Quarterly Issues 2015

First Quarter

January 1

January 2 We covered news stories out of Florida and North Carolina that detailed how once a federal judge overturns a State's marriage amendment, clerks and judges can be fired for discrimination. We gave several examples of this in contrasting religious rights and the new tolerance. Several counties in Florida have ceased issuing marriage licenses only to protect themselves from losing their jobs if they have moral objections to homosexual unions.

January 5 We featured Family Talk, a thirty minute show at 930am. They discussed relationships, specifically how to work with in-laws, setting boundaries, and developing a good relationship for the new year.

January 6 We have an arctic blast of cold air moving into the southeast. Last year when this happened, hundreds of millions of dollars of damage was done, just by burst water pipes. We ran down a list of helpful tips to protecting property and lives twenty-four hours ahead of the extreme weather.

January 7 At 4:40, for 5 minutes, we addressed listeners' comments about the disparity between the U. S. Bureau of Economic Analysis that consumer spending is up as a sign of economic growth yet, the money was going into the healthcare system, according to the same report. So not economic growth, but wealth transfer as middle class Americans paid \$140 billion dollars into the healthcare system. Our listeners continue to have grave concerns about the state of our economy

January 8 The Atlanta fire chief was fired from his job. We reported on this because of the first amendment violation of freedom of religion. He was fired for a book he wrote that contained a condemnation of homosexuality. He is seeking legal defense for a EEOC violation at this time.

January 9 We are having arctic air bringing extreme temperatures to our area. We discussed at 5:20 with State Fire Marshall Bert Polk safety measures for supplemental heating and portable heaters.

January 12 We continued coverage of a first amendment issue regarding where the city of Houston issued subpoenas for sermons. At 520 for four minutes we reported on how the mayor now contends the pastors have no right to a jury trial and wants a hand picked special master to review the evidence. We will continue updates.

January 13 We reported on an associated news story about a school in Alabama who wants to stockpile canned foods for students to hurl at possible intruders for defense. If at the end of the year, there was no security risk, the food items would be donated. Our listeners sounded off on the ludicrous notion of security, while mocking the rules where a student would be expelled for pointing a finger and saying bang. Several minutes this afternoon we dedicated to real solutions to school security.

January 14 We featured a health segment at 420 for 6 minutes of the benefits of magnesium to blood sugar levels, blood pressure, and energy. We covered the problems associated with a deficiency as we age, and the best food sources and supplement types.

January 15 Now that we are in the beginning of tax season, we took four minutes at 440pm to talk about the increases in penalties and fines for not having health coverage and the options to obtaining it.

January 16 A book is coming out next week by Allen Kurzweil who was bullied over 40 years ago. He tracked the bully down, who is now serving in prison. This made for discussion about the topic of bullying as well as how to address it, even if it continues into adulthood.

January 19 Last week, an Alabama driver was cited in Atlanta/Marietta with a ticket for eating while driving. We discussed at 420 pm for four minutes this law that many of our listeners were unaware of. We discussed safety and distracted driving in this context.

January 20 The states in our listening area have had their constitutions overturned by judges in the past 12 months legalizing gay marriage. We discussed at 540 for 5 minutes the two questions in context of the 14th amendment the Supreme Court is going to take up in March or April. We also discussed how two of the justices have performed ceremonies that could question their impartiality.

January 21 Cited the Wallet Hub report as part of the national Tobacco-Free awareness week at 520 for 3 minutes. Showed how a pack a day will cost over \$100,000 not counting health care issues and if that money had been invested. We encouraged listeners to take the challenge to quit and put some of that money towards the future.

January 22 On the somber anniversary of Roe V. Wade, we discussed Margaret Sangers' intention to cull the pool of inferior races. We tied that into today's mantra of Black lives Matter and cited the numbers that expose abortion as the greatest danger to black children. We challenged listeners to become active in saving lives. 510 for 5 minutes.

January 23 We discussed the tax swap that was put forth in the South Carolina State of the Union address at 510 for five minutes. The proposal is to lower property tax over 10 years and increase the gas tax during the same period. Although it would lower taxes for

home owners, it would provide the money for road maintenance. We discussed the pros and cons.

January 26 Brought up Freedom of Religion issues and how the current concept of tolerance in the context of a Christian School being shut down and another under scrutiny after investigators quizzed random students and found them to have discriminatory views of other people who have different faiths, values, or beliefs from themselves. Spoke at 5:05 for 4 minutes.

January 27 Reported on the current political state in context of Religious Freedom. Bill de Blasio campaigned, promising to reverse city policy that prohibited churches from renting public schools for worship. Now that he is elected, he has reversed his stance and filed a brief in opposition. This ideology is contrary to what our Bill of Rights had in mind.

January 28 Interviewed Gerald Stephens at 505 for 12 minutes on protecting trees and shrubs from insects, and how to pre-treat now before Spring.

January 29 At 440pm for 4 minutes, cited the findings of Mexican Sociologist, Fernando Pliego from the U. of Mexico on his multi year study from 5 continents that concluded that intact families as defined by one man and one woman produced a higher level of well-being than other family types. This is massive scientific research that supports biblical thinking, and should influence faulty judicial overturns to our state constitutions.

January 30 In our news coverage of the measles outbreak, we spoke with The Center for Disease Control, and they have determined the outbreak is a result of an illegal immigrant or foreign visitor. This contradicts the news that has blamed parents who failed to vaccinate their children.

February 2 At 510pm for seven minutes, we carried an exerpt from Love Worth Finding that outlined a method to help people with problems of infidelity. The speaker quickly presented a plan to help listeners remain faithful to meaningful relationships in order to protect them from common, destructive patterns.

Feb 3 At 410 for 4 minutes, we listed 4 parenting tips for an adult child who has made poor choices. We cited Focus on the Family, and offered resources for parents to seek more information.

Feb 4 Updated listeners on a First Amendment issue out of Houston, Tx. We have been following the story for months, and at 510 for 3 minutes we explained the city's defense from the court transcript that said the voice of the voters was overturned because of flawed form that by association meant all the signatures were invalid.

Feb 5 Interviewed Dr. Ben Scripture at 410 for 7 minutes. We discussed relationships and marriage and how blame shifting creates problems as opposed to correcting them. He discussed solutions and alternatives to help strengthen relationships.

Feb 6 Interviewed Gerry Caillouet about a conference he is conducting that deals with recreation, outdoors, and bringing people together for various causes. He is speaking in several of our markets throughout the southeast this month. 405pm for 13 minutes.

Feb 9 At 405 for 4 minutes, we carried a report from the U.K. Telegraph that states the global warming scare that has been working for 30 years is politically motivated and compromised data to support the idea. This affects everyone's understanding of carbon taxes, politics, and science.

Feb 10 Shared a report at 420 for two minutes about the new smart TV. The Daily Beast is saying the TV records everything said in a room through voice controls, uses the internet to record, understand, and answer if necessary, all the while sharing the information with a third party. The invasion of privacy is the huge issue for anyone who would want this technology.

Feb 11 Promoted the event calendar. We highlighted several events throughout our vast coverage area at 440 for four minutes and explained how other non-profits can access our free public service announcements and website.

Feb 12 Reported on the SC house vote to ban abortions at 20 weeks. Current law enables abortion up to 24 weeks, so this law, if passed by the SC senate would back up legal abortions into the second trimester.

Feb 13 The United States is having a bitterly cold winter, with the Northeast experiencing 4 major snow storms in 3 weeks. We discussed the rising costs of energy, and electric bills in context of the rise of regulation. The EPA has increasingly punished coal power, forcing energy companies to revamp coal plants or shut down. The costs associated with these regulations have caused electric bills to skyrocket. The costs are passed down to the consumer, and it is creating huge hardship.

