Week of January 1, 2024

Black Vegans

Recent research indicates that Black Americans are becoming vegan at a higher rate than any other racial or ethnic group in America. We speak to Black vegans, Keith Terrell, Sparkle Le’Star Burton and Arel Ben Israel, about why they choose a plant-based only diet, and how those who may be contemplating making the change can ease into the lifestyle successfully.

Animated Series: The Adventures of Super CJ

The first animated series that addresses mental health of black children has been launched. Yaba Baker created Black superhero ‘Super CJ’ to help tackle one of the most critical health challenges Black children face. Baker’s own issues with mental health and anger management inspired the animated series.

J.A.M.E.S

When Alisa Bell got pregnant in high school it was a hiccup, not an enduring setback. Now she helps dozens of young girls pursue their dreams of higher education while parenting and caring for themselves. Just About Mothers Excelling At School--J.A.M.E.S--is a cornerstone of the community, and it lifts up young Tulsa women during some of their most challenging times.

Week of January 8, 2024

Oklahoma’s Black Towns

From after the Civil War to the beginnings of Jim Crow, Oklahoma was a destination for freed Black people—a place to own land and rebuild their lives. America’s Black Forum visits Clearview, Oklahoma, one of that state’s 13 remaining Black townships. The Mayor, Marilyn Jackson, is hoping for a renaissance in Clearview--population 50.

Chicago French Press

Kris Christian is the visionary founder and CEO of Chicago French Press, a national beverage enterprise specializing in premium freshly roasted coffee and loose-leaf wellness teas. A trailblazer in the coffee

industry, Kris Christian represents as one of the few woman owned and operated coffee roasters and retailers in the US.

Black Designers in American Fashion

Black clothing designers have been around for hundreds of years, but their stories have gone untold. We'll meet Elizabeth Way, Editor of "Black Designers in American Fashion," a book that delves into the hidden histories of black designers. The book traces the lives of enslaved 18th Century dressmakers to 20th Century Superstar designers who helped build America's global fashion reputation.

Why are Black Men at a Greater Risk for a Stroke?

Black men are much more likely to die of a stroke than their white counterparts. America's Black Forum introduces one Milwaukee man who's successfully recovered from a stroke, another who's at risk, and Dr. Tito Izard, a Milwaukee doctor working to mend the health disparities for people like them.

Select Auto Parts and Sales

The auto parts business has traditionally been dominated by men. But not so much anymore. Especially in Milwaukee. That's where a woman is running a successful indoor used auto parts business. Not only is she a woman...she also happens to be black. We will learn how she started and what she does to make it work. Natasha Broxton is the only black woman in Wisconsin to own a thriving used auto parts store.

TIPS312

Meghan Young is the owner of the hottest new luxury nail salon in Chicago's West Loop neighborhood where she is only one of 5 Black-owned business owners in the entire community. Here, Meghan declares that she and her business are here to stay. She also explains how she developed her business model for an express nail salon, along with her plans to build TIPS312 into an international corporation.

Week of January 27, 2024

Blacks and the Cannabis Industry

As more and more states decriminalize recreational and medicinal cannabis use, Black people are finding their way into the retail and farming space. America's Black Forum speaks with the founders of Honey Hemp Farms and MONKO Dispensary about access, equity, and their efforts to uplift communities working through the cannabis industry.

Prison Sentence Leads to a New Journey

Nicholas Crayton was 18 years old when he was convicted of murder. After being released in 2022 and serving 24 years, he has a new lease on life. He's releasing a new book where he shares his journey to encourage and inspire others.

Top Dogg K9 Foundation

Blake Rashad struggled with mental illness most of his life. As a former army veteran and police officer, he recognized his colleagues were dealing with similar challenges. Blake and his wife Sheila created the Top Dogg K9 Foundation with the hopes of providing service dogs to veterans suffering from mental and physical health issues.

Black Brewers in the Craft Beer Industry

Elliott Johnson is an army of one in the craft beer space. The aerospace professional is also the CEO of DC-based craft beer company, Soul Mega. He embraces a unique philosophy for success and has a powerful business model. Johnson is tapping into the Washington-area beer scene while encouraging others to pursue their passions.

