### **Outreach Events**

#### **August 7, 2020**

The Association of Schools of Journalism and Mass Communication (ASJMC), representing accredited j-schools in the US and overseas. ASJMC selected Radio Bilingüe's Executive Director, Hugo Morales, as the recipient of its 2020 Gerald Sass Distinguished Service Award, presented each year to a leading professional for transformative contribution to the fields of journalism and journalism education.

Mr. Morales was the featured speaker at the Awards virtual ceremony, which took place on August 7, 2020. In his acceptance speech he talked about RB's work and significance within public media in the United States.

#### **May 13, 2021**

María Eraña, Director of Broadcasting, moderated a public virtual forum on housing issues during the COVID-19 pandemic. Ms. Eraña had an opportunity to talk about Radio Bilingüe's work in offering reliable and timely information to Spanish-speaking residents in its areas of coverage on the prevention of COVID-19 as well as support and services available for people affected by the pandemic.

#### **June 10, 2021**

Chelis López, co-host of Radio Bilingüe's national talk show, Línea Abierta (Open Line), hosted a public virtual forum with the goal of helping to dispel myths about COVID vaccines. The forum was conducted in Spanish and was presented by the California Department of Public Health.

Ms. López had the opportunity to introduce Radio Bilingüe's work in combating misinformation about the COVID vaccine among Latinos.

**June 19, 2021**

Radio Bilingüe's Executive Director, Hugo Morales, represented Radio Bilingüe at a community event in Arvin, California, in Kern County. The San Juan Bautista celebration event was attended by around 500 farmworkers and their families, and it took place from 1 p.m. to 2 a.m.

Mr. Morales and Radio Bilingüe's volunteer programmer, Natalia Bautista were the MC's at the event and they were able to promote Radio Bilingüe's work, focusing on our programming targeting indigenous Mixteco farmworkers in California and the United States. Mr. Morales and Ms. Bautista also took the opportunity to talk to people about the importance of taking the COVID vaccine and to encourage attendees to register to get it.