Feb 16 We discussed a freedom of religion issue regarding immigration and the expanse of Muslims into Europe and America. There have been multiple killings of Jews in France, Denmark, and England, so Israel is encouraging Jews to return to Israel. This is not a good economic swap...Jews produce more for an economy than Muslims. The European leaders have reacted with assurances that Jews will be safe. Many countries are afraid of the implications of Sharia law.

Feb 17 Reported on the federal judge who has temporarily blocked the President's executive action on immigration. This gives 26 states, including those in our listening area time to pursue a lawsuit that intends to permanently stop the orders. This act of

amnesty has huge implications for jobs and elections, and impacts our listeners very personally.

Feb 18 In light of the threat of terrorism, we discussed the summit taking place, where our leaders have determined that terrorists commit atrocities because they don't have jobs. Several listeners have communicated their anxiety that our country is so befuddled by multiculturalism and political correctness, that it has made our leaders unwise and adrift regarding foreign policy. We cited several studies that debunked the jobs for jihad program at 420 for 4 minutes.

Feb 19 Promoted our event calendar, and we explained to our listeners how to utilize our free public service announcements. Everytime we do this, folks respond with announcements.

Feb 20 Interviewed Jean Swann at 505 for 12 minutes about a seminar on how to start a non-profit recreational outreach for people, how to build community, and give folks experience at the various activities.

Feb 23Updated listeners at 510 for 3 minutes on the freedom of religion issue where the florist was sued by the state for refusing to provide flowers for a same sex marriage. She was found guilty, and the state threatened to take her business, home, and savings before offering her a \$2,000 fine provided she provide services for same-sex marriages. Her response to the attorney general stated that he not only did not understand her but also the problem. It's about freedom not money. She rejected the offer.

Feb 24 Carried the 25 minute call in show How to Manage Your Money so our listeners could call and ask financial advice for budgets, debt, credit, and investing.

Feb 25 With all the discussion and pending court decisions regarding marriage, several listeners have contacted us, asking about traditional marriage. At 420 for 4 minutes, we discussed how it is the bedrock of civilization. It binds fathers to mothers to create stable foundations for families, which continue to produce the next generation. They are primarily responsible for bringing the members up to honorable adulthood. Without marriages civilization would collapse and the human species would become endangered. By contrast, if 20% of America's marriages ended tomorrow, it would be social catastrophe...if, 100% of homosexuals resolved to live solitary and celibate, it would have no impact on the family or next generation. Children are a huge element of the plan of traditional marriage.

Feb 26 In continuation of yesterday's discussion, at 420 for 3 minutes, we cited a survey released yesterday by the WPA Opinion Research, that 81% of Americans believe government should leave people free to follow their beliefs about marriage as they live

their daily lives at work and in the way they run their businesses. 53% agree marriage should be defined only as the union of one man and one woman.

Feb 27 Reported on a Freedom of Religion issue at 440 for 3 minutes as First amendment rights continue to clash in our country. A Pro-homosexual city commissioner in Florida is requiring churches to obtain business licenses and demanding fees for violations. This is a disturbing challenge to the Free Exercise Clause.

March 2 Many of our listeners continue to comment on their concerns about our porous border security and the influx of illegal immigration. Befuddled as to why our existing laws cannot curb the rush, Democrat Congressman, Kurt Schrader, of Oregon explained this weekend at the Immigration Day Action event that his party is intentionally turning a blind eye to the issue because they believe these illegal aliens will decide in their favor who gets to control the remainder of the 21st century, politically speaking. There are many employment, and criminal issues at stake for all our listening communities, and people are concerned about the disregard for the rule of law.

March 3 In response to one of our listener's questions, we interviewed Gerald Stephens with Nurseries Caroliniana about Mimosa Weed. That and other "winter" weeds are in strong force this time of year, and he explained how to treat them and attempt to eradicate them from our yards.

March 4 Discussed the latest research on the Mediterranean diet and how effective it is on reducing heart disease. Spoke at 540 for 4 minutes, and gave research information as well as an overview of the foods in the diet.

March 5 Updated Alabama's response to homosexual marriage. The state Supreme Court ordered county probate judges to uphold the state ban, negating the Federal district court ruling.

March 6 Carried the 30 minute show Family Talk at 930. They discussed ways to improve homelife for both the parents and the children.

March 9 Daylight savings time went into effect over the weekend. At 420 for 3 minutes, we discussed the benefits of naps and cited the National Sleep Foundation.

March 10 Carried a story at 440 for 3 minutes about how Great Britain wants all homes to have a home camera system that is accessible to a central database. Since they do not allow gun ownership, they want to be able to identify the criminals. This has raised concern over privacy, furthermore, it has alerted Americans of the continued direction of 24 hour surveillance and the loss of personal freedom. March 11 At 420 for 4 minutes, we discussed a case in South Carolina where a career chaplain with the Marine Corps is being fired for holding traditional views on marriage. He has been released from his duties and his pension will be lost because he does not adhere to same sex "marriage". This issue has become politicized, and we discussed the implications of this with various agencies for Christians.

March 12 At 440 for 3 minutes we reported on an education bill that would allow more than one scientific approach to origins science. The bill was rejected by evolutionists, who ironically introduced similar legislation 100 years ago, and it was accepted then. We discussed how all this science is impacted by worldview.

March 13 Discussed the foundation of freedom in the context of a group of six students who wanted to remove the United States Flag at University of California, Irvine. They said it represented oppression, violence, and colonialism that made illegal immigrant students feel threatened. The backlash was quick, but several professors defended them. We discussed for four minutes at 505 how if we remove the foundation of our freedom, we will be left with no freedom.

March 16 Discussed a World Magazine article about a man with Dyslexia who developed a new font "Dyslexie", that helps people with dyslexia improve their reading, exponentially. We told folks where to go to download the font for free, and how to convert other types and fonts to this one to improve reading.

March 17 Interviewed Frank Ulle at 505pm for 8 minutes. He has written about how to become a peacemaker rather than a peace keeper. He discussed the pros and cons, and how it helps free people from conflict.

March 18 Announced several PSA's and explained to the audience how they could access our airwaves and website for free Public Service Announcements.

March 19 Following up on the Israel elections this week. The U.S. President is taking unprecedented action in recognizing the Palestinian state and attempting to isolate Israel at the United Nations. We discussed this shift in policy against our ally and only democratic nation in the middle east, and how that impacts this country and our foreign policy.

March 20 At 440 reported on a World Magazine story on Technology and will today's digital technology be supported and readable in the future. We related this to how to store pictures, documents and other information to help preserve records and history.

March 23 Carried the 25 minute call in show, Money Wise at 6pm for our listeners to call, interact, and gain information about their finances.

March 24 Carried a U.S. Department of Education report that indicates black families are choosing to homeschool their children by ever increasing numbers. It has increased by 127% in the past two years, and black families have found that traditional school is not serving their children, leaving them at a disadvantage. They are choosing homeschooling to ensure their children receive the best education.

March 25 In a follow up on a previous story we carried, The U.S. Navy chaplain in the Charleston area has been denied a religious accommodation request. After 19 years of honorable service, a homosexual man has levied charges of discrimination. The Liberty Institute is providing legal assistance in appealing this affront to religious freedom.

March 26 Carried a story covering the decline of the Presbyterian USA denomination where a minister says he doesn't believe in God, doesn't require his members to believe either, but is offended by those who assert he is not a Christian. We discussed the deterioration of language, the deconstruction of our culture, the illogical notions of people who reject absolutes, and the impossibility of a belief-less Christianity. We discussed how poor ideas are dumbing down our society and how to reverse it.

March 27 Reported on the Republican passed balanced-budget plan that came through this morning. It shrinks spending by \$5 trillion without raising taxes. It is expected that the President will veto this, because his plan calls for raising taxes by \$2 trillion. The federal spending has greatly jeopardized our nation's economic stability and the future of our republic.