Chesa's Bistro & Bar

Chesa's Bistro & Bar was founded by Chef CheSa. She is also the proud owner of CheSa's Gluten Tootin Free Food Trucks. Chesa wanted to evolve from the food truck and catering scene and transform into a brick-and-mortar with a fusion of Creole and contemporary American cuisine that features an entirely gluten-free menu. CheSa shares how she recently launched her first full-service restaurant and how she was able to come back to her love of cooking after a life-threatening medical scare.

Brooklyn's Only Black-Owned Comedy & Live Music Venue

Brooklyn has recently seen the opening of the city's only Black-owned comedy and live music venue. The person responsible for this is New York's own, Ray Dejon, who in his earlier years, was a co-host on the longest-running hip-hop video show, Video Music Box. Ray has endured many life struggles and has reinvented himself many times. Now, he has opened a venue to bring relief to his hometown residents. Named 275 Park, the venue is in the Clinton Hill section of Brooklyn.

Week of February 10, 2024

Black Women and Postpartum

The birth of a child is one of the greatest joys in life. But, for some women, it's not so joyful. Postpartum Depression impacts more than 10 percent of new mothers in America. And it's seven times as bad for Black women. The reasons why are complicated. Postpartum Depression causes some women to lose interest in activities, or lose their appetite, while others can't even leave the house. In this story, we will hear how bad it got for April Sunny, a Baltimore mother, and what a University of North Carolina doctor says about the disorder.

The Sounds of Wayne Baker Brooks

Award-winning musician Wayne Baker Brooks combines various genres including blues, rock, soul, and funk. He grew up watching noted blues legends like Buddy Guy, Muddy Waters, and his father, Lonnie Brooks. They all paved the way for his love for music and their influence still drives him today.

Harlem's Streetsquash

StreetSquash is a youth development program providing consistent, long-term, and reliable support to children and families in Harlem. They have a 19,000-square-foot facility where there's a squash education program offering academic tutoring, intense squash instruction, community service, mentoring, literacy enrichment, college preparation, fitness, and nutrition programs.

Black Love Via Black Dating Sites

For Black singles, the landscape of finding love has changed dramatically. While traditional methods still exist, Black dating apps and websites have emerged as powerful tools for connection. Two former users of Black sites weigh in on their experiences. Relationship expert Love McPherson reminds us how to stay safe and maximize your chances of success when dating online.

The Black Ensemble Theater

The Black Ensemble Theater has been a beacon for theater and reimagination of performance and storytelling from the Black perspective. Jackie Taylor founded the Chicago theatre in 1976 after she grew frustrated with the scarcity of positive roles for Black actors. Expansion plans are underway for an artist's corridor, including affordable housing for artists, a film and technology center, and an arts education center.

Nourish + Bloom Market

Nourish + Bloom Market is the first autonomous grocery store with robotic delivery in the United States and the first African-American-owned autonomous grocery store in the world. Jamie and Jilea Hemmings are the owners and creators who discuss their mission to make eating healthy and convenient while helping to educate the community about A.I. technology.

Why are Black Men at a Greater Risk for a Stroke?

Black men are much more likely to die of a stroke than their white counterparts. America's Black Forum introduces one Milwaukee man who's successfully recovered from a stroke, another who's at risk, and Dr. Tito Izard, a Milwaukee doctor working to mend the health disparities for people like them.

Select Auto Parts and Sales

The auto parts business has traditionally been dominated by men. But not so much anymore. Especially in Milwaukee. That's where a woman is running a successful indoor used auto parts business. Not only is she a woman...she also happens to be black. We will learn how she started and what she does to make it work. Natasha Broxton is the only black woman in Wisconsin to own a thriving used auto parts store.

TIPS312

Meghan Young is the owner of the hottest new luxury nail salon in Chicago's West Loop neighborhood where she is only one of 5 Black-owned business owners in the entire community. Here, Meghan declares that she and her business are here to stay. She also explains how she developed her business model for an express nail salon, along with her plans to build TIPS312 into an international corporation.

