1. Mental Health

	activities, can cause significant impairment in daily life. Possible causes, a combination of biological, psychological, and social sources of distress.

There is a wide range of conditions that affect mood, thinking, and behavior. Particularly important as well are examples of negative childhood experiences that can, in adulthood, impact on mental health, like abuse, neglect, trauma, and others.
12/2/2023	Social Media and Identity Crisis with Dr. Alberto Melena, Psychologist, Ventura County Medical Center. He explained how social media can feed an identity crisis with young adults. Understanding social media's new role in mental health is crucial to protect our youngsters.
12/9/2023	Mental Health- Part One with Angeles Small, Director with Ventura County Department of Health - Mental health is everything that is related to our behaviors, emotions, and attitudes. Mental health situations send more people to hospitals than cancer, according to the CDC-Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
12/16/2023	Mental Health- Part Two. Angeles Small- Director, Ventura County Dept. of Health returns. Children and young adolescents with symptoms of panic, difficult breathing, aggressiveness, overeating, oversleeping, can be taken for professional evaluation at a county mental health institution.

10/30/23	Pastor Jeff Tolle and wife Evelyn Tolle give their insights on Mental Health covers a wide variety - from depression to bi-polar and schizophrenia. So many are suffering from cases of depression and anxiety now. What is happening that we have so many now? Is medicine the best for most people? Is there another solution? We want fast solutions, but these may take time. Counseling is a great tool to deal with mental health matters.
10/31/23	Pastor Jeff Tolle and wife Evelyn Tolle give their insights on Mental Health - What gets repeated gets established. Young and old alike need to live with intentional healthy thoughts. Thoughts have great power over our outlook. Need to look beyond emotions. Our own negative thoughts can affect us i.e. "I'm ugly, I'm ugly" can take root to affect mental outlook. Think on the good. Care for your mind.

It is useful to look at our shame, anger and our reasons and reactions.

It is right to work and contribute to the family in daily chores and help and develop responsibility. Otherwise, our children can be attracted to the wrong places.
10/12/23	Pastor Jeff Tolle and wife Evelyn Tolle give their insights on raising children. Since more temptation is out there, we must focus on our kid's growth: emotionally, relationships, education, intellectual, spirituality. Prepare them for life, for higher education, for social situations, for leadership. When my child stole something, we stopped, went back to the manager, gave it back and apologized. Yes, he was ashamed, but then he felt better, and it is necessary to help them grow even in the difficult situations. Better learn now than later.
11/08/23	Pastor Jeff Tolle and wife Evelyn Tolle give their insights on how social media affects adult's mental health. Social Media can give the impression that others have perfect lives or business or churches. For some pastors, we can follow other churches and become jealous. Photos with filters. Great photos of events. Depression and anxiety are risks. Sometimes social media isolates us. We avoid real social contact because we are addicted to Instagram - we can watch hours and days on end - never seeing the same thing - it can be an addiction. We must be careful. Be firm for your mental health.
11/09/23	Diet, Exercise and Mental Health - Diet can affect mental health and exercise can help some. Diets high in refined sugar can affect the brain and body - even depression. High fat diets can affect body health. Lack of exercise affects the body. But a commitment to exercise can help your brain and body.

11/15/23	Character Development - Self-discipline converts to personal direction.
	For example - children learn to do things because it is the right thing to
	do. We want them to develop the correct decision-making. We will not
	be with our kids 24 hours a day - the need to know the right thing to do
	and choose to do it. So have conversations with them about what to do
	to make great choices automatic.
