Kidney Disease – 03/21/16 - TFN

:60 spot There is a progressive and potentially fatal health condition that effects one in seven American adults, and causes more deaths annually than either breast cancer or prostate cancer. One third of Americans are at risk of developing this disease, and yet the symptoms are so difficult to detect that most people don't even know they have it until they become critically ill and require emergency medical intervention. Can you guess what it is? It's chronic kidney disease, a preventable and treatable condition that takes a terrible toll on overall health and quality of life for millions of Americans.

Our kidneys play a vital role in keeping us healthy and ensuring our bodies work properly. Their primary function is to filter wastes and extra water out of our blood to make urine. One in four children have vision problems that, if left untreated, may result in learning issues and hinder development and academic performance in school. All children, even those with no signs of trouble, should have their eyes checked during the first few years of life, before entering kindergarten, and throughout the school years. Signs of vision problems include squinting while reading or watching TV, frequently rubbing the eyes, one eye appearing crossed or looking outwards, or issues reading or writing. Watch for digital eye strain, which is caused by prolonged use of computers or smartphones and can cause dry eyes, blurred vision or headaches. According to the "Caregiving in the U.S." report, in 2009, there were roughly 40 million caregivers in the U.S., providing an estimated \$450 billion worth of unpaid care to aging relatives and friends. A popular misconception is that caregivers are paid medical professionals, when in reality, most caregivers are family members or friends who are also working and managing their own families at the same time. For many, the caregiving role starts with simple things like scheduling a doctor's visit, but gradually expands until it becomes a major commitment in their lives. In recognition of the essential role care givers play, the PSAs depict the circle of life and how roles change often without us even noticing.

Bridging the Gap – 28:00 Minutes – Saturday 7:30 p.m. – 09/01/18

Host is Jimmy Robles, Sal Mendez is interviewer today.

Guest: is Verlyn Maldonado. She recently hosted the Westside BTG meeting. There is a special house that was originally the Carol Burnett house at the corner of Commerce and S Pinto. The house was donated by the Cisneros, a family who still live in the neighborhood and are active in it. There is also a house across the street at 2007 Commerce St.

The group called, “American Sunrise” focuses on education for Kindergarten to 5th grade, Monday to Thursday, 3:30-6 pm. It will start Sept. 5th and all services are free.

They begin by helping the children complete homework, provide a snack or meal and then continue teaching, Reading, Writing, Math and Sciences to the children. Volunteers are needed as mentors. 1:1 time is important and they see improvement in behavior issues as well as anger management, even learn to take their own time out. Their whole mindset changes!

Many have poor parenting in their homes. Last Chance Ministries gave away back packs to help them. BTG wants also to help the community.

In 3rd grade he broke out of his shell and in 6rd grade was voted best all-around student.

He lived in NM and joined a dance group. Five of them did well and went to Hollywood where some got involved in drugs. He came back to SA and was convicted not to return with them. He went to Bible school instead. He worked as a drug abuse counselor. He began mentoring kids in performance and touring. At first it was not Faith-based. Four years ago he was back in SA in full time ministry which was hard for him. He feels there is a magnet to draw kids to Jesus. As he built his team, Nathan came. He does a lot of 1:1 with the kids. He had been with Youth for Christ. He found his purpose in CYPHER. It stands for C-Character, Y-youth empowerment, P-Purpose, H-Honor, E-Expressions by visual arts and R-Respect. Many youth do not respect and even demean older people.

Kids IQ's are higher but social skills are poorer in this generation. They teach about forms of worship, and expression of themselves. Contact: Facebook or Instagram/CYPHERmmvnt. They audition one time a year. Their needs include, a van for transportation, summer camp help, money and networking. Victor is also involved in "House of Hope" for at risk kids. It will be a residency for 13-18 year olds. He works with kids of all ages and even an advanced group. He closed in prayer.

This is the story of revival in the Muslim World, mainly in Iran. There are many people coming to Christ. "Heart for Iran" radio special is asking people to donate money for Bibles for Muslims in Iran.

Todd Chapman is host on the program, on behalf of the Heart of Iran. He told stories and spoke to people involved in getting them to Muslims who have become Christian or are interested. There are none in Iran and many that are available are fake. Jesus is building his church in Iran, the fastest in the world. Bibles are illegal. But the story of redemption is getting to them in many ways, often by sneaking them in and taking a chance on arrest for owning one.

Many of the Muslims are getting disillusioned and are seeking other religions. They are exposed to modern technology so it is becoming more available to them. Todd told the story of a man who had 3 Bibles and wanted God to tell him who to give them to. He came upon 3 men doing a crossword puzzle and the word was one of the Gospels. They didn't know what that meant so he gave them each a Bible.

The program is asking for people to donate money for Bibles: \$70 for 10, \$140 for 20 and \$700 for 100 Bibles. To give: 888 354 IRAN (4726) or BiblesforIran.com. They are in Farsi. At this time there is a matching gift so all donations will be doubled. He spoke to another man who went to Iran in 2014 to ignite the hearts and help Iran get Bibles and establish churches.

There is Satellites but they are also illegal but 40% of the homes have them so it is not enforced. Iran is very connected to the rest of the world. The population is literate and they want to read actual books. There are however challenges and dangers. The churches are underground, quiet and secretive but they do have a zeal for the Gospel. Christians are followed and watched and often their family is in danger. They try to have programs to distribute Bibles and a reminder the gifts will be doubled. Many believe there is a God but not sure who He is. "Don't be afraid of Muslims." Todd added. They are receptive to other cultures. Pray for Iran and give as you are able. The Spirit of God is moving and Iranian Christians need encouraged.