March 30 Reported on the latest findings from the American Psychological Institute on homework at 440 for 3 minutes. Their report is that adolescents should only have about one hour of homework each day, and that after that its benefits reduce drastically.

March 31 On the 10th anniversary of Terri Schaivo's death, we discussed issues of living wills, new physical therapy, Rehab, insurance, minimal consciousness and the ethics surrounding these end of life issues.

2nd Quarter

April 1 The news is covering Indiana's RFRA, and there is a lot of bad information about it. South Carolina has had the same law on the books since 1999. The problem is a small but vocal group has mischaracterized the law as discriminating. In reality, the law provides the due process for legal standing for someone who has a religious conviction or conscience conflict with something. It does not make a ruling, it just guarantees the person a day in court. We explained all this at 440 for 4 minutes.

April 2 Discussed the attack on Religious Liberty and how private foundations (The Ford Foundation and the ARCUS Foundation) are spending millions to support abortion, homosexual rights, and developed strategies to convince conservative Americans that religious exemptions are un-American. Unfortunately, the marketing is gaining ground. The idea is to create conflict between religious liberty and other liberties and demonstrate religious liberty as bigoted. Spoke at 410 for 4 minutes.

April 3 Carried the 30 minute broadcast of money wise. It is a call in show where our listeners can ask questions about budgets, spending, investments, and any other topic related to finances.

April 6 At 505 for 6 minutes we aired a segment on six ways to immediately improve your marriage by Dennis Rainey.

April 7 Carried the 30 broadcast of Focus on the Family at 8am. Today, they interviewed a former member of the PLO, what contributed towards him becoming a terrorist, and the events that transformed his life to give up terrorism. They went on to discuss how this impacts the rest of the world, offering a peaceful solution.

April 8 Discussed the U.S. District Judge decision to continue to hold the President's executive moves to grant amnesty to millions of illegal immigrants. At 440 for 4 minutes we reported on the decision due to the Obama administration's blatant misrepresentations to the court, disrespect for the rule of law, and that any premature implementation could have serious consequences.

April 9 Reported on a meeting of religious leaders who are calling for civil disobedience if the Supreme Court fails to uphold traditional marriage. We discussed the freedom and tradition in this country of being able to push back against tyranny and government, since they derive their power from the governed.

April 10 We had inclement and severe weather across the southeast today. We provided up to the date weather coverage throughout the day. We also covered storm safety procedures and how families can devise a plan to be best prepared during storms.

April 13 Carried Mark Gregston broadcast for 3 minutes at 230. He discussed the challenges of raising children, and he gave resources of where to go to address concerns.

April 14 We reminded folks of the tax deadline tomorrow. We covered the news forms required by Obamacare to pay the healthcare tax, and we cautioned against dated online filing systems like turbo tax and the hacking vulnerabilities.

April 15 Interviewed Gerald Stephens at 505 for 15 minutes about proper lawn care for this time of year for southern lawns. He cautioned listeners against these monthly lawn services and early fertilization.

April 16 Again, we had severe weather throughout the southeast with severe thunderstorms and tornadoes. We spent a lot of time issuing warnings, tracking the storms, and helping listeners understand the steps they needed to take to be safe.

April 20 One presidential candidate, Ted Cruz, made the statement that the 2nd amendment provides the ultimate check against government tyranny. We discussed the Bill or Rights at 520 for 4 minutes, and cited founding fathers' understanding of what they guaranteed. Interestingly, several candidates took softer views on the 2nd amendment.

April 21 We discussed Holocaust Remembrance Day at 545 for 5 minutes. We discussed The Final Solution and anti-semitism as well as current persecutions and prejudices our society is facing. We offered a couple of lessons from the Holocaust, and challenged our listeners to be engaged to resist discrimination and prejudice.

April 22 We reported on the South Carolina filing with the Supreme Court that focused on the due process doctrines of the 14th amendment when it was passed in 1869. The legislators at that time clearly reserved the states' sovereignty to decide marriage issues and not allowing it to become a federal issue. This is in context of the Supreme Court and the Same Sex Marriage concerns that have deeply divided the country.

April 23 Reported on the Center for Immigration studies that analyzed the statistics on immigration and see an 82% increase, a near doubling of the immigrant, legal and illegal, over a ten year period. There are great concerns about the values of this nation as well as a suffering employment force with the huge growth of immigration. This is a huge concern for our listeners, especially in light that the President wants to grant amnesty to 5-10 million illegal immigrants, and is flying in illegals from other countries, granting them rights, and entitlements.

April 24 Broadcast various submissions to our event calendar at 520 for 4 minutes. We explained how listeners could use our free public service announcements, and how to submit information.

April 27 Reported on the challenge to Christian businesses by groups filing charges of discrimination at 520 for 4 minutes. We discussed a broad sample, but cautioned ministries and churches to strengthen their by laws to coordinate with the church's activities to help avoid lawsuits.

April 28 Cited a study that clarifies a news report. The Religion News Service stated that 40 percent of religious groups affirm same sex marriage. This raised questions among some of our listeners, and we followed up as per request. As it turns out, once real numbers are added, those 40 percent actually represent 12% of the population of Christians. So by weighing the groups, it skewed the perception. We took opportunity at 440 to explain this, and how to find real information regarding news stories.

April 29 At 440 for 6 minutes, we reported on yesterday's landmark U.S. Supreme Court hearing of the oral arguments regarding the redefinition of marriage. This is a huge and

divisive issue, both in our nation and our audience. We cited several questions the justices asked and commented on the significance of each.

April 30 Reported on a SC senate bill that would prohibit an abortion after 20 weeks. One version has already passed the house, but opponents are threatening a filibuster, which would prevent it and other bills from passing by summer recess. We discussed the political nature of bills as well as the ethical strings on this specific one.

May 1 Promoted events that had been submitted to our event calendar at 520 for 4 minutes. We explained how listeners can access and utilize our free public service announcements, and we encouraged them to make submissions.

May 4 Carried the show Family Life at 830 for 30 minutes. They discussed how the church can lovingly help those who have been caught up in homosexuality. It also addressed how all Christians have a propensity toward certain behaviors, but how the church can help us rise above any desire.

May 5 At 410 for 4 minutes, we promoted relief agencies for Nepal after the massive earthquake. We shared information about the devastation, the needs, and how agencies are addressing the concerns. We gave website and phone number contact information if folks wanted to donate or volunteer.

May 6 Ran Focus on the Family at 8:00 for 30 minutes. They discussed some of the unique needs of a single parent family. One of the key concerns was the increased probability of living in poverty and the added concerns of that state. The show addressed various ways families and churches can augment and assist these homes.

May 7 Reported on the Senate legislation that would allow Congress to review and reject any negotiation with Iran. It creates the process whereby the American people through their representatives can debate this issue that is of great concern for many of our listeners. Many are concerned we are forsaking Israel and supporting a terrorist nation like Iran.

May 8 Announced several upcoming events and let listeners know how to access our free public service announcements. We always get great response from this type of announcement, and it allows us to promote a wide variety of events, helping our listeners and their interests.

May 11 We carried the 30 minute show Family Life at 830. They discussed the foundational elements necessary for a healthy marriage. They also provided resources and discussion on where to turn to receive information on addressing problem areas from communication to rebellious children.

May 12 Reported on a new technology by General Motors that allows parents to monitor their children 's driving habits, even restricting certain features. The new system, "Teen Driver", debuts this summer, and it provides both audible and visual warnings as well as a feedback report. It is designed to encourage safe driving among the greatest liability group of drivers.

May 13 Cited a study from Hillsdale College outlying four steps individuals can take to make a positive impact on our culture. The first is to understand what is at stake, the second is to hold on to values, and not be bullied from religious beliefs and personal convictions. The third is to oppose politics and policies that undermine family values, realizing that more folks are resisting the negative tide. And finally, invest in shoring up small spheres like family and church. It takes a long time to turn a culture toward better values.