Week of March 2, 2024 (repeat)

Blacks and the Cannabis Industry

As more and more states decriminalize recreational and medicinal cannabis use, Black people are finding their way into the retail and farming space. Chesa's Bistro & Bar

Chesa's Bistro & Bar was founded by Chef CheSa. She is also the proud owner of CheSa's Gluten Tootin Free Food Trucks. Chesa wanted to evolve from the food truck and catering scene and transform into a brick-and-mortar with a fusion of Creole and contemporary American cuisine that features an entirely gluten-free menu. CheSa shares how she recently launched her first full-service restaurant and how she was able to come back to her love of cooking after a life-threatening medical scare.

Brooklyn's Only Black-Owned Comedy & Live Music Venue

Brooklyn has recently seen the opening of the city's only Black-owned comedy and live music venue. The person responsible for this is New York's own, Ray Dejon, who in his earlier years, was a co-host on the longest-running hip-hop video show, Video Music Box. Ray has endured many life struggles and has reinvented himself many times. Now, he has opened a venue to bring relief to his hometown residents. Named 275 Park, the venue is in the Clinton Hill section of Brooklyn.

Black Women and Postpartum

The birth of a child is one of the greatest joys in life. But, for some women, it's not so joyful. Postpartum Depression impacts more than 10 percent of new mothers in America. And it's even twice as bad for Black women. The reasons why are complicated. Postpartum Depression causes some women to lose interest in activities, or lose their appetite, while others can't even leave the house. In this story, we will hear how bad it got for April Sunny, a Baltimore mother, and what a University of North Carolina doctor says about the disorder.

The Sounds of Wayne Baker Brooks

Matter of Fact, January 7, 2024

America's livestock and dairy industries are worth more than \$100 billion annually. To ensure animals' health, farmers and ranchers need access to veterinary services. But in 2023, more than 230 regions across 47 states were designated as "Veterinarian Shortage Areas" by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. That's the most ever. Correspondent Jessica Gomez takes us to South Dakota to meet a veterinarian struggling with a brutal workload and the young student training to one day take over the role.

Wawa Gatheru, 25, is an inaugural member of a new Environmental Protection Agency council. It's the EPA's first-ever national youth advisory council. The committee is made up of 16 people between the ages of 16 and 29. They're now tasked with providing the EPA administrator with policy advice and recommendations for environmental issues including climate change, environmental justice and air quality. Gatheru shares her hopes for the committee and explains how young people can use history as a guide for addressing climate change.

The United Methodist Church is fracturing. More than 7,000 congregations have received permission to break away from the UMC since 2019. The divide is driven in large part by disagreements over the church's approach to LGBTQ policy. This fracturing isn't unique to the UMC. Correspondent Dina Demetrius traveled to Michigan, where a youth pastor and his family are coming to grips with losing their own faith community over his refusal to denounce the LGBTQ community.

The Great Recession. The Big Quit. In recent years, many Americans left their jobs citing frustrations like stagnant pay. But now, a new survey shows several professions are seeing substantial wage increases. Soledad breaks down who's making more and who isn't.

Finally, where do train cars go when they're retired? Soledad has the story about a centuries-old method of getting rid of old vehicles, while fostering a thriving marine environment.

Matter of Fact, January 14, 2024

The United States has the highest population of incarcerated people in the world. That includes thousands of people awaiting trial, unable to afford their bail. Several states and local governments have recently reformed their bail systems. In Michigan, advocates for reform hope to see action by the end of the year while opponents argue any changes will threaten public safety. Correspondent Dan Lieberman travels to Michigan and speaks with a sheriff, a judge and a woman who spent months behind bars as a teen, unable to pay her bail.

More than 400 million children live in countries where there is ongoing war or violent conflict. And these fights are often protracted, like the conflict between Israel and Palestine and the war in Ukraine. Dr. Zlatina Kostova is a clinical psychologist with the University of Massachusetts. She's helping train mental health providers in Ukraine on how to assist children living through war. She tells Soledad about how war impacts children's brains and development and what can be done to help them cope with the toxic stress created by their environment.

Even as more and more people "get online," the digital divide persists. According to Pew Research Center, more than 40% of adults making under \$30,000 do not own a laptop or computer. A business in Minnesota is working to change that by providing people with free or discounted computers. Correspondent Laura Chavez meets the owner and creator of PCs for People and a woman who says the organization changed her life.

