C. Continuing Your Mental Health Journey:

This program helps clients to get those next steps in getting a job interview to help boost self-esteem with dental work. The program works with dentist to help with all dental work that may need it in the community. Information was given to listeners on how they could be a part of this free program and if they have any addition questions who to call.

E. What Lead to the Largest Higher Education Strike in U.S. History?

For the Record - Aired on March 19, 2023 at 6:20 AM; Duration 10 Minutes. This is a public-affairs program, hosted by Viewpoints, Marty Peterson. Late last year, more than 48,000 graduate students, researchers, and teaching assistants unionized and went on strike against the University of California system, encompassing nine college campuses. Across the state, schools like Berkley, UCLA, and University of California-San Diego to name a few came to a standstill as thousands demanded higher pay, better healthcare and other improves benefits. Marty speaks with Kelsey Wardlow (who went on strike) about her experience and why unionizing felt like the right path forward.

F. Online Employment Scams Hitting the Tri-States

For the Record - Aired on March 26, 2023 at 8:20 AM; Duration 5 Minutes. This is a public-affairs program, hosted by Operations Manager, Samantha Barnes. Don' O' Brien from the Better Business Bureau issued a warning to listeners who are posting resumes on websites. You want to make sure that there is no personal information on your resumes that can be used to steal your identity. If an employee is interested in your resume they will ask you for personal information in person, you have no idea who you are talking to over the phone or online so just be cautious when giving about phone numbers, and addresses and never give out your social security number. Make sure the website you are using is a well-known site and check the BBB if you have any questions when it comes to posting a resume online.
