Responsive Programs: After identifying a collection of significant issues that are important to the local community (listed on the previous two pages), WICB responded with the following programming and treatment:

<u>Newscasts</u>: Monday through Friday, WICB broadcasts a total of eighteen news reports each day. Eleven of the eighteen are produced by ABC News and cover world and national stories. The two-minute reports air at the following times (and are updated each hour):

6:16 AM, 7:16 AM, 8:16 AM, 9:16 AM, 12:16 PM, 1:16 PM, 2:16 PM, 3:16 PM, 4:16 PM, 5:16 PM and 6:16 PM.

WICB also produces and airs seven two-to-three-minute reports covering world, national, state and local news. During the academic year and when classes are in-session, the newscasts are written and delivered in-studio by Ithaca College student anchors at the following times:

6:46 AM, 7:46 AM, 8:46 AM, 12:46 PM, 3:46 PM, 4:46 PM and 5:46 PM.

During the college's academic breaks, morning newscasts are anchored by in-studio DJ's reading scripts prepared from Associated Press "Summary Briefs." Afternoon newscasts are written, anchored and produced remotely by members of WICB's news team. They are scheduled and programmed for broadcast remotely. Newscasts written, anchored and produced by WICB's news team place an emphasis on local, regional and New York State stories.

The following academic breaks occurred during the Second Broadcast Quarter of 2023:

Summer Break: Saturday, May 13, 2023 – Tuesday, August 22, 2023

The ABC News and WICB produced newscasts follow the air schedule above 365 days a year, including during the college's academic semesters and breaks.

When applicable, newscasts include sound bites and quotes from newsmakers.

Sportscasts: During the academic year, Monday through Friday, WICB broadcasts a total of seven sports updates each day. The two-to-three-minute sportscasts place an emphasis on local and regional sports teams including Ithaca College, Cornell University, Syracuse University and Ithaca High School, while also noting national sports news and scores as well. The updates are written and delivered by Ithaca College student anchors.

During the academic year and when classes are in-session, the sportscasts air at the following times: 6:46 AM, 7:46 AM, 8:46 AM, 12:46 PM, 3:46 PM, 4:46 PM and 5:46 PM

When applicable, sportscasts include sound bites and quotes from newsmakers.

Full sportscasts did not air during Ithaca College's summer break on the following dates:

Saturday, May 13, 2023 – Tuesday, August 22, 2023

• Please note, sports stories are included at the end of newscasts when possible during academic breaks. Stories are researched and received from Associated Press sports "Summary Briefs."

<u>Weather:</u> During regular programming, with only a few exceptions during specialty and overnight shows, two local weather forecasts are broadcast each hour, 24-hours per day. The forecasts include current weather conditions, temperature and a brief summary of what's expected in the coming days. WICB receives weather information from the National Weather Service (weather.gov).

Note, weather forecasts are also included in the student anchored newscasts Monday through Friday. See above for the weekly air times.

<u>News Programming</u>: During the academic school year (September – December, February – May), WICB's News Department produces a 30-to-60-minute weekly news magazine program called *Ithaca Now*. It covers local news stories and issues through packages, dialogue, discussion and interviews. It airs each Sunday at 7:00 PM.

Each episode of Ithaca Now includes "Community Beat" and "Politics Beat" segments. The twoto-three-minute segments air during the early part of the episode and provide local updates and important information about what's happening in Ithaca, Tompkins County and the surrounding towns. They are produced in an effort to inform local residents and listeners and provide a brief news rundown.

During the academic school year, a weekday version of the show also airs <u>most</u> Tuesdays and Thursdays at 7:45 PM. The ten-to-fifteen-minute show features stories and information from the previous weekend's program, as well as updates on local breaking and developing stories.

The final Ithaca Now episode of the Spring 2023 semester aired on Sunday, May 7, 2023 and was a "Best of" episode, highlighting a collection of stand-out stories and interviews that previously aired during the spring semester.

During the Second Broadcast Quarter of 2023, Ithaca Now / WICB News programming aired on the following dates and included the following stories and topics of community interest:

Sunday, April 2, 2023

• Hosted by WICB News Director George Christopher, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included information about the latest police reform recommendations (for the City of Ithaca, New York) presented by the Reimaging Public Safety Special Committee, plus a clip from episode seven of HAYA ("How Are You, Actually?"), WICB's mental health podcast. This podcast episode focuses on the unique mental health challenges faced by foreign college students. The episode started with the Community Beat segment hosted

by Sarah Payne and Liam McDermott, along with the Politics Beat segment hosted by George Christopher. Total Airtime: 21-minutes, 26-seconds.

Tuesday, April 4, 2023 & Thursday, April 6, 2023

• Hosted and produced by Liam McDermott, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included updates on developing community stories and the re-air of packages and interviews from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 3, 2023). Total Airtime: 15-minutes, 47-seconds.