The 2024 primary season gets underway with the Republican caucus in Iowa followed by the New Hampshire primary. As voters decide who will be on the general election ballot, some states are trying to decide whether they should rethink their primary process. For example, Arizona, Idaho and Oregon are all considering moving to nonpartisan primaries. Soledad breaks down which states are considering what changes.

Finally, some of the best-known artists in the world contributed to an amusement park in the 1980s. It opened for a short time in Hamburg, Germany and then was virtually forgotten. That is until now. Soledad tells the story behind "Luna Luna: Forgotten Fantasy," now open to the public in Los Angeles, CA.

Matter of Fact, January 21, 2024

The winter cold is adding urgency to the migrant crisis in many major cities including New York, Chicago and Denver. In New York City, more than 170,000 migrants have arrived since Spring 2022, straining the city's support system. But St. Louis, MO, which has a history of rolling out the welcome mat to refugees, sees the migrants' arrival as an opportunity. An organization there is creating programs to help asylum-seekers from the Southern border, hoping they can resettle there and boost the city's economy. Correspondent Joie Chen travels to the Gateway to the West and meets with the people who immigrated there years ago.

Rob Reiner is many things: actor, director, filmmaker and now, podcaster. As the son of comedian and Emmy-winning actor Carl Reiner, it's clear the entertainment industry is in his blood. Soledad visited Rob Reiner at his home in California where he told her about growing up as Carl Reiner's son, his most

personally meaningful works, and his fascination with the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. That fascination led him to launch his latest project, “Who Killed JFK,” a podcast he and Soledad partnered on.

This year brings a major development for veterans struggling with PTSD and depression. The Veteran Affairs Department announced it will fund studies into whether psychedelic-assisted therapy is helpful in treating mental health disorders for former military personnel. This comes after lobbying by several combat veterans who say they turned to psychedelics as a last resort. Correspondent Jessica Gomez sits down with a former Marine who shares how the treatment worked for him.

As the 2024 election officially gets underway with the start of primaries, recent polling by the Bipartisan Policy Center shows more than 80% of voters are worried about the state of America’s democracy. One voting method that’s garnering traction as a possible solution is rank-choice voting. Soledad breaks down how rank-choice voting works and why some are warning against it.

Finally, large portions of the country have been dealing with snowy, icy roads. While salt is key to keeping the roads safe, some states and municipalities are adding another ingredient to the mix: beet juice. The molasses-like byproduct of beets lowers the freezing-point of ice. It also has environmental benefits, lowering the amount of salt needed to treat the roads. But Soledad explains that, as with anything, it’s not a miracle cure.

Matter of Fact, January 28, 2024

America’s teachers are finding themselves on the frontlines of the youth mental health crisis. According to a government survey in 2021, 42% of high schoolers reported feeling persistently sad or hopeless. This is especially challenging for rural communities that lack the access to treatment centers. Correspondent Dina Demetrius visited a school in the California desert that’s launched a new program aimed at providing students with better mental health support. She introduces us to the teachers running the program and a student who says it’s made a major impact on her, and her friends’ lives.

Beverly Johnson made history in 1974 as the first Black model to appear on the cover of American Vogue. But Johnson tells Soledad while there has been progress in the fashion industry towards greater diversity and inclusion, there’s still work to be done. Johnson is marking the fiftieth anniversary of her breakthrough cover with a one-woman show in New York City. She talks with Soledad about the show, the modeling industry and her fascinating career.

It took several days following the 2020 Presidential Election before it was clear who had won the White House. That’s because election workers needed more time to properly to process and count the influx of mail-in ballots. Now some states are considering changes to their ballot-processing rules to ensure things run more smoothly, and quickly, in future elections. Soledad breaks down the potential changes.

Home ownership is out of reach for millions of Americans. Housing prices are high as are interest rates. And affordable housing advocates say private investment companies are further upsetting the market. Correspondent Dan Lieberman traveled to Milwaukee to see how one innovative program is helping residents compete against private companies for the keys to their first homes.

Finally, plastic six-pack rings are getting a more environmentally friendly upgrade. A company in Mexico has developed six and four-pack holders that are 100% biodegradable and won’t pollute oceans or landfills. Soledad has the details.