May 14 Reported on the passage of the ban on abortion after 20 weeks by the U.S. House of Representatives. This new version adds informed consent, and the right to sue the abortionist. This bill is the most significant in 10 years, and is to the day after abortionist Kermit Gosnell was found guilty of murder. This debate is very important to our listeners, and to the social and cultural commentary on our country.

May 15 Reported on a Penn State study that reveals the primary reason for chronic tiredness is likely due to low-grade chronic inflammation. The compounds released cause tiredness, depression and obesity.

May 18 Followed up on a story we shared earlier, and now the Kentucky court says a tshirt owner does not have to print messages that conflict with the owners religious beliefs. This is a major ruling regarding religious liberty, which is under assault. An earlier court ruling saying they did have to print the shirts was overturned.

May 19 Carried Point of View from 2-4pm. They discussed Net Neutrality, a new regulation on the internet. The public was not allowed to see the new rules until after implementation, and now it is evident it has become politicized and threatens free speech.

May 20 Reported on the S.C. Senate passing a ban on abortions at 20 weeks of pregnancy yesterday. The Senate passed a bill that would bar abortions at the 20th week of pregnancy with exceptions for the life of the mother, and cases of rape, incest or severe fetal anomaly. This is a significant step forward to limiting abortions since the Supreme Court made abortion legal 40 years ago.

May 21 Continued coverage of the road and bridges repair and infrastructure development in our coverage area. Congress passed a billion dollar bill to go towards this investment six years ago, but a majority of the money was given to unions to pay members to avoid job losses during the recession. In return the union fees gave money to the democrat party. This is a hot topic because the money was not spent where it was promised, and now states are raising taxes to fund these repairs. This increase has a huge impact on our listeners' disposable income.

May 22 There is a growing consensus that Religious Freedom is under attack and arguments are being made that it should be subject to lesser freedoms. As a result, states are attempting to pass legislation that allows citizens to have legal standing if they choose religious belief or moral conviction over some other concern like homosexual marriage. We discussed this at 410 for four minutes citing Lousiana's executive order to help Christians until legislators can pass a law to help support this right.

May 25 Today is Memorial Day. We ran 2 minute PSA's throughout the day reminding folks to drive safely, buckle up, use life jackets if boating, and various safety reminders for this heavily travelled holiday.

May 26 Carried a 7 minute broadcast of Family Life at 505 that explained how to help young people live a life of character and integrity. At the end, they offered resources and web links for more information.

May 27 Following up on Friday's report, at 409 for 3 minutes, we updated listeners on the case where a federal appeals court denied a request by the University of Notre Dame for exemption from Obamacare's abortion mandate. Our listeners are greatly concerned that churches, ministries, and Christian schools will be forced to comply with immoral law or be forced out of business.

May 28 At 435 for4 minutes we reported on drowning, precautions, and safe guards as we head into the summer holidays. We emphasized how preventable most home drowning incidents can be.

May 29 We covered the national election in Ireland regarding same-sex marriage at 520 for four minutes. We offered commentary on our own, upcoming, judicial ruling. We highlighted the U.S. backed funding and organization for this measure to pass in Ireland.

June 1 We continued our coverage of the Ireland election and considered the possibilities of a ruling in the United States. We suggested several legal groups that are prepared to help churches, non-profits, and schools to prepare for potential legal suits challenging tax exemption and even charges of hate speech.

June 2 Reported on a Religious freedom issue at 420 for 4 minutes. The North Carolina state congress had sent a bill up to the Governor to protect magistrates and anyone who would have religious objections to being forced to perform a so called same sex marriage

or lose their job. The Governor vetoed the bill, and today the Senate overrode the veto. We will continue coverage of this issue.

June 3 Many Georgians face double digit increases in health insurance premiums next year, because so few people are signing up for Obamacare. The rates will increase from 10 to 64%. We discussed the impact of this at 540 for 3 minutes.

June 4 Covered a study by the Department of Education that shows homeschooling is up 61%. There is an increasing alarm by parents, and the study revealed who is most likely to homeschool. 420 for 3 minutes.

June 5 Discussed molestation and Sexual Abuse at 420 for five minutes. With this topic in the headlines, we discussed the signs of sexual abuse, warning signs of abusers, what to do if you suspect abuse, what to say if a child reports abuse. What if your child is the abuser, how and when to report abuse, and how the family should work on safety for the children.

June 8 Carried a seven minute segment by Family Life at 505 about helping adolescent children mature to become adults.

June 9 Reported on a study from Stanford that was trying to answer why women live longer than men. We were interested in sharing health benefits and what we learn to improve life span of our listeners. Previous research shows that the increased estrogen in women is a factor, but another is iron. Iron is typically higher in men and can cause increased heart disease. So we discussed nutrition and supplements as well.

June 10 In a freedom of religion report, we updated our listeners at 410 for 3 minutes about the American pastor imprisoned in Iran. He has been there over two years, our state department has made few demands on Iran, and this week he was savagely beaten.

June 11 We updated our listeners on this vote in North Carolina today. Last week, the state Senate overturned a veto by the governor, and today, the house voted with the senate. Under this new law, employees who issue marriage licenses can refuse to complete paperwork for gay couples by invoking their religious beliefs.

June 12 Continuing our reporting on religious freedom, we carried this from the National center for life and liberty at 505 for 2 minutes. Over 330 Christians are killed for their faith every month, making Christianity the persecuted religious group in the world today. Anti Christian sentiment is increasing, even in the United States.

June 15 This week the national weather service is predicting a heat wave, and they issued a heat advisory. We spent time throughout the day going over ways people need to be mindful to stay cool and protect their pets.

June 16 Cited a study from Stanford University at 4:20 for 3 minutes about the benefits of quitting smoking. After 15 years, the heart and lungs can recover. However, the more a person smokes and the longer they do past 15 years greatly increases heart disease.

June 17 Shared a story at 4 40 for 3 minutes about the economic decline in Zimbabwa. They experienced 230 million percent inflation, and they trade trillions of their dollars for 1 American dollar. We discussed the U.S. fiat currency and debt as well as ways to diversify.

June 18 Reported on the shooting at the church in Charleston at 420 for 4 minutes. In addition to the news, we discussed how churches can take a proactive approach to security and protection.

June 19 Carried Family Facts at 520 for 2 minutes. They discussed how to improve grades and behavior with children if the family will commit to a meal at the dinner table once a day.

June 22 We reported on the Supreme court ruling today that guaranteed the fifth amendment rights that the government cannot seize private property without fair compensation. The case had to do with raisin producers, and chief justice Roberts wrote that this argument goes back 800 years to the Magna Carta.

June 23 In our coverage of the shooting this past weekend in Charleston, we contrasted the response of Charleston to Baltimore and Ferguson and how their Christian faith has impacted the city and nation. Elements of grace, forgiveness and love have been throughout the city, and it is a stark reminder of the nature of Christianity. We challenged our listeners to examine themselves

June 24 A national dialogue has begun regarding the Confederate flag. State houses are lowering it and stores are pulling it. At 4:20 we joined the conversation for four minutes. Intrinsically, we see some value in it, but it has been used as a symbol of bigotry. After hearing CNN suggest we remove all the monuments and rename anything to do with Confederate history, we were alarmed at the attempt to re-write history.

June 25 Supreme Court handed down a highly controversial ruling today. We reported at 405 for 4 minutes...It was remarkably unlawful. Listeners we spoke with are concerned for the lawlessness in our land, specifically in our government. Under plain language, the Federal government was not able to operate exchanges. This was a deliberate part of the law to try to force states into complying. However, when a majority of states refused, the healthcare law was in jeopardy. The court redefined the law and twisted language to make it work. Our listeners are concerned about Monday's ruling on marriage. June 26 Monday's ruling came today as the Supreme Court changed millennia of wisdom and law including the U.S. Constitution to recognize same sex marriage. Our phones have been busy from our listeners as they are very upset at how this could be happening. We discussed the ruling at 420 for 8 minutes reading from both the majority view and the dissenting view. Interestingly, On the dissenting view, they echo what we are hearing from our listeners that this is an unlawful act and could mean the end of our nation.