Sunday, April 9, 2023

• Hosted by Himadri Seth, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included detailed coverage of the Ithaca Common Council's approval of the Public Safety Special Committee's latest police reform recommendations (for the City of Ithaca, New York). The episode started with the Community Beat segment hosted by Caroline Grass and Joshua Pantano, along with the Politics Beat segment hosted by Liam McDermott. Total Airtime: 23-minutes, 51-seconds.

Tuesday, April 11, 2023 & Thursday, April 13, 2023

• Hosted and produced by Liam McDermott, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included updates on developing community stories and the re-air of packages and interviews from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 9, 2023). Total Airtime: 17-minutes, 58-seconds.

Sunday, April 16, 2023

• Hosted by Sarah Payne, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included an interview with Ithaca Common Council's Jorge DeFendini (4th Ward Alderperson). During the conversation, Defendini discussed Ithaca Solidarity Slate's candidates in the upcoming local elections. The episode started with the Community Beat segment hosted by Sarah Payne and Liam McDermott, along with the Politics Beat segment hosted by George Christopher. Total Airtime: 36-minutes, 59-seconds.

Sunday, April 23, 2023

• Hosted by Liam MdcDermott, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included a detailed look at the history of the Comic Book Club of Ithaca, the oldest active comic book fan club in the United States. The Comic Book Club of Ithaca hosted the 46th annual Ithacon on Saturday, April 22nd and Sunday, April 23rd on the Ithaca College campus. The episode started with the Community Beat segment hosted by Blake Matthews and George Christopher, along with the Politics Beat segment hosted by Sarah Payne. Total Airtime: 22-minutes.

Tuesday, April 25, 2023 & Thursday, April 27, 2023

• Hosted and produced by Liam McDermott, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included updates on developing community stories and the re-air of packages and interviews from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 23, 2023). Total Airtime: 14-minutes, 8-seconds.

Sunday, April 30, 2023

• Hosted by Liam McDermott, this episode of *Ithaca Now* included stories about Cornell University's Lab of Ornithology and summer safety tips for Ithaca residents. The episode also featured a clip from episode eight of HAYA ("How Are You, Actually?"), WICB's mental health podcast. The episode started with the Community Beat segment hosted by Blake Matthews and the Politics Beat segment hosted by George Christopher. Total Airtime: 41-minutes, 43-seconds.

Tuesday, May 2, 2023 & Thursday, May 4, 2023

• Hosted and produced by Liam McDermott, this episode of *Weekday Ithaca Now* included updates on developing community stories and the re-air of packages and interviews from the previous Sunday's full episode (Sunday, April 30, 2023). Total Airtime: 19-minutes, 10-seconds.

Sunday, May 7, 2023

• Hosted by George Christopher, this "Best of *Ithaca Now*" episode featured the re-air of stand-out stories, packages and interviews from the Spring 2023 semester. This included updates on the Ithaca Common Council's approval of the latest version of the Public Safety Special Committee's police reform recommendations (for the City of Ithaca, New York), plus stories about Cornell University's Lab of Ornithology and the Seneca Meadows Landfill and its environmental impacts in Seneca Falls, New York. Total Airtime: 52-minutes.

Sports Programming: During the academic school year, WICB's Sports Department produces a 25-to-30-minute weekly sports magazine program called *Ithaca Sports Talk*. It features several long form interviews with athletes and coaches from the following local Tompkins County sports teams: Ithaca College Bombers, Cornell University Big Red, Tompkins Cortland Community College Panthers, Ithaca High Little Red, Trumansburg Blue Raiders and Lansing Bobcats. The show also includes scores, recaps and analysis. Ithaca Sports Talk airs each Sunday at 6:30 PM.

The final Ithaca Sports Talk episode of the Spring 2023 semester aired on Sunday, May 7, 2023 and was a "Best of" episode, highlighting a collection of stand-out stories and interviews that previously aired during the spring semester.

This included conversations with Ithaca College student-athletes Taylor Crain (Women's Tennis) and Garrett Callaghan (Baseball), plus interviews with athletes and sports media personalities from WICB's trip to Super Bowl LVII Radio Row in Phoenix, Arizona. Total Airtime: 29-minutes, 8-seconds.

WICB's Weekend Concert Connection: Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 8:30 AM, 1:30 PM and 5:30 PM, WICB airs its locally produced "Weekend Concert Connection." The brief promo, which runs between 45 and 90-seconds, lists and previews music concerts and shows taking place in Ithaca and Central New York scheduled for the upcoming weekend. WICB's Weekend Concert Connection is written, produced and voiced weekly by the station's Production Director. A different spot is produced for each day it airs.

• Please note, WICB stopped airing Weekend Concert Connection at the end of Ithaca's Spring 2023 semester (in mid-May). The Weekend Concert Connection aired during April 2023.

<u>Public Service Announcements – "Produced"</u>: A collection of produced (pre-recorded) public service announcements broadcast each day of the week, airing once per hour. They are generally between 30-and-40 seconds in length and broadcast about 16-minutes past the top of the hour.