Matter of Fact, February 4, 2024

The Supreme Court will soon hear a case that is critical to the presidential primary calendar. A group of Republican and unaffiliated voters in Colorado said that former President Trump cannot be on the state's Republican primary ballot. Their decision pertains to the 14th Amendment, which states that anyone who has taken an oath to the Constitution and gone on to engage in insurrection, cannot hold office. In early 2022, Kim Wehle, a professor at the University of Baltimore School of Law, was one of the first people to note the 14th Amendment's potential impact on any future run by former President Trump. Soledad speaks with Wehle about how the Supreme Court might handle the case.

"I have finally gotten so I'm not angry, but it's taken a long time." Those are the words of educator and Portland, OR native, Donna Maxey. She was 12 years old when her family was forced out of a predominantly Black community. The city had claimed much of their neighborhood, called Albina, for what it dubbed "urban renewal." Their home, and her father's business, were demolished along with dozens of others. Correspondent Alexis Clark visited Portland where a non-profit now has a bold plan to build a new community where the neighborhood once stood.

More than 30 million children in America can't afford school meals, increasing lunch debt for many. During the pandemic the government paid for every public-school student to eat, but now only nine states offer free meals. Correspondent Laura Chavez traveled to Pennsylvania, where advocates are pushing for free lunches, to talk to teachers and cafeteria employees who are fighting for all children to eat.

Plus, tax season is underway, and this year brings some big changes. Tax brackets have been amended and could prove favorable for many families. And for those moving to cleaner energy, the IRS is offering tax credits on new electric vehicles, as well as for any energy-efficient home improvement. Soledad reports about additional changes and tools to help you file.

Finally, most workers in the U.S. have desk jobs. According to a new study published by the American Medical Association, that's taking a toll on people's health. Those who sit all day have a 16% higher risk of mortality - from all causes - than those who have more active jobs. But the research also found that if desk-workers did 15 to 30 minutes of additional exercise each day, the increased health risks disappear.

Matter of Fact, February 11, 2024

As Congress stalls on border legislation, the residents of Denver are confronting the migrant crisis head on. More than 38,000 migrants have arrived in Denver in the last 14 months, straining the city's services. Now, local volunteers and business owners are filling the gap. Correspondent Jessica Gomez traveled to Denver to meet the city's new mayor and a local motel owner who has opened her doors, taking in hundreds of migrants in need of shelter.

Lilliana Mason is a political psychologist who for years has been tracking Americans' feelings about politics. Recently, she started to notice a disturbing trend. As Americans became more divided politically and geographically, they became more distrusting, hostile and even accepting of political violence against people in the opposing party. In fact, these sentiments were particularly high around the January 6th insurrection. Mason shares her findings with Soledad and explains how George Washington actually warned hundreds of years ago that this could happen.

"Our voices were largely absent from the conversation and we had really important insights." Those are the words of Aaliyah Bilal, a Black Muslim American. When she realized she didn't see anyone like herself in the media, literature or the national conversation, she decided to do something about it. Her

resulting book, “Temple Folk”, landed the first-time author a final spot in the National Book Award in 2023. She shares how she approached the book and the role she hopes it plays in shedding light on the Black Muslim experience.

Tip earners are not guaranteed the minimum wage under federal law, but some states are considering stepping in. Many tip workers earn the federal sub-minimum wage of \$2.13. If their tips plus those wages don't add up to the federal minimum wage of \$7.25 an hour, employers are expected to make up the difference, but industry analysts say many don't. Now some states are considering ballot measures that would require businesses to pay all employees the minimum wage, regardless of whether they earn tips or not.

Finally, researchers would like you to go outside and count the birds. The annual Great Backyard Bird Count runs from February 16 to 19. Participants are asked to spend 15 minutes counting and recording all the birds they see or hear. They then report that information to the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. Birds are an excellent indicator of environmental issues, so the global count helps researchers build a better understanding of the world around us.