June 29 We promoted our event calendar and explained to our listeners how they can use our free air time for public service announcements. We promoted several upcoming events.

June 30 Regarding Freedom of Religion, we discussed the pushback people all over the country are giving the U.S. Supreme Court's decision to create "same-sex" marriage. Clerk's are quitting, judges are dropping their license procedures, a U.S. Senator is recommending we ignore it, and many have signed a declaration to not recognize it. Mississippi has even debated separating marriage from the state. This is a huge and divisive issue for this country and our listeners.

3rd Quarter

July 1 We covered a health story at 440 for 3 minutes. People with pre-diabetes who lose a modest amount of weight and increase their physical activity are less likely to develop diabetes. Moderate eating and a little movement go a long way in improving health conditions.

July 2 On education, we reported at 510 for 3 minutes the National Education Association's resolution against homeschooling. Many in our audience are supportive of homeschooling, and we cited statistics that showed how homeschooled children outperform government schools. The NEA wants to limit what homeschoolers can teach and who can teach.

July 3 With Independence day tomorrow, we talked about the Magna Carta at 420 for 3 minutes. This is the 800th anniversary of the document that is called the foundation of the freedom of the individual against the arbitrary authority of the despot.

July 6 Reported on more pushback against the Supreme Court ruling at 505 for 3 minutes. A Texas county clerk is citing Justice Kennedy's wording to emphasize here exemption for religious reasons.

July 7 Covered a personal property dispute going on in Georgia and South Carolina where the multi state lawsuit is against the EPA for overreaching the authority of the navigable waters act and seizing access to people's land.

July 8 Presidential candidate Donald Trump is making headlines on immigration. We discussed the issues of illegal immigration at 515 for 5 minutes. We discussed the failures of upholding existing laws and what it would require for the government to restore our faith that they have our best interests in mind.

July 9 Followed up on our coverage of the Benghazi investigation from 2012. This week Hillary Clinton told CNN she never received a subpoena regarding her personal emails. Rep. Trey Gowdy of S.C. said he had no choice but to make the subpoena public in order to correct the inaccuracy of her claim. The investigation is probing the attack that left 4 Americans killed including a U.S. Ambassador. So many of our listeners have called with complaints of the lack of news coverage of this and similar events on other stations.

July 10 Reported on the Barna Group survey that found 19 % of Americans believe that religious institutions or clergy should be required to perform same-sex marriages. Coincidentally, 19% of those surveyed did not know Freedom of Religion is in the First Amendment of the Constitution. This report and survey help serve as a public service.

July 13 At 420 for 3 minutes we discussed the threats to religious non-profits and churches and suggested various organizations that can offer support and help for constitutional and by law issues for the groups.

July 14 Covered the Pope's latest encyclia where he made statements that while condemning materialism and consumerism, made ambiguous statements against capitalism. Our nation, from its founding, chose capitalism, and it has done more to lift more people out of poverty than any economic system known. Many of his statements seemed to support Marxism or even Communism. We received a lot of feedback from our audience for our coverage of this story.

July 15 Interviewed Gerald Stephens about summer lawns and gardens. This has proven to be a real interest with our audience, and we take questions and address specific issues for our listeners.

July 16 Reported on the exposure that Planned Parenthood has not only been providing abortions with tax dollars, but they have been harvesting body parts to sell on the market. This repulsive and horrific news came as a shock not only our audience, which is overwhelmingly pro-life, but has resulted in many of our listeners contacting representatives to withdraw funding but also prosecute the offenders.

July 17 We have several military installations within our coverage range. We discussed this week's shooting of unarmed military personnel at recruitment centers in Chattanooga by an Islamic terrorist. Our coverage focused on allowing uniformed men and women the ability to carry side arms, since they have become such a highly visible target. July 20 The illegal immigration issue is on front burner in our country right now. They are coming by the millions and the crime rate and employment concerns in addition to benefits and voting are in the headlines. Most recently, we are seeing Muslim immigrants becoming radicalized and performing acts of violence on our citizens. Franklin Graham recommended we stop all Muslim immigration until the "war" stops. We discussed this topic at 420 for 4 minutes.

July 21 At 410 fro 4 minutes we discussed the high cost of aging and how to plan for long term health care. We shared the average cost per year and offered several suggestions on how to bring the costs down.

July 22 Carried the 25 minutes show Focus on the Family at 8am and again at 730pm. Today their topic was practical steps to take when a spouse decides the marriage is over.

July 23 The current election cycle has brought several social issues to the forefront of discussion. Presidential candidate Ben Carson made several assertions regarding abortion and pro-life ideas regarding the black community that resonated with our audience, and we reported on the interview.

July 24 Reported on a health study from the CDC. 1.6% of adults identify as homosexual, yet, polling data shows the general population thinks it is 25-30%. We discussed this disparity and how so few were able to turn the history's definition of marriage completely upside down.

July 27 Continued our coverage on the Planned Parenthood scandal. Although they initially denied the allegations, videos from a sting operation continue to show not only was the group performing abortions, they were also taking care to harvest little baby organs and tissue (felony) and sell them for nominal fees and get a percentage back on the sell to research labs. They are using the Nazi argument that it is for the good.

July 28 As School is about to resume, we carried a report that showed homeschooling increasing by 9% this year and 60% over the past 10 years. Parents indicated they were concerned about how common core will negatively affect their children's education.

July 29 In response to the questions we have received, we discussed Kevin DeYoung's book "What Does the Bible Really Teach About Homosexuality?" We covered six questions that come up and how the book addressing the topic.

July 30 At 410 pm for 3 minutes, we reported on how various states are dealing with the Supreme Court decision of five people redefining thousands of years of history. Several states are providing legal cover for those who object, and Tennessee being the latest says to ignore the unlawful ruling.

July 31 At 520 for 3 minutes we shared various PSA's and explained how listeners could access our free public service time.

Aug 3 As yet another investigative video was released, exposing the barbarous butchery of planned parenthood, we discussed the group's founder, Margaret Sanger, at 420 for 3 minutes. She was a known racist in favor of reducing the number of African Americans through abortion. We discussed her evolutionary ideas as well as racist ideas and talked about how ideas give place to actions.

Aug 4 We reported on a man who shot down a drone that had been hovering over his backyard for several minutes . He had a privacy fence, but the drone owners videoed while hovering about 10 feet above them. Although the homeowner was arrested for shooting in city limits, he has raised a huge issue about privacy. Regulations are just being developed for these drones, and there are safety issues at airports. We covered these larger issues at 520 for 4 minutes.

Aug 5 Covered a study by the University of Derby that warned smartphones can be psychologically addictive and encourage narcissistic tendencies and found that almost a quarter of people reported their phone use causes communication problems in real life. At 520 for 3 minutes we also cited British education secretary, Tristam Hunt, who warned that the addiction means adults are preoccupied on the phones to spend the time necessary with young children, reading and talking with them. His concern is it will impact early childhood language development, leading to other issues.

Aug 6 Reported on a religious freedom and constitutional issue where a school in Montana wanted to tour a dinosaur museum. The owners of the museum are Christians, and an atheist group threatened to sue if the school attended, even though there was no Christian message being taught. Furthermore, the suing party said only evolution should be taught.

Aug 7 Today is tax free day for the purchase of school supplies in South Carolina. We advertised the day, and described which items could be purchased without the sales tax.

Aug 10 Carried a five minute broadcast at 505 by Dr. Erwin Lutzer about steps to take to immediately improve a marriage relationship.

