Issue: Elder Care

Jan 4

We broadcast Family Life Today at 8:30 for 30 minutes with guest author Jim Stroud discussing the various options we have in caring for the elderly.

Issue: Video Games

We carried a one hour call in show with Kerby Anderson at 2:00 pm dealing with Gaming Disorder and how the World Health Organization has added it to a list of mental health conditions. We discussed approaches to help those who are victim to it.

We ran a 30 minute interview with Dave Ramsey at 8:00 am about the fundamentals of personal financial management and teaching children how to manage money

Issue: How Public Policies affect us

Jan 10

We carried the Kerby Anderson broadcast for two hours 2-4pm. They discussed with WSJ editors that the current administration is reining in and rolling back the regulatory state at a faster rate than we have seen in decades. This rollback gives more freedom and money to our listeners, and they discussed specifics.

Issue: Violence and Rape Recovery

We carried Family Talk for with Dr Dobson at 9:30 for 30 minutes interviewing a panel of women, who were either raped and became pregnant, or with conceived by rape. They discussed various issues regarding women, our culture, molestation, and moral responsibilities.

Issue: Teen Rebellion

Feb 1 We carried a 30 minute discussion with author, Allison Botke at 8:00 am. She discussed steps to take when a child rejects your family values and charts a course of rebellion and destruction.

Issue: Human Trafficking

Feb 5 Carried a discussion with Human trafficking expert Nita Belles at 8:00 for 30 minutes about labor and sex trafficking, sharing stories of people being caught up in and rescued from horrific situations. She provided practical ways to help trafficked victims and tools to protect your children.

Issue: Adultery and Broken Marriages

Feb 7

We carried the Focus on the Family program at 8:00 am for 30 minutes and repeated it at 7:30 pm as well as a continuation of the interview for 2 more days. Dave Carder offered couples practical advice for protecting their marriages from adultery in a discussion based on his book *Anatomy of an Affair: How Affairs, Attractions, and Addictions Develop, and How to Guard Your Marriage Against Them*.

Issue: Anger and Domestic Violence

Carried the Broadcast Family Talk, a 30 minute discussion with Dr. Tim Clinton, President of the AACC, and Dr. Sharon May, founder of the Safe Haven Relationship

Counseling Center about the cycle of anger and resentment couples find themselves in and how they can obtain help to break that cycle

Issue: Personal Failures and Setbacks

Feb 16

We carried Focus on the Family from 8:00 until 8:28 am as they interviewed Author Laurie Polich Short as she described how your outlook on unwanted and negative circumstances shapes your life, and then offered suggestions how transforming your perspective can empower you to embrace whatever comes your way, be it good or bad.

Issue: Public Education

March 16

We conducted an interview with E. Ray Moore of Frontline Ministries for 11 minutes at 5:05 pm. We discussed school safety in light of last month's shooting in Florida, as well as the bullying and values concerns. His organization offered multiple, creative options to traditional public schools and offered resources for more information and further inquiry.