Matter of Fact, February 18, 2024

It's the first in the South! South Carolina's Republican primary is fast approaching, and it's gained a reputation for being incredibly important in the race for the White House. South Carolina's Republican voters have a nearly perfect record of picking the eventual presidential nominee. And this election is especially interesting with the state's former governor on the ballot. Nikki Haley won South Carolina twice as governor and was quite popular in the state. But, as Gibbs Knotts, chair of the Political Science Department at the College of Charleston, explains to Soledad, Haley is up against someone who also won the state twice and is extremely popular with its voters, former President Donald Trump.

Philadelphia's Chinatown is one of the oldest in the country. But now, the National Trust for Historic Preservation lists it as one of America's most endangered historic places. The organization sites a plan to build a new basketball arena abutting the neighborhood, as the primary threat. Residents worry the years-long construction project could block its streets, hurting local businesses. But the developers tell special correspondent Joie Chen that their project would actually benefit the community and that private investment is “critical for the long-term health and vibrance of Center City.” Joie Chen travels to the City of Brotherly Love where a community finds itself caught between development and preserving identity.

America's schools are facing shortages on several fronts: teachers, custodians and in many places, bus drivers. Correspondent Laura Chavez travels to a school district in Carroll, Iowa that's taking an all-hands-on-deck approach to getting kids to class. Everyone from teachers to the school superintendent is driving a bus, easing the burden on the parents like Adam and Bailey Warnke whose son uses a wheelchair and needs a specially equipped bus to get to school.

In the 1980s, America's malls were in their prime. But recently, spurred by the convenience of online shopping, malls have struggled, and many have had to close their doors. That's left massive, empty retail spaces across the country. Dr. Resa Lewiss, a professor of emergency medicine and physician health care designer, is lobbying for these spaces to be converted into medical malls. Medical malls are one-stop-shops for health care needs. From seeing the doctor to getting an MRI to physical therapy, it would all be under one roof. Dr. Lewiss says such centers could be especially helpful for disadvantaged neighborhoods where people often lack access to proper health care.

Finally, humans are changing the geology of the planet. Scientists have found that plastics in our environment are starting to fuse with rocks. These part-plastic rocks have been found in more than 11 countries. Now, scientists say they're distinctive and pervasive enough to merit their own designation as a type of sedimentary rock. Soledad takes us to science class.

Matter of Fact, February 25, 2024

Buckeye, Arizona is one of the country's fastest growing cities. The historically small agriculture community is now the center of several major residential builds. But as the mega drought wears on, city officials are searching for new sources of water to sustain growth and a future with more people. Correspondent Dan Lieberman heads to the city on the outskirts of Phoenix and talks to the mayor and residents about the challenges and possible solutions.

Nearly 17 million people have lost Medicaid coverage in the last 11 months. On the face of it, that number seems staggering. But Matt Salo, former founding Executive Director of the National Association of Medicaid Directors, tells Soledad the program is simply right sizing following the pandemic. But some people who still qualify are losing their health coverage. Salo explains the steps states are taking to minimize that number and what they're doing to help those removed reenroll quickly.

Colorado is one of the many states headed to the primary polls on Super Tuesday. The Centennial State has had a fair amount of turnover in its election offices since the 2020 presidential race. More than a third of the election administrators have either quit or left their jobs because of term limits. We introduce you to Jefferson County's clerk, Amanda Gonzalez, who's taken on the job others are walking away from.

The Great Resignation is being replaced by the Great Retirement. During the pandemic there was a spike in retirements but according to new modeling by the St. Louis Federal Reserve, we're seeing a second surge. The analysis projects that there are nearly three million more people retired now than originally predicted. What's that mean for the balance of the economy as more baby boomers reach retirement age? Wendy Edelberg of the Brookings Institution explains.

Finally, this month NASA's Mars rover, Perseverance, is marking three years since its arrival on the Red Planet. The little rover is continuing to amaze. Soledad shows some of the images it just captured of a solar eclipse on Mars, as one of the planet's moons crossed in front of the sun.

Matter of Fact, March 3, 2024

Children are missing school at a record rate in the United States. During the 2021-2022 school year, nearly 15 million students were chronically absent. That's almost twice what it was before the pandemic. "If we don't address this issue among our youngest learners, we are going to suffer huge consequences as they grow older," says Hedy Chang, the executive director of Attendance Works. Now, one school in Virginia is taking a new, more personal approach to getting kids back into the classroom by working with their families. Correspondent Jessica Gomez travels to Richmond, VA and meets the people going door-to-door to make sure kids are getting the education they need.

