live instudio interview and performance from a local musician. WICB's programming also includes daily local news and sports coverage.

**Responsive Programs:** After identifying a collection of significant issues that are important to the local community (listed on the previous pages), WICB responded with the following programming and treatment:

<u>Newscasts</u>: Monday through Friday, WICB broadcasts a total of eighteen news reports each day. Eleven of the eighteen are produced by ABC News and cover world and national stories. The two-minute reports air at the following times (and are updated each hour):

6:16 AM, 7:16 AM, 8:16 AM, 9:16 AM, 12:16 PM, 1:16 PM, 2:16 PM, 3:16 PM, 4:16 PM, 5:16 PM and 6:16 PM.

WICB also produces and airs seven two-to-three-minute reports covering world, national, state and local news. During the academic year and when classes are in-session, the newscasts are written and delivered in-studio by Ithaca College student anchors at the following times:

6:46 AM, 7:46 AM, 8:46 AM, 12:46 PM, 3:46 PM, 4:46 PM and 5:46 PM.

During the college's academic breaks, morning newscasts are anchored by in-studio DJ's reading scripts prepared from Associated Press "Summary Briefs." Afternoon newscasts are written, anchored and produced remotely by members of WICB's news team. They are scheduled and programmed for broadcast remotely. Newscasts written, anchored and produced by WICB's news team place an emphasis on local, regional and New York State stories.

The ABC News and WICB produced newscasts follow the air schedule above 365 days a year, including during the college's academic semesters and breaks.

Ithaca College's Fall 2023 semester started on Wednesday, August 23, 2023 and concluded on Friday, December 15, 2023.

When applicable, newscasts include sound bites and quotes from newsmakers.

**Sportscasts:** During the academic year, Monday through Friday, WICB broadcasts a total of seven sports updates each day. The two-to-three-minute sportscasts place an emphasis on local and regional sports teams including Ithaca College, Cornell University, Syracuse University and Ithaca High School, while also noting national sports news and scores as well. The updates are written and delivered by Ithaca College student anchors.

During the academic year and when classes are in-session, the sportscasts air at the following times: 6:46 AM, 7:46 AM, 8:46 AM, 12:46 PM, 3:46 PM, 4:46 PM and 5:46 PM

When applicable, sportscasts include sound bites and quotes from newsmakers.

Ithaca College's Fall 2023 semester started on Wednesday, August 23, 2023 and concluded on Friday, December 15, 2023. Full daily sportscasts written and anchored by student members of the WICB Sports Department aired during the Fall 2023 academic semester.

<u>Weather:</u> During regular programming, with only a few exceptions during specialty and overnight shows, two local weather forecasts are broadcast each hour, 24-hours per day. The forecasts include current weather conditions, temperature and a brief summary of what's expected in the coming days. WICB receives weather information from the National Weather Service (weather.gov).

Note, weather forecasts are also included in the student anchored newscasts Monday through Friday. See above for the weekly airtimes.

<u>News Programming</u>: During the academic school year (September – December, February – May), WICB's News Department produces a 30- minute weekly news magazine program called *Ithaca Now*. It covers local news stories and issues through packages, dialogue, discussion and interviews. It airs each Sunday at 7:00 PM.

Over the course of the year, Ithaca Now expands a few times to a longer length for special episodes and coverage.

Each episode of Ithaca Now starts with segments providing local updates and important information about what's happening in Ithaca, Tompkins County and the surrounding towns focusing on community events, breaking news and politics. The "Community Beat" segment is produced in an effort to inform local residents and listeners and provide a brief news rundown.

During the academic school year, a weekday version of the show also airs <u>most</u> Tuesdays and Thursdays at 7:45 PM. The ten-to-fifteen-minute show features stories and information from the previous weekend's program, as well as updates on local breaking and developing stories.

<u>Election Night Coverage:</u> On Tuesday, December 7, 2023, between 10:00 PM – Midnight, WICB's News Department broadcast three newscasts including local election results and updates. The three-to-four-minute newscasts were written and anchored by Ithaca College students. They aired at the following times: 10:46 PM, 11:16 PM and 11:46 PM.

Below is an example of one of the election night newscasts (anchored by WICB Station Manager Bec Legato at 10:46 PM): "Robert Cantelmo is currently in the lead for the mayoral elections with counting reaching the final stretch. Good evening, for WICB News, I'm Bec Legato. Cantelmo, the Democratic candidate for Mayor of Ithaca is in the lead for the election with a total vote of 3,119 votes counted so far, that's 89% of the votes counted. 336 of those votes were for Janis Kelly, his Republican opponent. The two were on the ballot to take on the spot of Laura Lewis, the Democratic incumbent who announced that she would not pursue a second term. Cantelmo had received a notable endorsement from Governor Kathy Hochul and stepped down from his position as fifth ward common council member to pursue the mayoral position. Janis Kelly focused on bringing forward the rebirth of the Republican party, hoping to add the party to the ranks of city politics. On the New York State level, Cheryl Insinga has just passed Deirdre Hay in the sixth district judicial elections with total votes currently at 46,328 to 46,165. This district includes Tompkins County, alongside Broome, Chemung, Chenango, Cortland, Delaware, Madison, Otsego, Schuyler and Tioga counties. This vacancy arose following the retirement of Broome County based state supreme court justice Jeffrey Tate. Insinga received an endorsement from Broome County Republican Chair Benji Federman, while Hay has received support from Linda Hoffman, the Chair of the Tompkins County Democratic Committee, as well as Emily Adams, a prominent figure in the local Democratic circles and a campaign coordinator for Hay. Looking at the Ithaca Common Council elections, in Ward 1, Kayla Matos for the fouryear term is currently leading Cynthia Brock 761 votes to 652 votes. For the two-year term, Phoebe Brown is currently leading Zachary Winn with 84% versus his 15% currently. In Ward 2, Ducson Nguyen is going unopposed with 99% of the vote currently. With a two-year term, Kris Haines-Sharp is also running unopposed at 99% of the vote. In Ward 3, the four-year term, David Shapiro currently has 95% of the vote, while in the two-year Ward 3, Pierre Saint-Perez currently has 68% of the vote versus his opponent Pat Sewell at 32% of that vote. Ward 4, the four-year term, Jorge DeFendini is currently at 84% of the vote unopposed, while for the twoyear term, Tiffany Kumar is unopposed with 100% of the vote counted so far. Finally in Ward 5, the four-year term, Margaret .J Fabrizio currently has 84% of the vote versus Michelle Song with 15% of the vote and looking at the two-year position for Ward 5, Jason Houghton has 68% of the vote, while Clyde Lederman has 31% of the vote. This is the update so far. More to come in the next hour. For WICB News, I'm Bec Legato."