Aug 11 Reported on an article at 440 for 2 minutes from the Telegraph. It was about the wholesale manipulation of the official temperature record, and how this is one of the biggest scientific scandals of all time.

Aug 12 Reported on a family in France who, while on vacation this weekend, accidentally drove off without their three year old daughter. They were reunited, but we discussed the psychological phenomenon of how we forget important things like this, and steps we can take to minimize errors.

Aug 13 We promoted events that are coming up in the near future. We explained the process on the air at 440 for 3 minutes on how listeners can access and utilize our free public service announcements.

Aug 14 With our continuing coverage of the Planned Parenthood scandal, we outlined more of what the organization does as well as citing the spokesman for the Department of Health and Human Services, who threatened any state that defunded Planned Parenthood with legal action. Our listeners have expressed concern for the devaluing of life and how our country has fallen to such a contemptible state. We took on air questions and answers from callers this afternoon for 2 hours between 2 and 4

Aug 17 We carried excerpts from an interview from homosexual activists at 510 for 4 minutes. Masha Gessen and Clinton Fein affirmed that the agenda to make homosexual marriage a civil right is intended to water down marriage until it is pointless, force affirmation of the deviancy on those who dissent, and criminalize anyone who refuses to support the agenda.

Aug 18 We covered the latest security breach from the IRS and how thieves stole an additional 220, 000 identities. We informed listeners what to expect from the IRS, how to look out for scams, and how to take responsibility for personal identity protection.

Aug 19 Reported on the continued release of investigative reporting on Planned Parenthood. The latest video shows how they would deliver aborted babies alive, with beating hearts and intact brains so they could sell the babies organs. In light of this, Utah is the fourth state to defund Planned Parenthood. We are concerned about the gruesome butchery going on in this country, and we led discussion about the right to life and liberty at 420 for 5 minutes.

Aug 20 Covered a speech by presidential candidate Ted Cruz. At 420 for 3 minutes we carried excerpts from the speech that discussed how evangelical Christians stayed away from the polls in the last election, and how important it is for Christians to vote according to their values. It was not an endorsement of a candidate just discussion of his argument for Christian involvement.

Aug 21 We discussed this weekend's protest at Planned Parenthood across the nation. The goal is to pressure federal and state governments to sever any connection with Planned Parenthood. The grassroots effort is a result of the undercover videos exposing the sale of baby parts and organs from abortions. We have received a lot of calls regarding this issue.

Aug 24 Over the weekend, three Americans tackled an armed attacker on a high speed train in France. At 410 for 4 minutes, we discussed the change 9-11 has had on

Americans, ways to stay engaged and alert while in public places, and safety steps to take if a terrorist begins to take action.

Aug 25 Today in history, David Hume died in 1776. At 520 for 3 minutes, we discussed his political philosophy that influenced our constitution, and government. We made the appeal to study Hume and Locke as well as James Madison on dealing with the tyranny of the majority.

Aug 26 Millions of people are fleeing the middle east because of ISIS and terrorism. It has created a massive problem for western Europe and the United States on dealing with these refugees. Immigration laws are breaking down, yet the humanitarian needs are very real. At 520 for 4 minutes, we discussed the issue and gave the solutions being offered at this time.

Aug 27 We reported on the Georgia Bill that will formally ban the sale or purchase of aborted babies' organs or tissue. Since no law formally forbids this barbaric practice, the bill makes it a felony along with a five year sentence.

Aug 28 We covered the story of a Florida Sheriff at 510 for 3 minutes who responded to an atheist group to remove "In God We Trust" from the patrol cars. He stated that the group was obviously unaware that is the state motto of Florida as well as the United States.

Aug 31 A tropical storm is threatening our coastal areas. We spent time throughout the day covering the projected track as well as precautions listeners need to take to be prepared for an emergency.

Sep 1 At 440 for 4 minutes, we cited the piece from the National Review that discussed the current political debate about the economic costs of birthright citizenship. Surveys show that a majority of our audience wants illegal immigration stopped. This article referenced the Center for Immigration Studies that estimated 4 million children were born in the U.S. to illegal immigrants, and that 71 percent of them are receiving government welfare and benefits.

Sep 2 We covered a story about returning college students at 510 for 3 minutes about how various colleges are confronting students and lowering their grades if the students do not use politically correct language or Orwellian Newspeak. Multiple professors have explicitly told students their grades will suffer if they use terms such as "male" or "female".

Sep 3 Discussed the incarceration of the Kentucky clerk who refused to issue marriage certificates for religious reasons. Kentucky law is still one man and one woman, but a huge religious issue has come up since this faulty Supreme Court ruling.

Sep 4 Carried a 3 minutes production at 505 that chronicled the results of the county clerk who was arrested for not issuing marriage licenses. The show Spot lighted both the legal and religious arguments regarding this case.

Sep 7 Being Labor Day, we reported on the latest Labor Force Participation numbers. 94,031,00 Americans are not working. This is a 38 year low for the third straight month. Our anemic economy only added 173,00 jobs last month. We discussed ways to train and advance

Sep 8 At 407 for 2 minutes, we updated our audience on the Department of Veterans Affairs inspector general report. 307,000 vets or 38% died before their applications were processed. Some had died years before they were processed. We recommended other ways vets could obtain health care, while we continue to attempt to hold the administration accountable.

Sep 9 Reported on the congressional hearings at congress today. We related how a 38 year old woman addressed congress today. She survived a botched abortion in 1977. The abortionist injected a solution that should have killed her, but after 18 hours, she was born alive. She asked about her rights as a baby, and as a woman.

Sep 10 We promoted our event calendar at 420 for four minutes. We listed upcoming events throughout our area, and we explained how others can utilize our website and make free public service announcements over the airwaves.

Sep 11 The current Pope of the Catholic church is visiting the U.S. this month. He has stirred a lot of discussion and possible conflict by his sayings and edicts. We reported on a panel of Bishops who are threatening a schism on the scale of the Protestant Reformation. The scale and scope of this division is why we discussed it for five minutes at 420. The implications are far reaching on how it affects the culture and climate of Christendom as well as various cultures around the world.

Sep 14 Reported on the Georgia State Superintendent of Schools at 440 for 3 minutes about his initiative to partner with statewide civic groups and place a copy of the constitution in the hands of every 4th grader across the state. The initiative leads up to the national constitution day this Thursday.

Sep 15 At 510 for 3 minutes, we gave 5 lessons from the recent hacking of the adultery website. We drew from an article by Dr. Michael Brown. The people on the website assumed they were anonymous, so we dealt with character issues as well as how to strengthen a marriage.

Sep 16 Broadcast Focus on the Family at 8am and at 730pm for thirty minutes each time. They interviewed a family who discussed how to discuss money issues and differences in a marriage and come to workable solutions.

Sep 17 Provided a public service about the upcoming changing area code for South Carolina. Due to the demand of new numbers the 843 is expanding to 854 to accommodate the growth and will impact others throughout our listening area who will dial into the South Carolina low country.

Sep 18 Explained how to access and submit information for our free public service announcements. In addition, we announced all the events coming up this weekend.

Sep 21 At 405 for 3 minutes we discussed the interview over the weekend where a Presidential candidate described the Islamic faith as inconsistent with the Constitution. We discussed the constitutional religious test as well as the credibility of his statement.

Sep 22 With religious freedom being challenged on a daily basis, we described some of the cases where school districts, sheriff departments, and churches all had legal concerns. We shared several resources where people could turn to obtain legal council.

Sep 23 Shared a study at 440 from the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force that recommended a small daily dose of aspirin for people in their 50's and under doctor supervision. This age bracket seemed to benefit the most on preventive care.

Sep 24 Regarding the Supreme Court decision to impose gay marriage on states, we reported how states are pushing back. We highlighted how Tennessee is introducing legislation to make the ruling null, and we shared how others can obtain the information and follow suit.