Wastewater testing is quickly becoming an important tool for communities' health. This testing method rose to prominence during the Coronavirus pandemic as a way to measure infection rates at a time when individual tests were still hard to come by. BioBot, an MIT startup in Massachusetts, assisted in that testing but its head of chemistry, Kaitlyn Hess Jimenez, says wastewater can help communities with so much more, from detecting other illnesses like flu to substances like medications in wastewater.

Finding love online can be exciting but it can also be exhausting. Researchers say our brains can only process a few options at a time, making “dating app fatigue” an issue as people become overwhelmed by possible connections. Correspondent Laura Chavez talks with a dating app expert about the impact all that swiping, and messaging has on our brains.

Methane is a greenhouse gas that traps heat, raising the earth’s temperature. Researchers say cutting methane emissions from fossil fuel operations, agriculture and other sectors could slow global warming by as much as 30%. But tracking the sources of those emissions is challenging. One solution could be an innovative satellite that is about to launch. It will provide accurate, detailed, free mapping of methane emissions around the world.

Finally, this spring brings an historic event. For the first time in more than two centuries, two broods of cicadas will emerge at the same time. Soledad explains that while annoying and maybe a little unsettling, this massive influx of cicadas actually has environmental benefits.

Matter of Fact, March 10, 2024

Comedian and Alabama native Roy Wood Jr. joins Soledad in the studio to talk about the 2024 election, his passion for baseball and his commitment to his home state. He says, “a lot of people make a mistake of thinking that the news that comes out of Alabama represents all of the people that are in Alabama, and that's not the truth.” Alabama is on the verge of making state history if it sends a second Black representative to the U.S. Congress. Roy Wood Jr. also digs into the role and responsibility of comedy in politics.

And we head to Virginia to meet a retired coal miner who suffers from black lung. The disease is caused by exposure to silica dust which, when inhaled, can damage and scar lungs. John Robinson is being treated in an Appalachian clinic that has seen a spike in cases. From 2013 to 2017, more than 400 people were diagnosed with black lung. Robinson, who started working underground when he was 20 years old, shares his story.

Plus, at least 10 million people around the world are considered stateless, someone who the UN defines as “not recognized as a national by any state under operation of its law.” More than 200,000 of them live in the United States. Matter of Fact’s special correspondent Joie Chen talked to two stateless people trying to navigate their unusual immigration situations.

Some U.S. cities are turning to zoning reform to try and mitigate the country’s housing crisis. Strategies they’re employing include allowing multifamily homes to be built in neighborhoods that traditionally only had single-family dwellings. Stephen Menendian, the University of California, Berkley’s assistant director of the “Othering and Belonging Institute,” tells us about an interactive map tracking these zoning reform efforts.

Finally, our Viewfinder segment features images from the annual Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Houston Chronicle photographers give viewers a glimpse of the world’s largest show and rodeo of its kind, with famous musicians, carnival rides and portraits of some of the more than two million people expected to attend this year’s event.

Matter of Fact, March 17, 2024

With nearly 400,000 children in foster care, the system is strained. That means when kids turn 18, they’re often pushed out of the system and on their own. Young people who age out of foster care are more likely to experience homelessness and incarceration. Correspondent Laura Chavez travels to

Boulder County, Colorado where volunteers and non-profits are stepping in to make sure these young people land on their feet.

From work contracts to internships to grants, a series of lawsuits across the country is taking aim at programs that help minorities. One of the latest cases is against the Minority Business Development Agency (MBDA), a federal agency that's been around more than 50 years. A federal judge in Texas says it's violating the constitution by providing services based on race. Soledad speaks with civil rights attorney Alphonso David about the ruling's potential impact. David also represents the Fearless Fund, an organization that's being sued because it helps businesses run by women of color.

Plus, this winter didn't feel much like winter at all for most of the United States. According to NOAA, this was the warmest winter on record for the Lower 48. It's the latest indication of the impacts of climate change. The Environmental Protection Agency is seeking some fresh perspectives as it looks to address climate concerns. It's launched the first-ever federal advisory council comprised solely of young people. We meet a 25-year-old climate activist who now sits on that panel.

