- A. **Special Needs Adults**: Karen Davis and Brian Hengkens with LARC spoke with us about how they work to help adult handicapped individuals gain employment and live prosperous lives through working in the community.
- B. **Economic Improvement:** Mark Mouton, Director of Program and Business Development for the Lafayette Economic Development Authority spoke about how we use tax revenue to fund local improvement projects in the eight parishes in Acadiana.