Sep 25 Updated our listeners on a Freedom of Religion issue regarding Pastor Abedini who has been held in Iran for 3 years. Last week he was beaten and tortured with a taser. We encouraged our listeners to speak with their representatives to increase political pressure on the Iranians.

Sep 28 Reported on a Georgia news story where Middle school students are required to study various aspects of Islam. It came to our attention when hundreds of parents protested, even submitting copies of the course to us. One parent said we cant teach the 10 commandments, but we can teach the Shiad, five pillars?

Sep 29 Covered the Congressional hearings for Planned Parenthood. Many of our listeners have expressed the desire to see all federal funding cut from the organization. Today, PP affirmed they do not provide mammograms or several other health services they claimed, but they do provide abortion and they sell baby parts.

Sep 30 At 410 for five minutes, we covered the Planned Parenthood congressional hearings. In light of the expose' videos released this summer, we identified the 9 most damaging things Planned Parenthood admitted to Congress. The issue of abortion is a huge social and legal issue in the upcoming election, but fact they are selling baby parts

and not conducting mammograms (like they claimed) is now leading the argument to defund them.

Fourth Quarter

Oct 1 At 505 for 4 minutes, we discussed safety in public places in light of the Oregon Community College shooting. Invariably, gun free zones make law abiding citizens vulnerable to criminals who disobey strict gun laws. We talked about the laws as well as ways to be prepared if a gunman appears.

Oct 2 We issued warnings throughout the day as a category 4 hurricane is off the coast of Georgia and the Carolinas. Although we are not expecting landfall, we are expecting record amounts of rainfall. Flooding and flash flooding are a real concern.

Oct 5 We had historic flooding in South and North Carolina. Throughout the day, we dispensed information regarding where people could turn to get help with accommodations, clean water, and food. 18 dams had broken and the flooding, property loss and loss of life has been extensive.

Oct 6 We reported on a Freedom of Religion issue at 410 for three minutes. In Aleppo, Syria two weeks ago, 10 ministers and one boy were tortured and executed for not denying Christianity and converting to Islam. We discussed the implications of Sharia law in this country as well as action to take to help Christians around the world.

Oct 7 We interviewed the SC Insurance Service regarding the recent flooding in South Carolina. Flooding is the most common and costly natural disaster in the United States. Yet, flood damage is excluded under standard homeowners insurance policies, and must be purchased separately...which few do, because they are unaware of this pricing and coverage scheme. We encouraged folks to consider their coverage and acquire additional coverage, since there is also a 30 day activation time.

Oct 8 Today, was a nation wide initiative for students to carry their bibles to school with them. At 420 for 3 minutes, we discussed the Constitutional law as well as equal access amendments that guarantee religious free speech for students.

Oct 9 We promoted our events calendar. We explained how folks could contact us and submit information for online and on-air free public service announcements. We also shared several events coming up over the next two weekends.

Oct 12 Reported on the progress of the relief efforts and damage assessments after the historical rains and flooding. Several communities now have save drinking water, but it will take months to repair the roads and bridges. We gave information on how to support and volunteer help as well as how to receive aid from various organizations.

Oct 13 We carried the 30 minute show Money Wise at 6pm. It is a call in show for our listeners to field questions about money, credit, debt, retirement, investments and other financial question.

Oct 14 Continued our coverage of the flood damage. We announced road and bridge openings as well a time frame for closed roadways. We announced safety measures for clean water, and how folks can make donations to help those who are in need.

Oct 15 We carried the show Probe this week at 550 for four minutes a day. They have been discussing the pros and cons of human enhancement. Incorporating computer technology into the biology of the human can help with diseases like Alzheimers.

Oct 16 Promoted the event calendar. We explained how listeners can utilize the free public airwaves and how to submit events for our website and on air. After we explained the process at 510 for 4 minutes, we announced several events coming up over the next few weeks.

Oct 19 We cited an article from World Magazine at 430 for four minutes that delves into the recent glut of commercials in favor of gambling. They explained that a loophole in the law created this possibility, and a couple of young men have exploited the possibilities through statistics and probability sites that track game performance. We discussed the odds of loss and the impact on families throughout our listening area.

Oct 20 We carried the 30 minute show, Focus on the Family, at 8am and again at 730pm. They discussed domestic abuse, its symptoms, causes, effects, and solutions. They also offered resources and assistance to those who wanted help.

Oct 21 Interviewed the Nurseryman about how to effectively combat the fire ants that are so prevalent this time of year throughout our coverage area. We spoke for 10 minutes at 510.

Oct 22 Reported on yet another state voting to defund Planned Parenthood at 420 for 3 minutes. The bill is in response to the grotesque revelations of this summer's videos that have exposed the cruel practices of this organization. We used this example as a tutorial on a way to show our listeners ways to communicate with state and federal representatives about issues they are concerned about.

Oct 23 Promoted our event calendar at 540 for 3 minutes. We announced events coming up this weekend, and we explained how listeners can access our website as well as our free public service announcements.

Oct 26 We carried Family Talk at 930 for 30 minutes they interviewed doctors and discussed gender identity, specifically, transvestites, and how that impacts a family, and courses of action to take. All the studies indicate this is a disorder similar to how an

anorexic sees her body. It is difficult, but treatable, and in the long run more beneficial than acquiescence.

Oct 27 At 520 for 3 minutes we discussed the recent shooting in Oregon and what churches can do and have done to increase security. Many faith-based organizations have created security teams that control traffic in the church, the doors and hallways. Panic buttons and medical teams have also been implemented.

Oct 28 At 420 for 4 minutes we discussed the 2016 sign up window for Obamacare which begins Nov 1. Although premiums are getting very expensive and agencies discontinue coverage, the penalty for the uninsured will increase to \$695. We explained the law and how it is being enforced on taxpayers.

Oct 29 After multiple phone calls from our listeners, we reported again on the immigration crisis in the Middle East. We outlined strategies for helping the refugees from the war torn areas, and we shared links to organizations that would help their churches sponsor those fleeing for religious freedom.

Oct 30 We reported at 520 about students in our listening area who peaceably protested the firing of Spring Valley security guard and coach. Last week he had forcibly removed a student from her desk and the incident was being investigated by the Department of Justice for civil rights violations. The students in class related how the student started the whole incident, and how it got out of hand. We discussed if this should make a difference in the situation, and should the officer be reinstated.

Nov 2 Cited an article in World Magazine about a young man who was changed after he went off to college. We used the piece as an opportunity to address some correspondence we have received about children going off to school. We spoke of the cultural challenges they will face, perhaps hostile professors, and how parents can stay in touch and involved in their child's education.

Nov 3 We discussed the merits of global warming in context of the NASA news release that Antarctica has added billions of new ice over the past two years. We have already discussed fraudulent claims and doctored data, but this issue has huge impact on freedom and the finances of our audience. The false idea has been used to raise taxes and penalize our country to finance a massive redistribution of wealth.

Nov 4 Elections were held yesterday across the country. Liberal candidates continue to get pummeled at the polls. There is a major cultural shift that is occurring in our country, and many of our listeners write to us and call us with concerns about the decline in our society. The surprise upset for the Kentucky governorship summed it up this way: "The people favor traditional values and marriage, and they are tired of the

political elites who are out of touch with ordinary, God-loving citizens." We attempt to report on these issues and highlight some of the victories in this arena of ideas.

Nov 5 At 410 for 4 minutes, we reported on a story where a 5 year old boy went missing in 2002 and has just turned up. He had been snatched by and raised by his father and taken to another state. We turned our attention towards children's safety, because this is the number one threat to children as far as kidnapping. We discussed measures at churches and nurseries to help alleviate possible crimes.

Nov 6 Carried a 7 minute interview that covered this week's national election. We discussed the overwhelming outcomes that seem to reflect the nation is very concerned about traditional American values and marriage.

