Two new programs were added this quarter:

“Down on the Farm.” Approximately hour-long, agriculturally focused interviews with knowledgeable about issues affecting farming in the San Joaquin Valley. Hosted by Tom Willey, organic farmer. Broadcast Saturdays at 6:00 a.m. and at 8:00 p.m.

Program: **The Peril and the Promise**
