QUARTERLY ISSUES & PROGRAMS LIST

There follows a listing of some of the most significant issues responded to by station WEDG-FM, Buffalo, New York, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period April 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority. The issues were covered on WEDG-FM's public affairs program on the dates indicated. The program is 30 minutes long and begins at 8am on Sundays.

ISSUE: United Way Slawson1, United Way Slawson 2 DATE: April 7, 2019 DURATION: 28:00 (2 14-minute segments) DESCRIPTION: Interview with our April Ambassador for United Way: Families

ISSUE: It Happened to Alexa DATE: April 14, 2019 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Alexa was a college student in Boston who was from Bflo when she was attacked on campus. She then had to endure a long ordeal before the trial. She needed her family near her, and fortunately her parents were able to make the trip to Boston to be by her side. After her long and traumatic trial ended, Tom and Stacey-her parents realized that many families do not have the financial ability to do so. Not wanting a lack of funds to prevent another rape victim from prosecuting his or her attacker, Thomas and Stacey Branchini co-founded It Happened to Alexa. The mission is to empower survivors of rape and sexual assault and to facilitate the prosecution of their offenders by providing financial, emotional, and advocacy assistance to the survivors and/or supporter at the time of trial. They make support kits for victims, and assist victim from across the US, not just in the Buffalo area.

ISSUE: Pink Pillow Project DATE: April 14, 2019 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the impact of breast cancer on those diagnosed, the pain that is not well recognized to those without the disease, the story behind the pink pillow by breast cancer survivors, how they are funded and discussed where to get more information and how to get help and Fundraiser with meat raffle.

ISSUE: Keeping Your Feet Healthy DATE: April 21, 2019 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed the launch of the new consumer search for a podiatrist near you, the importance of WNY leadeship in state and national professional associations, why diabetics need to have routine podiatric care, how the medical society is funded to promote consumer awareness and safety and how to find more information

ISSUE: Camp Hope 2018 DATE: April 21, 2019 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Discussed what the criteria are for admission to hospice, the latest developments in Niagara Hospice's dementia patient care program, who is eligible to participate and receive services, what services hospice provides and what are the new collaborations, how they are funded, how the community can get more information, how to help with volunteerism and events upcoming, and how to get more information for family members and patients interested.

ISSUE: Dr. Dubovsky's update to WNY on CPEP and psychiatric services in WNY DATE: April 28, 2019 DURATION: 28:00 DESCRIPTION: Discussed what services CPEP provides, urgent need for comprehensive psychiatric services, post-partum depression in WNY, new medication options, where to get help and find out more information.

ISSUE: Untied Way Girls in Sports – Segments 1& 2 DATE: May 5, 2019 DURATION: (2) 14-minute segments DESCRIPTION:

Interview with our WNY Girls In Sports Program Director Daycia Clarke. Girls In Sports' goal is to educate and empower young girls in our community through sports. Often times, adolescent girls aren't encourage to join sporting teams, or don't have them available. WNY Girls in Sports offers a biannual event bringing together over 200 girls to sample new sports, offers after-school sports clinics, and helps schools expand regular athletic programing for young women.

ISSUE: 8 Days of Hope DATE: May 12, 2019 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Eight Days of Hope is a Christian, non-profit organization that is both evangelical and non-denominational. They exist to demonstrate the love and hope of Jesus Christ by serving those in need. This summer they will be in Buffalo for 8 days to rebuild home for 100 families. They will be focusing on the University district. They are looking for volunteers to help with the rebuilds, but skills are not limited to only construction people. They need people to prepare lunch and dinner, people who are "runners", etc. Anyone is welcome no matter their religious background. They have helped and rebuilt over 5200 homes across the US – who were affected by flooding, hurricanes, etc. They also help with their rapid relief disaster recovery efforts.

ISSUE: InfoTech WNY DATE: May 12, 2019 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

InfoTechWNY's mission is to serve as WNY's professional organization promoting technology through networking, education, recognition and career enrichment. They started in the late 1990's when technology was not booming like it is now, so at the time, they were important to businesses & organizations to teach them how to use computer programs, now they still assist since technology is always changing. InfoTech WNY holds regular meetings at which a cross-section of business and technology issues are discussed, including: technology resources; workforce retention; regional technology infrastructure; governmental policies with regard to the technology industry; financial resources; funding resources; and private, business and education institutions.

ISSUE: Stroke Awareness DATE: May 19, 2019 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

We talked about what a stroke actually is, also how to detect symptoms, what are risk factors and how to avoid them. kevin explains that there is a stroke every 40 seconds, and many people suffer mini strokes & do not know it. he also mentions that post stroke care is important. Catholic Health in Buffalo, NY is a non-profit healthcare system that provides care to Western New Yorkers across a network of hospitals, primary care centers, imaging centers, and several other community ministries. May is stroke awareness month.

ISSUE: DWI DATE: May 26, 2019 DURATION: 14:00 DESCRIPTION:

Deanna lost her sister to a drunk driver. She was only 18, and was a passenger in a car that a drunk driver hit. She was the only one who died in the crash. The man who hit her was arrested earlier in the day for DWI but posted bond & was able to get his car back. Deanna wants people to know, especially in the time of graduation parties and proms and summer festivals that drinking and driving can kill. She is not against drinking, but urges you to make a plan. Take a ride share or cab or make arrangement for a ride. Do not get behind the wheel after you have been drinking.

ISSUE: United Way Thrive – Segments 1 & 2 DATE: June 2, 2019 DURATION: (2) 14-minute segments DESCRIPTION: Interview with United Way leaders involved with the creation of THRIVE Buffalo ______, a new workforce training and development___pipeline that helps disenfranchised individuals in our community acquire the right skills for current,

living-wage jobs.

ISSUE: Elder Law DATE: June 9, 2019 DURATION: 28:00 DESCRIPTION: Discussed how to get free help, how to volunteer, what free services they offer The Public and how to get it

ISSUE: Armed Forces Week DATE: June 16, 2019 DURATION: 28:00 DESCRIPTION: Discussed history of armed forces week, annual activities in May to honor current service and veterans, special highlight for KIA. They also assist people who need to braile, they advocate for the blind community. The national chapter is in Baltimore. They hold summer camps for kids and this year the Buffalo camp will be in July. They also help parents of blind children. The organization also has added technology and provides it to blind individuals.

To open an animal sanctuary. She found acres of land in Newfane and named the sanctuary after her dog.