Nov 9 Interviewed Dr. Benjamin Scripture at 505 for 10 minutes. He is in the area speaking at 3 different venues. He fielded questions from our audience regarding his research and scientific areas of interest to our listeners.

Nov 10 On the front of Religious Freedom, the Supreme Court has agreed to hear seven cases regarding religious nonprofits who object to the mandate of abortion. We have been following these cases and reporting on them. Many folks in our audience have let us know they want the government out of health care and out of our private insurance.

Nov 11 Today is Veterans Day. We prepared a special report on the history of Armistice Day and Veterans Day. We wanted to recognize all the men and women in our audience who have served in the Armed Forces.

Nov 12 Covered a story about how South Carolina has barred the door to Third World refugees . Several counties are voting to close off all funding. So, certainly refugees could come, but there will not be any funds available for supporting them. We received many calls about how to accomplish this throughout our area.

Nov 13 Illegal immigration is a huge issue with many of our listeners. Lindsey Graham put forth legislation to increase by 100,000 the Syrian refugees over the next two years. This is not a popular piece of legislation, and we discussed what different groups are doing to curtail the inflow.

Nov 16 Since the weekend's terrorist massacre in Paris, we discussed immigration, specifically Muslims, and the policies our government is utilizing and failing to acknowledge as they relocate them in our various communities. We discussed the grassroots movements as well as state legislation that is attempting to stop this insanity.

Nov 17 Discussed the FCC at 440 for 2 minutes and the repercussions of net neutrality. It seems conceivable at this point that the commission could determine ANY website is having a disproportionate effect on political discourse and shut it down.

Nov 18 Discussed highway safety coming up with Thanksgiving weekend next week. For two minutes at 440 we specifically addressed trying to do to much over the weekend and driving sleepy. We discussed the percentages of accidents and the impact of driving while sleepy.

Nov 19 Again with terrorism threats and immigration in the headlines, we reported at 510 for 3 minutes about the bill to halt immigration from these terrorist sponsored countries. Interestingly, the President and Democrat Minority leader have threatened to oppose this legislation despite the fact the American people are demanding it.

Nov 20 Carried a 2 minute feature at 507 about religious values, religious freedom and the people we know as the Pilgrims.

Nov 23 Reported on a religious freedom concern. Three California churches have filed suit against the state because of mandated abortion coverage. Supposedly, churches are exempt from this requirement, but the state has made a blanket law to require everyone to pay for this, regardless of conviction.

Nov 24 Discussed the division of the Supreme Court ruling on homosexual marriage and the toll it is taking within denominations at 420 for 3 minutes. We reported how two Baptist churches have been removed from the Southern Baptist Association since that ruling due to the pastors performing ceremonies. We discussed policies, doctrine, and law as how churches need to address these unprecedented concerns.

Nov 25 Promoted our event calendar at 520 for 3minutes. We explained how to submit events and we promoted events coming up this weekend throughout our listening area.

Nov 26 Today is Thanksgiving we recorded safety messages about travel and even home safety regarding fires and turkey fryers.

Nov 27 Reported an update on the ongoing pro-life battle. Many states have cut funding to Planned Parenthood after the summer release of the incriminating videos. In addition, there is hard evidence indicating Medicaid fraud. We covered this story at 410 for 2 minutes.

Nov 30 Interviewed a lawyer and real estate agent at 505 for 7 minutes about estates, retiring, downsizing, and planning for older listeners.

Dec 1 Continued with the Interview with a lawyer and real estate agent at 505 for 8 minutes about estates, retiring, downsizing, and planning for older listeners.

Dec 2 There is an international summit on climate change taking place for 2 weeks. We outlined and documented a list of reasons why there is growing resistance to this narrative. Along with climate change is a global plan to redistribute wealth.

Dec 3 Reported on the terrorist shooting in San Bernadino where 14 were killed and 17 wounded. We discussed how political blindness warps reality and what action we the people can take to thwart this trend.

Dec 4 We promoted various events throughout our listening area at 440 for 4 minutes and explained to our listeners how they too can submit information for our free public service announcements.

Dec 7 Interviewed U.S. Congressman Jody Hice at 505 for 16 minutes. We discussed national security, the national debt, and social security.

Dec 8 Continued the interview from yesterday for 15 more minutes. We discussed regulations and religious freedom.

Dec 9 Reported on the S.C. health officials who are considering charging the full cost of health inspections to abortion clinics rather than passing the costs on to other businesses.

Dec 10 Carried Focus on the Family at 8am and 730pm for 30 minutes each. They discussed helping children who have difficulties with drugs and alcohol.

Dec 11 School district one in Florence, SC has ceased to work with Operation Christmas Child, a project they have supported since 2006. We reported on the threatening letter they received that resulted in this decision, and we offered resources and references for other businesses, ministries and individuals who might be served in the future.

Dec 14 We covered the topic of immigration again. It has shown itself to become a huge problem for national security. The politicians do not seem to be listening to the majority of the American people. This is the number one issue on the ballot for this upcoming presidential election. We cited Franklin Graham as a prominent evangelical who has called for Muslim immigration to be stopped altogether until a system can be in place to vet the immigrants.

Dec 15 We discussed religious freedom and the trial of the Canadian minister who was arrested in North Korea. Although his work is with orphanages, the government views his Christian faith as inherently opposed to and subversive to the government. We see this trend in any form of tyrannical government. The ideas in Christianity promote freedom.

Dec 16 Interviewed the Nurseryman about controlling and eradicating fire ants. With the unseasonably warm and wet weather we are experiencing, fire ants have seemed to multiply throughout the southeast. We spoke at 505 for 10 minutes.

Dec 17 We reported on the Department of Homeland Security deleting intelligence because they wanted to protect "civil liberties". We cited whistleblower, Phil Haney who

was ordered to stop investigating certain Islamic groups. One of the groups he was investigating had direct ties to the terrorist shooting in San Bernadino, CA last week. We discussed safety and personal responsibility.

Dec 18 Reported on the congressional approval to increase our federal budget to 1.1 trillion. We highlighted funding such as to Planned Parenthood, sanctuary cities, and refugee programs. These are huge concerns for the electorate, yet the congress continues to spend.

Dec 21 Regarding freedom of religion, we discussed a school that permitted a Charlie Brown Christmas play provided the children did not recite the passage from Luke. Parents were upset, and Alliance Defending Freedom offered any legal assistance to protect their rights. The school declined, so the parents cited the passage at the right time of the play. The school reciting the passage would not have violated any law, and only sets them up for problems with Shakespeare or any other playright.

Dec 22 We reported at 510 for two minutes, an industrial expansion in our coverage area that will provide 110 jobs. We gave out details and contact information for any who may have been interested or in need.

Dec 23 Updated listeners on the ongoing conflict at the Veterans Administration. Many of our listeners are concerned about the lack of health care for our veterans, especially in the rural areas where health care choices are limited to begin with. In the latest hearings, the VA has admitted they have not made any progress in correcting the problems of denying and delaying health care for veterans. There has been no shake up in leadership, and no reform.

Dec 24 We have had inclimate weather. We have spent much of the day announcing tornado watches and warnings and flood watches and warnings all throughout our listening area. We have provided early warning for the severe thunderstorms and winds.

Dec 28 We reported on a human interest story. We compared the hostile climate to school Christmas programs that have anything religious in them to a high school Christmas program in 1984 where 100% of the program was Christian. Has our constitution changed or have we the people changed?

Dec 29 We carried a segment at 505 for 7 minutes by Family Life and how to find contentment as opposed to just settling for what is. It was philosophical to an extent but very practical in how folks can cope with the blues and press through some of the monotony of life.

Dec 30 Contacted U.S. Senator Tim Scott about the omnibus budget bill. Shared his response at 420 for 4 minutes.