There's a national push to remove the lead service pipes still carrying water to millions of homes. This effort could be getting a little easier, thanks to researchers at Drexel University, who say that by pinging a pipe still buried underground and measuring the sound waves, they can determine whether it is made of lead.

Finally, the Smithsonian Women's History Museum is marking Women's History Month with an inaugural online exhibition. Digital curator Liz Harmon explains that the exhibit brings attention to some of history's hidden women.

Matter of Fact, March 24, 2024

Swatting is when someone calls 911 reporting an active attacker at a location. Law enforcement and SWAT teams race to the scene, weapons at the ready. But these calls are completely fabricated and that means an unsuspecting person and their family are shocked by an intense police response. Lawmakers are some of the most common targets, and with incidents rising, the FBI has launched a national database to track these calls. In Georgia, a rash of calls recently sent police rushing to several lawmakers' homes. Correspondent Dan Lieberman traveled to Atlanta where those representatives are now coming together across the aisle to stop swatting.

On Tuesday the Supreme Court takes up one of its biggest cases of the term. It involves mifepristone, one of the most used abortion pills. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved mifepristone in 2000. And then twice it expanded access to the drug, including allowing doctors to prescribe it via Telehealth appointment. Now, a group of anti-abortion doctors is challenging the FDA's expanded access to the drug. Amy Howe covers the Supreme Court and joins Soledad in the studio to discuss the potential impact this case could have on both access to mifepristone and the FDA's approval process.

Baseball season's opening day is March 28th, but one former player is trying for a different kind of win, one for his hometown. Cleon Jones was part of the "Mighty Mets", the team that won the 1969 World Series. Even though he retired from the game decades ago, Jones hasn't slowed down. For the last 40 years he has been revitalizing his hometown of Africatown. Alexis Clark visits the Mobile, Alabama neighborhood to see what Jones is doing to save the place that gave him his start.

New maps reveal several cities along the east coast are sinking at an alarming rate. New York City and Baltimore are dropping by an average of almost two millimeters a year. Charleston, South Carolina is

one of the fastest-sinking cities; the downtown area is just ten feet above sea level. Soledad reports on the reasons and potential solutions to stop the sink.

Finally, a tiny fish is creating an underwater cacophony. Recently discovered in Myanmar, the *Danionella Cerebrum* lives in murky waters. German scientists discovered that the fish makes an incredibly loud noise, comparable to a jet engine. Soledad shares their findings.

Matter of Fact, March 31, 2024

From overseeing the election to the power of voters, this week Matter of Fact focuses on the foundations of democracy.

The presidential election is just months away but with high turnover in election offices, are states ready for voting day? According to a survey by the Brennan Center for Justice, this will be the first presidential election for one in five local election officials. Correspondent Dan Lieberman travels to Pennsylvania, one of the states looking to recruit and retain its election staff. Officials there tell him more security and support are needed to improve conditions for the people at the backbone of our democratic process.

Nearly 70 percent of U.S. adults say the political climate is a significant source of stress in their lives, according to the American Psychological Association. But a political cartoonist is hoping brevity, and some levity, can help people engage in politics. Soledad sits down with award-winning cartoonist Christopher Weyant who says his goal isn't to change minds but to make people think about important issues.

Every vote counts, but where you live can impact how your vote counts. In Ohio, advocates are concerned that current voting maps are gerrymandered to weaken the political power of minorities. Redistricting has been a long-running issue in the state, and a commission was founded to help draw fairer maps. But critics say the commission is making the situation worse. Correspondent Diane Roberts travels to Ohio and meets the people divided over the state's dividing lines.

During an election year, billions of dollars go to turning out the vote. The last three national general elections saw some of the highest voter turnout in decades. Still, less than 40% of Americans voted in all three elections. That's according to new numbers from the Pew Research Center. Soledad explains what the findings tell us about who is and who isn't heading to the polls.

Finally, we pivot from politics to astronomy. NASA is looking to build on research from the 1930s during April's solar eclipse. Soledad explains the project and why NASA is asking for your help to complete this mission.
