Section I. Issues

The stations has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter.

- **A.** College of Wester Idaho/ Community Issues. The College of Western Idaho is one of the fastest growing community colleges in the country. CWI leadership explains why expansion is crucial to the local economy.
- **B.** Employment/Economic opportunities in the Treasure Valley. The leadership of the Southwest Idaho Manufactures Alliance explain job opportunities and business expansion in the Treasure Valley.

- L. Charitable/Community Partnership/Winter Weather Forecast. KTVB Meteorologist Larry Gebert looks at the upcoming Winter Weather in the Treasure Valley. He promotes his Polar Bear Challenge benefitting Make A Wish Idaho on New Year's Day.
- **M.** Previewing Idaho Legislature and the new Congress. Congressman-Elect Russ Fulcher, Idaho 1st Congressional District shares what it's like to be a freshman in Congress. He previews the new governor and Idaho Legislature.

A. College of Western Idaho/Community Issues/Higher Education. (10/7/18) CWI President Burt Gladden explains the challenges and growth of CWI. The college is one of the fastest growing community colleges in the nation. President Gladden is joined by Gary Hunter who explains the pros and cons of the proposed levy that would build CWI a medical building. President Gladden shares the multiple career opportunities that CWI brings to the state of Idaho.

- **B.** Employment/Idaho Economic Opportunities. (10/14/18) Sherri Johnson and Jake Reynolds from the Southwest Idaho Manufactures Alliance promote an upcoming job fair. They report on the number of new businesses coming to Idaho. The group is dedicated to helping Idaho based manufacturing businesses. Mrs. Johnson and Mr. Reynolds share what jobs are hot in the Gem State.
- C. Non Profit/For Profit Partnerships. (10/21/18) Happy Brands co-founders Jeanette and Mark Priddy launch a statewide campaign to feed the needy. The local entrepreneurs will donate 100,000 servings of oatmeal to the Idaho Foodbank to feed 100,000 Gem State families. One in six Idaho kids are food insecure. Happy Brands plan on making this an annual event in partnership with state grocery and convenience stores.
- **D.** Washington Politics/Midterm Election Preview. (10/28/18) Ohio Congressman Jim Jordan visits Idaho to preview the upcoming midterm elections. Congressman Jordan goes over the budget battles, the numerous congressional investigations, and the possibility of the Democrats controlling the House. He believes that Republicans should support the president by funding the wall.
- E. Cyber Security/Consumer Issues. (11/4/18) Cyber Expert Michael Daugherty previews the upcoming holiday buying season. Daugherty gives real tips on how consumers can avoid being personally hacked and held for ransom. The discussion turns to whether or not the federal government will/should use the Sherman Anti-Trust Act against social media giants, Amazon, Google, and Facebook.
- **F. Non Profit/Charitable Giving. (11/11/18)** Boise Rescue Mission CEO Reverend Bill Roscoe reports on the 60th anniversary of the rescue mission. Reverend Roscoe shares the success of the veteran's program. A program that employs and finds veteran's affordable housing. The Mission does not receive any local, state, or government funding. They promote Miller's Mission the annual turkey drive that feeds Treasure Valley Families workers.
- **G.** National Politics/First Amendment. (11/18/18) Documentary filmmaker and best-selling author, Dinesh D'Souza, reveals the nature of the relationship between the president and the press. He explains the importance of a non-biased press corps. Mr. D'Souza speaks to the history of the free press in America. He highlights the work of local journalism across the country. The author shares what it was like to be prosecuted by the federal government under the Obama Administration.
- **H.** Educational Reforms/Suicide Prevention. (11/25/18) Deanna Rhineheart, education expert, has developed a curriculum for elementary school students called Championeers. The goal is to help parents, teachers, and students cope with depression. Another goal is to identify troubled students

who have thoughts of suicide. Mrs. Rhinheart goes over warning signs to help parents cope with students that are not preforming. She emphasizes that everyone needs to listen to their kids. Her goal is to help Treasure Valley Schools with her national syllabus.

- I. National Politics/New Congress. (12/2/18) Cory Lewandowski, former campaign manager for President Trump, explains the difference between the Republicans controlling the House of Representatives and the Democrats controlling the House. He predicts that President Trump will get the border wall built. Mr. Lewandowski believes that we are stuck in a two year cycle of investigations led by House Democrats. He predicts that Republicans will get one more Supreme Court justice before the November 2020 election.
- J. First Amendment/Mueller Investigation. (12/9/18) Dr. Jerome Corsi, scientist, author, investigative reporter, give his firsthand account of being interrogated by the FBI and Special Counsel Robert Mueller. He explains his role in the Russian investigation. Dr. Corsi worries that the government will bankrupt more people like him because of their political beliefs. The author gives examples of how the government seeks to silence whistleblowers.
- K. Immigration/Crime/Border Issues. (12/16/18) Robert Spencer, author and reporter, explains the latest on the caravan. Mr. Spencer goes deep on the terror threat coming from Central America. He states that Idahoans should be wholeheartedly embrace the 'see something, say something dictate. Mr. Spencer reports on the threats to the West and the rest of the country during the upcoming holiday season.
- **L.** Charitable Giving/Community Partnership/Winter Weather. (12/23/18) KTVB Meteorologist Larry Gebert reviews the upcoming Winter Weather. He discusses the impact that multiple snow days has on the Idaho Economy. The more snow, the better it is for Idaho Ski Resorts. Mr. Gebert says that once again he is partnering with Make A Wish Idaho to raise money for this charity. He invites the public to take part in the 'Polar Bear Challenge' New Year's Day. All money raised will benefit Make A Wish Idaho.
- M. Idaho Legislative and New Congress Preview. (12/30/18) Congressman-Elect and former State Senator, Russ Fulcher exclusively shares what it's like to be a freshman in Congress. He talks about assembling a staff, getting on committees and freshman orientation. Congressman-Elect Fulcher describes how the Republicans, now in the minority, will work with the Democrats in the House. Fulcher previews the upcoming Idaho Legislative Season where a new governor will be sworn in and a record number of new member will be in the legislature.
